September Book Sale Preview

It has been a bit chaotic in the library basement. Donations have been arriving since June, and many times we have had multiple donations each day. Boxes of Fiction hardbacks are accumulating in the garage along with History books. I believe we have enough DVDs to satisfy both the September and December book sales. As schools start to open, and the moving ends donations might slow down. My take? Not likely. I see folks culling books from their full shelves to make room for the stack of books they want off their floor (yours truly speaking here).

Do not expect lots of surprises this book sale. Nonfiction, along with classics and media, will be found in the McAllister Room. The only difference is we will put the Children's Media in the Main Lobby. The south wall will be filled with OLD books (we have been having fun boxing all sorts of OLD goodies for everyone). We have many high-quality ART books for sale including Architecture gift books. All Nonfiction categories will be represented in the McAllister Room. We will also have a good selection of first edition books, as well as human sexuality books, especially regarding LGBTQ topics.

The Main Lobby area will have EASY, Jr. Early Reader, and Middle Children's books along with Children's DVDs and CDs. Autumn Holiday (think Halloween) Gift Books will be available as well. Our Adult Fiction categories, with lots of first editions, will be found in the North Lobby (Mystery/Thriller and Romance/Romantic Suspense), on tables extending to the Reference desk (Fiction and OLD Fiction), and on tables in front of the check out counters (Science Fiction, Young Adult, etc.).

Friday evening, September 16th , is open to all Friends from 7:30 to 9:30, and Saturday, September 17th , the book sale is open to the general public from 9:00 to 6:00. Sunday is $\frac{1}{2}$ price day or you may purchase books for \$8 per bag. The sale will run from 1:00 to 5:00 that afternoon. Of course, Monday, September 19th, is Bag Day. All books will be found in the McAllister Room, the sale will run from 9:00 to 3:00 and a bag of books will cost you \$3.

We are looking forward to everyone wandering back to the library after their vacations to tell their stories and pick up a book, or two, or three. I thank all the Friends volunteers who have been very busy this summer pre-sorting, sorting, and boxing materials for the upcoming sale.


