The Morris Eagles is happy to announce exciting new changes to its Saturday Bar Bingo program that began earlier this fall.

The doors to the club now open at 2:00 p.m. with bar bingo starting at 3:00 p.m. On days we will not host bar bingo, the doors will open at 3:00 p.m.

For better efficiency and accuracy of our games, the club is now selling packets of bingo papers for \$17. Each packet has 15 cards (each card is a 3 on 1 up card). Additional 'white' game cards are available for sale for games #1-6 and games #8-14 for \$1.00. Also, 'purple' game cards for games #7, #15 and #16 are \$2.00.

There are several new games to play, including: Half Letter X, Inside Picture Frame, Dog Bone, and The Letter E.

Each game, except for the progressive, coverall and Letter E game, pays an 80% payback with a maximum of \$99.00. The Progressive Game #7 prize will start at \$500.00 in 48 numbers and will increase \$58.00 and one number every session up to a maximum of \$1199.00 and 60 numbers.
