A SERVANT'S HEART

As we look around us, we see that the world we live in is a “what about me” world. It is full of Me, Me, Me. Jesus said if we wanted to be great in His kingdom, we must become the servant of all. (Mark 10:44)

Let's reflect on the story of the Good Samaritan. A person was left for dead on the road of life, wounded by thieves, his clothes stripped off from him and his possessions were stolen.
