Bro. Michael Jackson

Most Worshipful Grand Master, Michael E. Jackson

Most Worshipful Brother Michael E. Jackson is the Grand Master of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Illinois. He was elected to that office in October 2021. As Grand Master, he is responsible for leading approximately 50,000 Freemasons who are members of the subordinate lodges in our grand jurisdiction. Having been raised to the Sublime Degree Master Mason in April 1988, Brother Jackson has enjoyed an active Masonic Journey spanning more than 33 years of service, dedication, and leadership for our ancient and honorable fraternity.

Mt. Moriah Lodge No. 51 in Hillsboro, IL is Brother Jackson's mother lodge. He served as its Worshipful Master three times in 1993, 1998 and 2010; he also served as Treasurer in 2013. He has been chosen as an Honorary member of several lodges in Illinois. In addition to his lodge activities, Brother Jackson has served Illinois Freemasonry as an advocate of Masonic education; that passion for our work was recognized by receiving commissions as a Grand Lecturer in 1994 and Grand Lodge Instructor in 1999. Having distinguished himself amongst his peers, Brother Jackson joined the

Grand Lodge Board of Grand Examiners in 2004 and served as its Secretary (2008 to 2009) and Chairman (2010 to 2013).

Brother Jackson's first Grand Lodge officer appointment occurred in 1996 as a Grand Steward. Next, he was appointed in 2000 as the Grand Marshal which he served for three years. Later, he was appointed as the Junior Grand Deacon (2013) and Senior Grand Deacon (2013) before being elected to Junior Grand Warden (2014) before being elected to Junior Grand Warden (2015), Senior Grand Warden (2017) and Deputy Grand Master (2019). During the years, he served on several Grand Lodge Committees including the Finance Committee and Illinois Masonic Outreach Serviced (IMOS) Board of Managers. Beginning in 2005, he also served for five years as the Grand Representative to the Grand Lodge of Africa (Congo).

In the Appendant Masonic Bodies, Brother Jackson has been an active member and supporter. In the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of Springfield, he is a devoted member and in 2019, he was recognized for his dedication and service as an honorary member of the

Supreme Council, 33°. Brother Jackson is also a member of the York Rite Bodies in Hillsboro, IL, Past Puissant Sovereign of St. Edwards Conclave Red Cross of Constantine, having led that organization in 2017, and is an Honorary member of the DeMolay International Legion of Honor.

Brother Jackson continues to enjoy a robust professional career spanning more than 40 years dedicated to providing communications equipment management and services to various customers including educational institutions. Throughout his career, he enjoyed various technical, supervisory and management roles which provided a broad understanding of the business operations including how to effectively lead teams from laborers to managers. In addition to his faithful service to Freemasonry, Brother Jackson has spent more than 39 years building a loving family with his wife including the quality time spent with his daughter, son and grandchildren. During his very limited relaxation time, Brother Jackson enjoys traveling to several destinations to just "unplug" and explore his surroundings.

On September 27, 2022, his 75th birthday, the Valley of Danville's own Illustrious James L. Tungate, 33° transitioned from Active Member of our Supreme Council to Active Emeritus Member. Our Illustrious Brother served Supreme Council as an Active Member for over

twenty years, and what a distinguished service it has been. Illustrious Brother Tungate served during a time of great change as the Supreme Council started new charities, consolidated its Lexington Massachusetts headquarters in the Scottish Rite Museum, and re-emphasized, if not returned, to its roots as an organization that cares for its members

It was a time when the Scottish Rite was a leader in innovation, not in the body of Masonry, but in the methods of Masonry and how the fraternity engages with its members and candidates. Among

Brother Tungate's contributions and accomplishments are service as both Treasurer General and Secretary General of the Supreme Council. He was a creative force during his time on Supreme Council authoring several articles for the *Northern Light Magazine* as well as rewriting many degrees. He produced and directed many of the early video productions of the NMJ degrees, the advent of which has provided another avenue and tool for the fraternity to engage with and educate its brethren. In recognition of his service to the fraternity and humanity, our Brother was presented the Supreme Council Medal of Honor on August 31, 2015.

Illustrious Brother Tungate's legacy is one of dedication and service, especially to the Supreme Council of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction. It is a legacy that will long endure and one of which our Illustrious Brother can be justifiably satisfied.

Feast of the Paschal Lamb ~ Thomas A. Roberts



As Most Wise Master of your Rose Croix, I was asked to write about the Feast of the Paschal Lamb Ceremony that we do every year to honor those of our Brethren

who have joined the Grand Architect. I cannot say anything more eloquent than what our Past Most Wise Master Christopher Hathaway said about the Ceremony in 2018. I hope you get as much as I did from his words. I look forward to seeing all of you on April 2 at 3pm for this year's Feast. Below is what PMW Hathaway wrote.

What does the Feast of the Paschal Lamb mean to you? Do you scroll through the names to see if you know anyone on the list? Do you compare the amount of deaths on the list to the amount of new candidates? I know that's the first thing I do, but it shouldn't be this way. The Feast is a time for mourning and a time of celebration, not just another ritual.

We should celebrate the accomplishments of our brethren. We should be grateful that they kept the doors open for us so we could experience the greatness of the Scottish Rite. We should personally know the people and their families and share stories about them. How can

we accomplish this if we do not know our brethren?

Some people see smaller candidate classes as a sign of dying times. I see it as an opportunity. We are getting smaller no doubt, but our bonds together and the closeness we should share should be greater than ever. We have a chance to know everything about our brethren. The more we know, the more we share, the better opportunity we have to assist and support our brothers in need. What brings people back to degrees, to reunions, to boring business meetings? It's the relationships built. We all volunteer for things even if we may not want to because we want to support our brothers and not let them down. The better relationships we have, the more participation we will have moving forward.

The Feast should also be a time of mourning. It should sting the hearts of all Masons. The members of the Valley of Danville are not just a name on a scroll. We are all brothers in this great fraternity. The sting should hurt but only momentarily. We must then turn the pain of death into motivation going forward. We must promise ourselves and our passed brethren that we will keep the traditions of the Scottish Rite alive and well.

This contact can go a long way even if they cannot attend reunions, they will find value in supporting the membership in any way they can.

As an officer in the Rose Croix line, the Feast is a very important task and obligation. I want everyone there to understand the significance of honoring our brethren and understanding the challenges we face. Let's honor our departed brethren by strengthening the bonds of current membership. It is my hope that in the coming years we get to personally know our brethren so when the Feast rolls around once a year, we feel greater sorrow, and have even greater celebrations.

The Pathfinder program is a uniquely created program that takes a member through a variety of topics and tasks that deepen your knowledge of Scottish Rite and possibly yourself. When completing my first path in Pathfinder, the most important thing I learned about were the resources available to our officers and members.

For our membership there are a number of ways to continue your education. The Supreme Council offers a blog that is regularly updated with educational and informational posts that might be of interest to you. The Masonic Museum & Library offers a variety of exhibits available in person and online, along with research on a number of different topics. There are programs that you can explore such as Pathfinder which will get you involved in many facets of your Valley or the Hauts Grad Academy which can expand your knowledge of the purpose and history of our degrees. We of course have the degrees themselves!

We offer 29 different degrees displaying core values that are important to our daily lives. These

degrees can be witnessed in different ways and on different days. Thursday Night at the Rite has provided an opportunity for many of these degrees to be seen virtually from home between the months of January and April. You can always keep an eye on upcoming events to catch a Rite on the Road in your area or attend an upcoming reunion to witness some of your favorite degrees. As a convenient way to track the degrees you have seen make sure to bring your passport or update your online passport in the Scottish Rite NMJ Member Center.

There are a number of charities that are supported by Scottish Rite Masons as well. The Grand Almoners Fund is available to assist a brother overcome obstacles that he may face while taking life's journey. The White Flower Society provides a safety net for our extended Masonic family, specifically for widows in need. Our most public charity, the Children's Dyslexia Center, which is dedicated to helping children learn to read and reach their fullest potential. The Scottish Rite also offers a variety of scholarships for youth throughout our Juris-

diction.

For our officers, it is important to be aware of the resources located in the Leadership Resource Center which include guides, talking points, and other programs that all officers should know about. You can also find "Best Practices" in the Member Center which can give all officers new ideas on how to engage all members. Additionally, there are a number of programs that Supreme Council has offered to assist the Valleys of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction such as Journey On, The Path Forward, Not Just A Man, A Mason, and Pathfinder. All of these programs look to further enhance the Scottish Rite membership experience.

I encourage each of you to start your own path in Pathfinder. The guide book is available in the Membership Center on the NMJ Supreme Council's website. Best of luck on your Path!

Valley Productions ~ Valley Productions Committee

Our treasured Masonic buildings in Illinois are being sold, converted, or torn down. We recognize that it is a duty of the membership to preserve our building in Danville for future generations.

During the past four years the building committee has undertaken the arduous task of updating our building to include new ladies’ restrooms on the first and second floors, new kitchen equipment, new heat/air on all floors, redecorating the dining room. This is the largest investment in the building in the past 35 years. Now we must recognize that a marketing strategy is required to provide a Return on Your Investment. As membership continues to right itself to modern Masonic numbers, income from dues will decrease. In order to maintain and improve the quality of the Masonic Center in Danville, additional revenue streams need to be implemented.

This brought several brothers together pursuing the concept that the building was going to need a marketing strategy. After several months of discussions, research, and presentation to the Danville Board of Directors, the “Valley Productions Committee” was officially sanctioned and recognized on December 14, 2022, by the Board. The function of the Committee is to reaffirm as well as establishing a new strategy to accomplish the income stream needed. This requires us to be proactive in pursuing income producing events and not reactive. We must purposely move forward at a gauged pace to assure that our goal is attained and that mistakes are limited, to build a future for our building.

The Committee is moving forward with a planned concert November 25, 2023, featuring the “Tom Petty Tribute Band” with an opening act of “Ike & Rory” as a warm up for the main show. On-line tickets may be purchased by clicking on the link below. The Committee’s objective is to attract good opportunities for quality entertainment, special events and rentals of the first and third floor of our iconic Danville Masonic Center. The Committee will collectively manage the logistics associated with this new venture and strive for ongoing improvement making the results the best possible. The

presentation of our building to the public will be positive as well as aggressive, showing what the Valley of Danville really is.

If YOU want to make a difference in Scottish Rite, this is your opportunity to join your brothers to insure the future for our building. We need the following people to make our plans work.

1. Are you an active or retired policeman? We need security.
2. Are you willing to sell food/drinks at the events? We need people to man our booths.

Declaring for At-Large ~ Robert A. Gill, 33°

The Valley of Danville will have an opening for one of the three At-Large Director positions on the Board of Directors that will need to be filled at our annual meeting in May. So first and foremost, I would like to thank Brother Cody Oakwood for his continued commitment to the Valley of Danville and filling one of these important positions over the past few years.

The At-Large Directors position is open to any Valley of Danville member in good standing. To fill this elected three year term, those who are interested must do so in person by declaring their intention to run at one of our upcoming stated meetings, either on March 8th or April 12th. Any member wishing to stand for elected office may submit a resume or curriculum vitae, not exceeding one page in length. Said resume or

curriculum vitae shall not explicitly solicit support. All voting for contested elections shall be conducted by secret paper ballot, prepared in advance by the Secretary. The Chairman or Presiding Officer of the meeting at which the contested election occurs shall appoint election judges as needed to conduct the election, count the ballots and certify the outcome to the meeting.

In making this application, I promise on my word of honor that should I be elected and become a member of your honorable Body, I subscribe to the following

OATH OF FEALTY:

"I, the undersigned, do hereby promise on my word of honor, and swear true faith, allegiance, and fealty to the Supreme Council of Sovereign Grand Inspectors General of the Thirty-third and Last Degree of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry for the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction of the United States of America, sitting at its Grand East in the town of Lexington, Massachusetts, and will support and abide by its Constitutions, Orders and Decrees."

"That I will hold allegiance to the said Supreme Council and be loyal thereto, as the supreme authority of the Rite; will hold illegal and spurious every other body that may be established within its Jurisdiction, claiming to be a Supreme Council to which said Supreme Council has not extended due recognition as such; and every other Body of said Rite within the same Jurisdiction that does not hold its powers from said Supreme Council, or from a Supreme Council recognized by it, and will hold no communication whatever in Scottish Rite Masonry with any member of the same nor allow him to visit any Body of the Rite of which I may be a member; and I will dispense justice to my Brethren according to the laws of equity and honor."

"And should I violate this, my solemn vow and pledge, I consent to be expelled from Scottish Rite Masonry, and all rights therein and in any Body of the Rite, and to be denounced to every Body of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite in the world as a traitor and forsworn."

"And may God aid me to keep and perform the same. Amen."
