Players and coaches will have special VIP name tags. GDC members will have the opportunity to share tasty food and great memories with these Gator Greats, reminiscing (or learning – for us younger members!) about these teams that helped lay the foundation for Gator baseball. Among the many VIP Guests we will see: Coach Dusty Rhodes Assistant Coach of Gators from 1982-87 and Smoke Laval (82-84) former head coach of LSU and UNF baseball programs.

Second Baseman Steve Lambardozzi (80-81) who played on the 1987 World Series Champions Minnesota Twins.

Pitcher Jeff Fischer (84-85) pitched for Montreal Expos and Los Angeles Doges.

Outfielder Javier Ortiz (82) made his major league debut with Houston Astros in 1990

All 10 Gator baseball teams from 1980-1989 finished over .500 and won 4 SEC regular season and 4 tournament titles (1981, 1982, 1984, and 1988 – same years for each), with 6 appearances in the NCAA tournament, The highlight of the decade was the 1988 team, the first Gator team to make the College World Series.

Bus Trip to the Sunshine Showdown in Jacksonville

The GDC has arranged a bus trip to see the Gators take on the Seminoles in Jacksonville on Tuesday, March 26.

Attendees will meet at the NW 34th Street Walmart parking lot at 2:00 pm, and the bus will depart *promptly* at 2:30 pm. Bus and ticket availability are limited to the first 50 registrations.

As of March 17, only two bus- and gameticket combos remain. Registration is available, via link on the GDC website.

Stats Corner – What is (SEC) Average?

Barring a great year in the ACC or an exceptional year in another conference, the SEC is the best conference in college baseball.

But what is average SEC performance?

Some key statistics are shown in the table below ('b' for batters and 'p' for pitchers). The additional walks and homers, plus the uptick in ERA between 2022 and 2023 confirms what we saw watching the games – the balls were a little "juicier" and the zone a little smaller last year than in 2022.

Comparing 2024 (so far) and 2023 tells another story – SEC hitters are about 20 points in average, 40 points in OBP both and SLG better this year. On the bump, they're almost two pitching baserunners per game better, plus half a homer and another strikeout. This gives us an idea of the magnitude of the difference between the SEC & non-conference competition. So far this year, the SEC is 197-44 vs. nonconference opposition.
