LEEF welcomed its first full time staff member, Trina Hofreiter, who started her role as LEEF's Development and Outreach Manager just as Hurricane Ian arrived to make history across the State. Trina has a Master's in Environmental Education from the University of Florida with Dr. Martha Monroe and a background in developing and evaluating EE programs for The Nature Conservancy, the US Fish and Wildlife Service, Disney's Animal Kingdom, Florida Ag in the Classroom and Leu Gardens. Trina has a passion for community, school and therapeutic garden programs, loves building networks of support, and has done a fair amount of successful grant writing, too. After digging out from under both hurricanes, Trina is happy to have joined LEEF's Board and is looking forward to all of the projects on the horizon.

Right now, LEEF is working on building a database of Climate Resilience and Watershed education materials for use as a resource for our members and supporters. This digital collection will support the work of a new statewide Advisory Council we're forming, comprised of EE professionals and champions across Florida who will help bring more resources and opportunities in climate literacy and watershed education to K-12 students. This is a 2 year NOAA B-WET grant that we see developing into a multiyear statewide partnership - and the timing is perfect, as Hurricanes Ian and Nicole reminded us.

In lieu of our Fall Mini-Conference, LEEF decided to create a Day of Service initiative to support our members in rebuilding after the storms. We asked our members to nominate one EE provider in each of 10 regions - those Environmental Education centers will be highlighted in a special newsletter and social media post next week, and members encouraged to donate and/or contribute a day of volunteering, to help in the cleanup efforts. LEEF is also looking forward to expanding our fundraising support and membership offerings, including more professional development opportunities.




