When it comes to our trail rides our president pretty much summed it up in her report. However, we will persevere and keep trying to find some trails to ride. So hang in there and please let me know if you have any suggestions for future rides. And I haven't given up on a ride in September.

When we heard that Mariposa Trails had opened up the Short Manzanita Trail out of Owl Creek in Jerseydale, Kevin and I decided to give it a go. The timing was perfect because the heat wave hadn't set in, and we had a nice breeze. The trail workers did a clever job of clearing the trail in such a way that motorized vehicles can't get through without much difficulty, and if you haven't been there before the trail is hard to spot. Because of this, I would call this a technical trail that offers "Trail Trial" type challenges. There were lots of logs to step over and narrow passages to walk through, and a very narrow bridge across a washout that we opted to dismount and walk our horses over. There were still wildflowers blooming, and we rode eight miles. The problem with it now is there is no shade because of the fire. So we'll have to wait on that one for cooler weather.

In the picture for this month, I'm wearing a "CHILL-ITS 6665" Vest" that I can highly recommend for riding in hot weather. You soak it in cold water, and it keeps you cool for hours if you don't mind some moisture. The brand name is TENACIOUS ergodyne WORK GEAR.
