At the grand opening of Pearland's first inclusive playground — the Ed Thompson Inclusive Park — in 2023, Mayor Kevin Cole and Pearland Parks & Recreation Director Carry Capers introduced a bold and compassionate vision: the **Inclusive Play Initiative**. This initiative established a clear direction in our Parks Master Plan — to make inclusive play a priority across Pearland. It also marked the beginning of our next transformational project: the Independence Park Inclusive Playspace.

Now, just two years later, that vision is becoming a reality — and we invite you to help bring it to life. We are raising \$5 million to elevate the existing playground at Independence Park into a vibrant four-acre inclusive playspace and water play destination comprised of essential elements of universal design. Aligned with the City's 2023 voter-approved bond initiative for Phase II improvements, this project is more than an upgrade to Pearland's largest park; it is an investment in our shared future and the preservation of our community heritage.

As President of the Forever Parks Foundation of Pearland, I've seen firsthand how high-quality parks change lives. They are where friendships grow, where families create memories, and where every person — regardless of ability — deserves to feel welcome, safe, and inspired to play. Thanks to the City of Pearland's 2023 Phase II bond and the support of early, generous donors, the foundation for this project is already in place. ABOUT THE INDEPENDENCE PARK PROJECT

Independence Park has long served as a vital recreational space for the Pearland community. Phase I improvements, completed in 2019, redefined the park's functionality with a new amphitheater, accessible playground, improved trails, drainage, and reoriented entrance. Building on this foundation, Phase II – supported by voter-approved funding – includes expanding and enhancing the existing pond to serve as a usable amenity lake, adding landscaping, increasing parking capacity, improving lighting, providing additional electrical serviceability, ensuring trail and sidewalk connectivity, installing new site furnishings, incorporating a water play amenity, and establishing an inclusive playground.

The cornerstone of this development is the region's premier inclusive playspace and water play amenity, providing access to all abilities and inter-generational play experiences. The project budget allocation approved in the 2023 Bond Referendum for Phase II of the park is \$16.3 million, which includes \$700,000 designated for the inclusive playground area and water play amenity, **but community** feedback, precedent research, and conceptual design development revealed the true cost to achieve the vision and incorporate exceptional universal design exceeds \$5 million.

The Independence Park Project - Connecting Community. A Legacy of Play capital campaign goal is to bridge the gap to raise the \$5 million in additional funding needed to realize the full concept design scope of the All-Inclusive Playspace and Splash Pad to ensure essential components of universal design are realized such as: inclusion, multi-generational elements, quiet spaces, and features designed to build strength, socialization skills, independence, and a sense of self-esteem.

Timeline:

- Now July 2026: Fundraising Campaign
- July 2026: Detailed design begins with scope based on funding commitments
- Late 2027/Early 2028: Construction starts
- Late 2028/Early 2029: Construction completion

- Ed Thompson Inclusive Park had 60,000+ visitors in its first 2 years from 260 zip codes and 26 states. The park is invaluable to the community with My PlayClub events, school field trips, family gatherings, educational sessions, and more.

INDEPENDENCE PARK PHASE II PLAN OVERVIEW

The Phase II Plan Overview highlights a bold vision to expand and enhance Independence Park through inclusive, nature-inspired, and community-focused design. These planned improvements prioritize universal access, meaningful connections to nature, and welcoming experiences for every visitor.

Transition to Authentic Nature

- Redefine current park standards of natural green space
- Create habitat and sanctuary for local flora and fauna
- · Mitigate drainage with bio-swales and wetland planting, and provide educational opportunities
- Envelope the landscape with natural systems to create a cohesive park identity through the articulation of planting and native grasses
- Use reforestation for defining program buffers and establishing sight lines

Increase Inclusivity & Usability

- · Expand existing playground to create a truly all-inclusive play space for everyone
- Create spaces for activity and respite within a natural environment
- Integrate TBG Architects Tenets of Play

INDEPENDENCE PARK PHASE II PLAN OVERVIEW



A. Regional Event Spaces

Building on the success of Phase I improvements, Phase 2 proposes to grade and expand event seating, install synthetic turf for all-weather use, and create shade opportunities with new tree plantings to create a true regional event space for a multitude of uses.

B. All-Inclusive Playspace

Beneath the shade of existing trees, this universally inclusive play space invites users of any age to explore, surrounded by the natural environment. Slides, climbers, and a play tower are opposite the dry creek that winds through a variety of program areas, creating both structured and passive play opportunities.

C. Naturalized Amenity Lake

This existing detention pond is transformed into a naturalized 5.6-acre amenity lake, ready for kayaks and paddle boards, while wetland and native plant species line the nearly 1-mile-long shoreline, fostering a habitat for many native animals. A looped pedestrian path is activated by a fishing dock and an adaptive kayak launch.

D. Sports Complex

Sports opportunities, including tennis, pickleball, sand volleyball, and open fields, are consolidated to a complex with dedicated parking and shade opportunities.

E. Reflection Zone

This area combines existing and proposed walking trails activated by passive program areas including seating opportunities for reading, picnic areas, and open lawn space for smaller gatherings.

THE POWER OF UNIVERSAL AND INCLUSIVE DESIGN

Rooted in the principles of universal design, this four-acre all-inclusive playspace and splash pad destination will offer barrier-free, intuitive, and engaging experiences for everyone — from toddlers to grandparents, and from children with disabilities to their typically developing peers.

What is Universal Playground Design?

Universal design means creating spaces that are usable and welcoming to people of all abilities — without the need for adaptation or special accommodations. In playground design, this goes far beyond meeting ADA compliance. It involves thoughtful integration of features that support a full range of physical, sensory, cognitive, and social needs.

Key Principles of Universal Design in Playgrounds:

- Equitable Use: Equipment and experiences that can be used by everyone, not just a select few.
- Flexibility in Use: Options that support different ways to engage, climb, swing, spin, or rest.
- Simple and Intuitive: Clear layouts and signage that make it easy for all users to navigate.
- Perceptible Information: Design that supports different ways of understanding (visual, auditory, tactile).
- Low Physical Effort: Accessible pathways and features that reduce fatigue or barriers to participation.

Essential Elements of Inclusive Playgrounds

The Independence Park Inclusive Playground will incorporate a wide range of inclusive elements, carefully selected to promote interaction, engagement, and belonging:

- Multi-sensory experiences including musical instruments, textured surfaces, and water play
- Accessible pathways and surfacing for mobility device users and caregivers
- Adaptive swings and spinning elements with varied levels of support
- Quiet zones and retreat spaces for children with sensory processing needs
- Social gathering spaces designed to encourage cooperative play and caregiver interaction
- Visual and tactile cues to aid navigation and communication for individuals with visual or cognitive disabilities

Why It Matters

Inclusive playgrounds are not just about equipment — they're about equity, dignity, and joy. For children with disabilities and their families, traditional parks often mean exclusion or limited participation. An inclusive playground changes that narrative. It provides a shared space where children of all abilities can grow, explore, and play together — side by side.

Studies show that inclusive play environments:

- Improve social development and empathy in all children
- Encourage physical activity and confidence in children with disabilities
- Provide critical mental health benefits for children and caregivers
- Strengthen community connection through accessible, shared experiences


Our Commitment to Exceptional Design

ALL-INCLUSIVE PLAYSPACE ZONES

A. Hillside Habitat (All ages)


This area is full of activity! Sliding, exploring, and crawling are among the many ways to move around. An Indigo Bunting, a migratory bird in this region, is celebrated as a play structure looking onto its home, a birdhouse tower. All the elements create a playful change in scale for imaginative and adventurous users.





B. Fruit Pile (2-5 Years)

Even the smallest of us has a place to play right alongside everyone else. Rolling mounds of turf and soft, colorful play surface allow for endless fun. Sensory-rich, this area has texture changes and musical opportunities for young and old to experience the park in their way.



C. Farmer's Village (All Ages)

Laughter is heard as children rush between each hut. Young minds transform these small structures into castles, secret hideaways, and market-spaces, only limited by the imaginations of each newly found friendship. A small crossing offers a hiding spot, while parents look on from a short distance at the newly renovated restroom building and shade pavilion.



D. Dry Creek Exploration (All Ages)

Kids, young and old, are invited to explore the dry creek and boulder outcrops that wander through landscapes. Occasionally fed by the water from the nearby splash pad, explorers will get the chance to fill buckets, build dams, and observe the watery sights and sounds. Bring your nets to see how many frogs you can catch.



E. Play Lawns

Small lawns bookend each edge of the fully enclosed playspace. These flexible private areas allow for small events, birthday parties, and unstructured play. The surrounding edges are lined with native grasses, changing colors with the seasons. Each lawn area is connected with playful trails, winding through the trees.
