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THE ETERNAL YESHUA

Christians know of Jesus, (Yeshuah) from the New Testament. They usually know of Messianic prophecies from the prophets. They seldom know Yeshuah (Jesus) in the Old Testament apart from the prophets telling of His future appearance whether during His earthly birth and ministry or of the future end times.

However, Yeshuah is mentioned by name 64 times in the Old Testament and an additional 31 times with His name Yesha in abbreviated form, a total of 95 times.

Let's look at just one chapter in Psalms where Yeshuah is specifically named. It is Psalm 98.

Verse 2 says in the KJV, ***"The LORD hath made known His salvation."*** The original Hebrew word for salvation is "Yeshuah." The literal translation would read, "Yahweh (Jehovah) has made known (revealed) His Yeshuah (Salvation.)"

Verse 3 goes on to say, ***"All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God."*** The literal translation is "all the ends of the earth have seen Yeshuah of our Elohim." Truly, the gospel of Jesus has now gone to all the ends of the earth. Elohim is the plural form of "God" which depicts the Trinity, so this passage singles out the Word (Yeshuah, Jesus) in the Trinity as being made known throughout the world.

Jesus (Yeshuah) is found throughout the entire Bible from Genesis (Gen. 1:1) to Revelation by name. He is included in the creation account from Genesis 1 as part of the Trinity, Elohim. Let nobody be deceived into thinking He first appeared in a manger in Bethlehem. He is eternal God and existed before this world that we have made.

He is from the eternal and into eternity.
