Our Spring Book Sale will begin with Preview Night, Friday, March 4th at 7:30pm, and is for members only. The north and main lobbies will be set up for Adult Fiction and Children’s books. We will have Nearly Perfect Spring Holiday, Mother’s Day and Graduation books for everyone set up on the front table as you enter the library. One big difference for this sale will be that all Nearly New fiction and nonfiction titles will be found in their categories. We hope everyone enjoys wandering the tables to find them.

Saturday, March 5th, our sale will run from 9:00 to 6:00 and will be open to the public. The McAllister Room will contain our many Nonfiction categories. Again, we will have lots of History and Military titles to choose from. Oversized coffee table books will be found in their categories. Please wander to the south wall and look through the OLD Nonfiction, OLD History, OLD Children’s, and VERY OLD books. Our OLD Fiction titles will be found near the Reference desk.

Sunday, March 6th, the book sale will run from 1:00 to 5:00. One may purchase books for ½ price, **OR** one may purchase books by the bag for \$8. We found during our December book sale that many of our customers paid both ways. Monday, March 7th is Bag Day, takes place in the McAllister Room, and will run from 9:00 to 3:00. Each bag of books will cost \$3 on Bag Day.
