Siding installed on west side; fundraising goals adjusted

\$5,611 in contributions raised from nearly 60 members

For those who have visited the club or have driven by recently will have noticed the installation of the new steel siding on the west side of the building. Eric Hoffman and his crew took advantage of the mild December weather to complete the west side before the winter weather sets in. The result looks great and the aerie is excited to resume the east side in early spring.

With any remodel project, surprises are expected - this project is no exception. As soon as Eric removed the first few panels it was evident the amount of insulation was very inadequate. In fact, the absence of a proper vapor barrier along with inconsistent structure to attach the new siding panels onto the steel frame building also needed to be addressed. Following the recommendation of Eric and Neil Suess of Morris Lumber and Millwork, the officers approved to install an additional R-5 of polystyrene insulation, properly sealed with vapor protection and added additional structure. The cost of these improvements will most certainly be offset with future energy savings in the years to come. We anticipate these same needs on the east and north sides.

Now that we know what is underneath the curtain, the aerie has had to adjust its fundraising goals to accommodate these new challenges. Initially the aerie estimated approximately \$7,000 was needed for new siding materials, trim and screws. With the additional insulation and structural improvements, we will need to raise approximately another \$5,000 for a total material cost of \$12,000.

Fundraising to this point has been well received. As of December 20th, \$5,611 has been contributed from nearly 60 members - reaching

approximately 80% of our original goal. After adjusting our goal to \$12,000 for materials, this now equates to 46.8%. We have some work yet to do and we want to do it right. We are also leveraging our gambling, social and catering funds to cover the labor costs at this time.

Therefore, we are continuing to meet with members who wish to help out to articulate the project needs to see where a contribution will best fit.

Continuing the project on the east side presents additional issues not present to the west side, namely relocating a gas line that feeds the kitchen appliances and back room furnace, removal of exterior electrical conduit and relocate inside the wall cavity, and installation of a permanent guard rail to prevent vehicles from hitting the building once the new siding is installed.

The aerie will also be hosting a meal to benefit the building project in January or February. Visit the club or watch for an email for information.

Meal to benefit Girl's and Boy's hockey teams

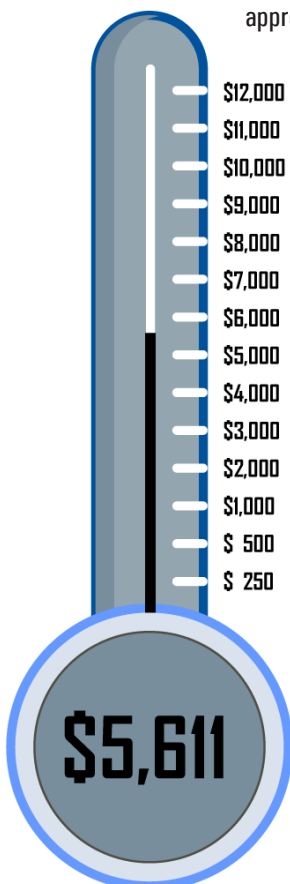
