Report to the Membership of Clan Guthrie, U.S.A.

Every year, it seems, the presence of Guthries at GMHG gets more conspicuous. This year was no exception. The Guthrie tent visitor register had 34 families sign-in and there were 8-kilted Guthries in the Tartan Parade. Ian Guthrie and Kenny Wink also brought attention to the Guthrie Clan by winning trophies in the Highland Wrestling events.

A number of suggestions were made during the Games for improvements next year. One suggestion was that we have a hospitality suite open on Friday evening for arriving family members to gather and meet each other. If possible we might try to reserve a private dining facility on Saturday evening for the Clan to gather at one sitting (and without a wait). Our tent could also use some dressing up for next year. One of the other clan tents had a custom made felt table cloth with their family crest sewn on the front. The tent adjoining ours had the foresight of more effectively using their prime front-row space to place chairs in theater-like rows. This accommodated the maximum number of visitors for viewing the center of the field. We also could use a more dignified guest register which should carry forward to each succeeding year. We could place Polaroid photos of the Games into it and have people autograph it and write little gems of wisdom, like a highschool yearbook. If you have any thoughts you would like to share or if you would like to volunteer to take the responsibility for an item on our "improvement list" for next year, please let me know.

We covered several subjects at our general meeting on Saturday at the Games. The following summarizes some of the major items covered:

1. MEMBERSHIP - Wilbur Guthrie was elected as our new Membership Chairperson. Our prior chairperson, Bill Miller and his wife Kathryn, have provided an outstanding service to the Clan, particularly in creating and maintaining a computerized mailing list. will be responsible for putting together a new member greeting and information package and for maintaining an up-to-date mailing list of all members and interested parties. Wilbur will also be responsible for new member recruiting by coordinating with the local and regional commissioners and through Scottish publications to publicize and make the Guthrie name synonymous with Scottish heritage.

2. GAMES COORDINATOR - Andy Guthrie was elected to the new position of "Games Coordinator". In this capacity, Andy will coordinate the participation of Clan Guthrie-USA in more regional Scottish Games throughout the USA. Andy has experienced doing this for the Ohio Games, the Tidewater Games, and the Virginia Games at Alexandria. He will develop contacts with individual Game Coordinators and provide advice and consultation in what should be done to assure a successful event. Andy will have a Games Kit (including signs, banners, and catalog samples) and maintain a modest expense account to subsidize Guthrie participation in these local events.

3. The incorporation of Clan Guthrie-USA is in-process. Board of Director members include Peggy Wink (KS), Harry Guthrie (OH), Dr. Jim Guthrie (CT), Dr. Herb Guthrie (NC), and one opening yet to be filled.

4. Accountings of the Clan bank account in Seattle and of the Catalog Sales in Louisville were requested to be made August 1, 1985. The results of these accountings are reported as follows:

Guthrie China to be Reproduced

The Mottahedeh Company of New York City, known for their fine quality bone china, is working on designs for a special reproduction dinner service copied after the Guthrie Chinese Export Dinner Service that graced the walls of Guthrie Castle for nearly two hundred years until it was sold along with the contents of the Castle in May, 1983 to F.O.G.C. and other individual clan members who attended the auction. The original Guthrie china was pictured in the Christie's Guthrie Castle auction catalog. Made in Canton, China around 1790 the Guthrie china dinner service is a white background china with a deep blue border. It has the Guthrie coat of arms in the center and is edged in gold. It was made and hand decorated especially for the Guthrie family at the end of the 18th century in a hong or workshop by Chinese workmen for the great China Trade. The Mottahedeh pieces will be as close to the original as possible, including dinner plates, cups, saucers, platters, etcetera. A five piece place setting should sell in the \$100-125 range. Linville, North Carolina. **Veni, vidi, vici.** I came, I saw, I conquered. Those words, ascribed to Julius Caesar after one of his many campaigns can just as well describe Clan Guthrie's presence at the 1985 Grandfather Mountain Scottish Games, July 13th and 14th.

Highlighting the Clan's activities, before a near-record crowd of almost 60 Guthrie Clansmen and women, were stellar performances on the athletic field and the biggest kilted marching contingent in Clan history.

Pacing the sports effort were outstanding competitions by the Winks, 17 year old Ken and 24 year old Brian, and a fine first-time effort by 11 year old Ian Guthrie of Falls Church, Virginia. The athletic achievements were:

Saturday, July 13, 1985

Lightweight Cumberland wrestling, **FIRST PLACE** to IAN GUTHRIE, an impressive win by 11 year old Ian who had never entered a Scottish event before. He was coached by the Wink boys. His form was featured in a color photo on the front page of the Charlotte Sunday newspaper. Ian is the son of Dee and your correspondent, formerly our regional Commissioner in Ohio who is now handling Clan affairs in the Nation's Capitol area.

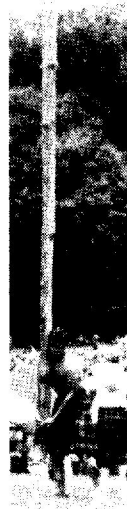
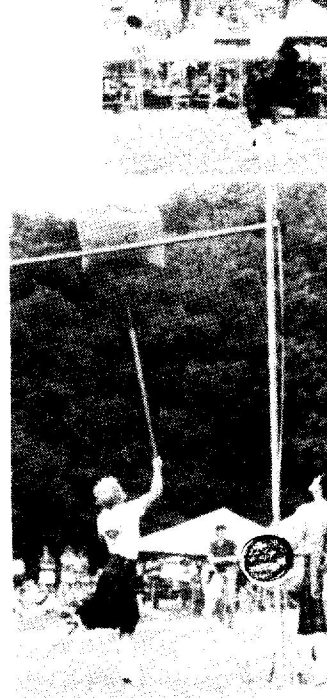
Middleweight Cumberland wrestling, **FIRST PLACE** to KENNETH GUTHRIE WINK and **SECOND PLACE** to BRIAN GUTHRIE WINK. The final round saw the brothers paired against each other in a rugged "two out of three" matchup. The evening news of the Charlotte TV station featured an interview with both of the participants. The interview was repeated nationally on the CNN network Sunday night.

Junior caber toss included tosses by IAN GUTHRIE and JOE ROBINSON.

Intermediate caber toss, **FIRST PLACE** to KENNETH GUTHRIE WINK with three near perfect tosses. JOHN ROBINSON was also an entrant.

Kilted mile run for 16 to 30 year old bracket. In borrowed kilts, JOHN and JOE ROBINSON were the first Guthrie entrants in this event.

Clan challenge caber toss (covers all divisions) was entered by eight clans. With three perfect tosses by huge Sam McKay and three perfect tosses by 150 pound KENNETH GUTHRIE WINK, the event went into "sudden death." With a heavier caber, neither of the men were able to flip the caber, leaving CLAN GUTHRIE and Clan McKay preminent in the challenge caber toss. During the warm up BRIAN GUTHRIE WINK also had two perfect tosses.

It should be noted that the annual Grandfather Mountain Highland Games are the largest Scottish games held in the world with the exception of the Cowles Games in Scotland in odd numbered years.

In front of the reviewing stand Clan President Harry Guthrie, impressively dipped the Guthrie Tartan flag, followed by Brian and Ken Wink raising and sheathing their swords.
