KING DAVID – THE PROPHET

King David is not generally thought of or referred to as a prophet, yet the Psalms he wrote are full of Messianic references. Psalm 22:1 is one such example. ***“My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?”*** These were the very words of Jesus as he hung on the cross of Golgotha. (Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34).

The chapter in Psalm 22 concludes with vs. 30-31 ***“a seed shall serve Him...They shall come, and shall declare His righteousness unto a people that shall (yet to) be born...”*** We are still declaring His righteousness from generation to generation.
