

Chlamydia Screening

In 2022, a total of 1,649,716 cases of Chlamydia trachomatis infection were reported, making it the most common nationally notifiable sexually transmitted infection in the United States for that year.

Actionable tips and suggestions for chlamydia screening in your office:

- After collecting a urine sample, request for permission to screen for chlamydia as well. Patients sometimes feel more inclined when the sample has already been obtained.
- Implement time in to workflows for pre-teens and teens to have time alone with the provider to discuss topics they may not be comfortable having in front of their parent or guardian.

HEDIS Definition: Chlamydia Screening in Teens and Young Women

The percentage of women 16-24 years of age who were identified as sexually active and who had at least one test for chlamydia during the measurement year.
