**Savannah's twenty two squares** are the city's main attraction, lined with 18th-century homes set amidst live oak trees laden with Spanish moss and high marble monuments; stark reminders of the city's segregated past and its role in the civil war. Renowned for embracing music and the arts, Savannah hosts the prestigious Savannah Music Festival, Film Festival and Book Festival. The Telfair Academy, Jepson Center for the Arts and the Owens-Thomas House, feature a collection of over 4,000 works from the 18th century to the present. Plus the influence of the Savannah College of Art and Design's thousands of students can be felt throughout the city, with many displays of their unique works and wares. Spend time in City Market, an open-air marketplace in the heart of the Historic District.



**Edisto Beach State Park**, located on a remote sea island rich in Native American history, was originally developed in the 1930's by the Civilian Conservation Corps. The 1,255-acre park includes a dense maritime forest and an expansive salt marsh where visitors can explore the wonders of nature. The park offers a four-mile nature trail that winds through the maritime forest with beautiful view of the salt marsh. Edisto Beach State Park also offers the state's longest system of handicapped friendly hiking and biking trails, including one leading to a mysterious, 4,000-year-old shell midden alongside a secluded bend on a tidal creek. The park includes an environmental education center, a "green" building full of exhibits that highlight the natural history of Edisto Island and the surrounding ACE Basin, one of the nation's largest preserved estuaries.



**Beaufort, founded in 1711**, is located on Port Royal Island, one of the largest sea islands along the southeast Atlantic coast. It is one of the few U.S. towns that has had its entire downtown designated an historic district by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Filled with mansions built by the wealthy plantation owners before the Civil War, Beaufort was one of the only Southern towns to be occupied by Union troops, rather than destroyed. More than 50 historic structures are identified in Beaufort, including many homes that have been beautifully restored and are available to view via professionally-guided walking, bus, or horse-drawn carriage tours. Art galleries, antique shops and dot the entire downtown and uptown walking districts, along with fine dining restaurants.



**The Gullah, Geechee People** are descendants of African Slaves that were brought Charleston, SC in the late 1500's. Their arrival was the creation of the Gullah people; the intermingling of African backgrounds as well as different dialects spoken allowing an opportunity and space for slaves to come together and uphold their African culture and habits. It is difficult to pin most of the Gullah traditions and customs to specific tribes. In Africa it is agreed that many of them came from the Rice Coast, West Africa and Western Sudan. Some Gullah traditions came from their white slave owners. The Gullah People took these traditions and made them their own by adding African twists to them. Such traditions including the "ring-shout" ceremony ( picture left ) an ecstatic, transcendent religious ritual, first practiced by African slaves in the West Indies and the United States, in which worshipers move in a circle while shuffling and stomping their feet and clapping their hands.



**The Kehoe House** is an exquisitely restored Renaissance Revival mansion in Savannah's Historic District. The Kehoe House was built in 1892 by William Kehoe, a successful iron foundry owner. The home's architectural style is Queen Anne Revival. Its exterior stairways, balustrades, window treatments, fluted columns and capitals, fences and gates are all cast iron, a tribute to the iron foundry's excellence in pattern making and casting. The house overlooks Columbia Square, and features 13 guest rooms and multiple private and semi-private balconies. Amenities include daily gourmet cooked-to-order breakfast, a wine and hors d'oeuvres reception, homemade cookies, and turndown service. There's a private garden courtyard where guests enjoy a traditional Savannah outdoor space for dining and relaxing. A concierge is on hand to assist with recommendations and reservations. The Kehoe was winner of TripAdvisor's Travelers Choice Award for 2017, 2018.
