  - a. Town meeting 11/1 at 7pm
    - i. Foster school plan will be voted on
      - Katherine Rachalski offered to help arrange babysitting so parents can attend
  - b. 11/8 Foster School approval will be on the ballot
    - Needs majority approval
    - If it doesn't get approved, could face less favorable contingency plans, such as moving to 3 elementary schools
    - 2. We would lose the \$25 million in state funds
    - Hingham Music Parents Association is looking for a parent volunteer to represent HMPA at PRS PTO
- 4. Guest Speaker- A.C. Decker
  - a. Executive Functioning-Can be difficult at the start of the school year
    - i. Sleep schedule is important
    - ii. Mondays can be difficult, try to stick to a bedtime routine on weekends
    - iii. May take 2-3 weeks for children to get acclimated
    - iv. Parents can help with organization

- v. 1st week- bring lunch from home so kids have more time to eat instead of waiting in line. Nourishment is important, pack good snacks
- vi. Have children pack the night before, put homework in backpack after it is completed
- vii. If your child is struggling, email the teacher to notify so that the school can help.
  - 1. New Guidance Counselor
  - 2. Good communication between parents and the school is key
- viii. If child struggles in the morning, try dropping off at a friend's house
  - 1. Switch up who drops the student off
  - Come at 8:20 when most students have entered the building but staff are still outside and can easily assist getting your child into school.
- ix. If your child is missing materials- let the school know
- x. Accountability
  - 1. Give simple instructions
  - 2. Try consequences
    - a. Take away screen time
  - 3. Positive reinforcement
    - a. Try using visuals
  - 4. Charts to encourage organization
    - a. Rewards based on progress
- xi. Executive function is an important life skill

- 1. Can develop good habits for life
- 2. Males and females develop these skills at different times.

## 5. Principal report

- a. New schedule/ 1 recess
  - District used a consultant to ensure schools are getting 900 learning hours in the school year.
  - ii. Teachers can take students outside to learn- looking into the curriculum for ways to implement this.
    - PTO could help by purchasing new picnic benches to allow for outdoor classroom space
    - 2. Staff stockup- can look into outdoor resources for teachers
