Four Weeks In...

The first few weeks of the season haven't been all we'd hoped for.

Week 1: Gators host St. John's for a season-opening weekend series. After a disappointing Friday-night loss, the rest of the series was washed away by rain.

Week 2: 5-0! Home and away vs. North Florida and a three-game sweep against Columbia at home. A total of 7 shutout starting innings by freshman Liam Peterson led the way.

Week 3: "Not great, not terrible" – midweek split and then two of three at rival Miami. Perhaps the best start of Jac Caglianone's career (6 IP, 3 H, 2 BB, and 11! K) ensure a challenging week ends on the good side of .500.

Week 4: Midweeks are a rain-out and a loss vs. a hot-hitting UCF. The weekend series against St. Mary's was a series win – the 12-11 (10 inning) Friday, punctuated by Colby Shelton's walk-off HR sure was exciting, but didn't inspire confidence in pitching. Saturday's 7-9 loss didn't inspire, either. The Sunday win ensured a week four 2-2 split.

So... at the end of four weeks, the Gators have five losses and their record ranks 13th in the 14-team SEC.

Recall the wisdom of Annie Savoy from Bull Durham: "It's a long season, and you gotta trust." The 2017 team had 5 losses at this time, too – 8 by the end of week 5 after getting swept by Auburn in the first SEC weekend. It all worked out in the end.

And no matter how the rest of the season goes – a bad day at the ballpark still beats a good day at the office.

Opponents on Deck

The next game is one many have circled on calendars – home vs. (undefeated) Florida State, Tuesday, March 12 (6 pm). This is during Spring Break for current Gator students...

Next weekend begins the SEC schedule with a weekend series against (undefeated) Texas A&M.

Following a midweek vs. JU, the Gators go to Baton Rouge to take on defending national champion (1-loss) LSU.

So it goes in the SEC...To be the best, you must beat the best.

2025 SEC Baseball Changes

Starting in Fall 2024 (2025 baseball season), Oklahoma and Texas will join the SEC, bringing the total number of teams to sixteen. To accommodate the larger league, the SEC will be eliminating divisions and moving to a single table in 2025.

Each team will have two permanent opponents (for Florida: Georgia & South Carolina) with the other eight conference series rotating among the remaining thirteen teams.

In addition, the SEC tournament format will change starting in 2025, with all sixteen teams qualifying. The top four teams will earn a double-bye, with teams 5-7 receiving a single-bye and 9-16 starting from the first round. The entire tournament will be single elimination. The 2024 SEC Tournament will be the last in its current format. Opportunities to attend with the GDC will follow via e-mail, meetings, and future newsletters.

Online Resources

There may be no clearer sign of increased interest in college baseball than the improved online resources to follow the game. Around half a dozen beat writers report on Gator baseball, several of whom are guests at GDC meetings.

For those who want a broader view ---how are rival teams doing? What are the Gator baseball heroes of recent years up to? Here are some of my favorites, to supplement the <u>official UAA website</u> and media coverage.

Baseball Reference: 2024 Florida Gators

The stats on this page are no more than you can get from the official site, but its value is in what it links to. Click any player and find out what they did last year (at UF, Alabama, FAU, Virginia Tech) and what they did in summer ball. Click the "Southeastern Conference" link and scout our boys' next opponent. Click "2023 Season" (and so on) to find out what former Gators are up to. However, it sometimes takes a few days to update.

Warren Nolan: 2024 Florida Gators

Best features: up-to-the-minute scores, up-to-a-few-minutes RPI (the single most important metric in selecting and seeding the tournament), and efficient layout – miles above ESPN. Even though the anti-ad-block is aggressive this year and the "Predicated Results" predict way too many sweeps, it's still my favorite in scoreboard watching season.

The site also tracks Women's Softball, for those who support Gator diamonds on both sides of Hull Road
