Come spend a day in the forest with us riding in the Goat Meadow area, Fish Camp. Parking will be at the Goat Meadow Snow Play area. Bring your halter, lead rope, and of course your horse! Members in good standing may bring a guest. If a guest has already attended a ride this year, they will need to join the club to participate in this ride. The ride will be approximately two-hours, on single track trails at elevations between 5200 -5600 feet. Be ready to ride at 10:00 AM.

DIRECTIONS TO GOAT MEADOW: From Mariposa take Highway 49 South to Oakhurst. Turn left on Highway 41 to Fish Camp. Continue on Highway 41 for 2 miles past Fish Camp to Mt. Raymond Road. (Mt. Raymond Road will sneak up on you so be watching. It is just past the wooden Yosemite National Park sign.) Turn right on Mt. Raymond Road and follow it all the way to the end at the paved parking lot.

Note: From Hwy 49 and Hwy 41 intersection in Oakhurst it is approximately 30 minutes to the Parking Area.


