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A Message from the Secretary On Behalf of the Board of Directors

Happy New Year, Independence friends and neighbors! I am excited to have the cover of this month's newsletter to update you on the many activities we have underway for you, both as a Board and also with the members of the Safety & Security Committee.

New 'No Parking' signage will be installed this year by Orange County Public Works throughout the neighborhoods of Phase 2 (all streets from approximately Avenue of the Arbors to Camp Dubois Crescent) according to a study that was done by the County and the Fire Marshal. Since our roads are public, Independence Community was not directly involved in this study; however, we thank the County for helping alleviate safety risks from vehicles parking on both sides of the road. As always, if you have concerns about parking violations, including vehicles blocking mailboxes, please contact Orange County Sheriff's Office at 407–836–4357 or email trafficcomplaints@ocfl.net.

Traffic calming measures are still being studied by the Safety & Security Committee in collaboration with Orange County, including the potential of adding a speed cushion or raised crosswalk on New Independence Parkway near Independence Elementary. We are exploring options on funding this type of improvement and our committee plans to make a final recommendation to the Board soon. In the meantime, speed limits in Independence remain 25 m.p.h. and Orange County Sheriff's Office will continue to patrol the community for traffic enforcement. Please drive safely to protect our kids, bicyclists, and pedestrians.

Improvements to Independence County Park are also being discussed in collaboration with Commissioner Wilson's office and Orange County Parks & Recreation. Years ago, the County had enhancements planned for our public park located near the elementary school, but as time has passed those have gradually been forgotten. I have been working with the County to make recommendations for new additions, and to better maintain the current park's facilities.

Representatives from Orange County have been invited to join our January 17, 2023 Board of Directors meeting to discuss some of these topics in person. I invite you to make time to attend so that you can hear from our officials directly.

Remember: if you see something odd or unsafe happening anywhere in the community, take the time to say something—call Orange County Sheriff's Office at 407-836-4357, or in an emergency, dial 9-1-1. Safety doesn't happen by accident!

ASSESSMENT FEES MADE EASY

Make your monthly assessment payments your way... pay online via our secure web portal, pay in person via e-Check, or mail in your payment for processing.

PAY ONLINE

Log in to ClickPay to your payment make online, via smartphone, with or a tablet. ClickPay.com/ Visit FirstService to get started. For support setting up an account or logging in to your account, contact ClickPay at 888.354.0135, option 1.

PAY IN PERSON

Write your **personal check** or bring your **credit or debit card** to Town Square Residents Club during regular business hours, or drop your check in the afterhours box. A nominal 3.5% processing fee applies to credit or debit card payments.

PAY BY MAIL

Mail your personal check to our processing center, and make sure to include your account number on the check. **Mail it to:** (Association Name), c/o FirstService Residential, P.O. Box 31086, Tampa, FL 33631. Be sure to allow for mailing time. We are not responsible for delays.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS ABOUT YOUR ASSESSMENTS

Please check your scheduled deductions to make sure they reflect the new assessment fees effective January 1, 2023.

Homeowners will no longer be issued coupon books. You will instead receive an Annual Assessment Notice via postal mail that specifies the assessment amount due and payment instructions for your Unit.

All assessments are due by the **first day** of each month. They may accepted without penalty until the **10th day** of the month (not including processing time). Any assessment processed after this date will incur a late fee of **\$25**. Additional charges for reminder letters, interest fees, and collections costs will be assessed for delinquencies.

For payments made in person or by mail, please allow **ample time** for processing. Inperson payments are usually cleared within 1 business day. Mailed payments will be dependent on the U.S. Postal Service's delivery schedule.

Who to Call

Dial 911 for life-threatening emergency assistance from the Orange County Sheriff's office or Fire Rescue.

Orange County Government Services Dial 311 for assistance with non-emergency flooding debris, downed trees, traffic matters, road conditions and animal or neichborhood concerns.

Non-emergency Support Dial 211 for assistance with food, housing, finan assistance, health programs and crisis support.

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INDEPENDENCE

- ${\ensuremath{\overline{\mbox{$\! \Box$}$}}}$ A valid Amenity Key card is required to access amenities controlled by a secure locking door.
- ☑ Amenities are for the exclusive use of Independence Residents and their accompanied guests. Nonmembers may not use any amenity without being accompanied by an Independence Resident.
- ☑ In fitness centers and pool decks, no glass containers are allowed. Food items must be kept clear of the pools. Clean up any trash before leaving.
- \checkmark Children must be carefully monitored for their safety and the comfort of others in all amenity areas.
- ☑ No children under 16 years of age are allowed alone in Residents Clubs at any time.
- ☑ Children under 16 may not use fitness centers. Children 16-18 must exercise with an adult.
- ☑ Be courteous to your neighbors. Use headphones for music in fitness centers, and keep music to a low level in other amenity areas. Wipe down and re-rack equipment in fitness centers for the next person.
- ☑ Ensure that you pick up after your pets when using walking paths, sidewalks, and at the dog park.
- ☑ Misuse of, or nuisance at, any community amenity may result in suspension of privileges.

Blue Indigo Baptisia australis

Namesake of Blue Indigo Crescent in Phase 1

Blue Indigo, also known as blue wild indigo, is a member of the pea family. According to the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center at the University of Texas, blue indigo is a perennial plant that stands about 5 feet tall at maturity. It is a bushy plant in nature with bluepurple flowers that look like peas on a stalk. Like most pea plants, it requires symbiosis with microorganisms in its root system to survive: the organisms produce nitrogen, and without them the plant dies. While Native Americans used this plant's roots as a medicine, it is toxic and today it has no food value. However, the purple juice of the plant can be used to approximate the color of "true indigo" when making blue dye.

As we set out into the community over the next few weeks, here are a few items my team and I will be focusing on:

☑ Holiday Decorations. Winter holiday decorations are allowed to be displayed up to Friday, Jan. 20 (Sun, Jan. 15 in Townhomes III). After this date, please ensure you have removed your decorations and any attachments and stored them indoors until next year. No color lightbulbs other than warm or cool white are allowed to be used outside in light fixtures where visible from the street.


- 🗹 Leaf Removal. This is the time of year when many of our oak and magnolia trees finish dropping their leaves. Take a look at your sidewalks and curbs to make sure piles of leaves are not building up. If they are, please remove them to prevent street flooding and clogging of storm drains.
- Mailboxes. Please check your mailbox to ensure it is in good condition, $\overline{\mathbf{A}}$ painted and clean, that the numbers are readable, the door flap shuts, and the Independence eagle bracket is present. If you need mailbox parts, please contact Town Square Residents Club for assistance.
- Storage of Personal Property. Look around the exterior of your home for \checkmark any personal items: tools, wagons, boxes, extra pots, hoses, old toys, and other debris that needs to be either stored inside out of view or thrown away. Keep your patio and rear of your home clean and neat.

Sidewalks & Repairs. Homeowners are responsible for the cleanliness of their sidewalks and curbs. Pressure washing is recommended regularly to avoid accumulated dirt, mold, and mildew. Volunteers Needed for Independence Committees!


Rules & Regulations Committee (1 open seat)

- This very important committee is appointed by the Board and reviews all covenant violations that have matured to a second notice each month. Based on the homeowner's explanation of the situation as well as any available communications or photos, the Committee votes to impose a fine for non-compliance with our rules and standards.
- Typically meets on the second Thursday at 10 a.m. in person or via Zoom.

Architectural Review Committee (1 open alternate seat)

- Another very important committee—the ARC is responsible for reviewing and approving every homeowner's request for improvements on their homes or lots. The architectural character of the community is irreplaceable, and the ARC ensures that homeowner investments are complementary to the neighborhood while also meeting our standards and guidelines.
- Typically meets on the third Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. in person or via Zoom. .
- This seat is an alternate: you will still participate in the voting process, but you may not need to attend every meeting as long as a quorum of other members is met.


