TRAIL BOSS REPORT



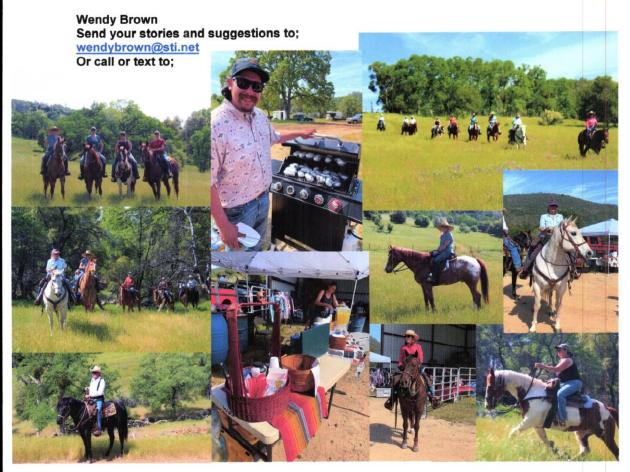
