SEEA Project Updates

Don't Waste It

Now that we are nearly finished with the state-specific versions of the *Don't Waste It!* guide, we're moving to our next phases:

- Planning for Train-the-Trainer (T3) workshops (preparing a team from your state to host local educator workshops in 2022)
- Creating an online training course (for those who can't attend an in-person workshop)

We'll be sending dates/details about the T3 workshops once we finalize a few more details, but we're ready for our participating states to **start recruiting one person per state to serve as a <u>paid</u> member of our <u>Online Training Steering Committee</u> (***link opens the position description with all the details***).**

Landscape Analysis

The plan is still to launch on February 22, but recent weather events may push that back a bit. Ashley will be sending out communication templates to state coordinators to assist with roll-out and marketing within individual states. One consideration to help drive survey completion is in the form of incentives, and Ashely is encouraging this at the individual state level. For example, North Carolina is providing \$20 "credits" to 15 randomly selected NC entries. The credits can be used towards membership, EENC sponsored professional development, or EENC conference registration. This can all be handled internally, through email, and will help build interest in the organization for those that are not familiar.

The survey will be open for six weeks total, but the initial communication will state two weeks, which will allow for an extension and targeted outreach and asks for survey completion as needed. KAEE is also ready to receive invoices from states for their Landscape Analysis coordination. As a reminder, each state will receive \$7500 for their work on this project. Harmful algal blooms are fouling our waterways with increasing frequency and severity. Tropical weather is becoming more extreme and more regular. Rising oceans are destroying municipal infrastructure and decimating critical wildlife habitat. But we as Floridians get to decide what the future holds. Join in a discussion of the greatest threats that Florida iconic marine environment is facing,

and what we as Floridians need to be doing to find solutions for our maritime state. This is a "pay what you can" event.

LEEF will celebrate our roots in EE as we grow forward; 40 years since our first meeting during our annual conference, April 22-24, 2021! North Carolina

Environmental Educators of North Carolina (EENC) https://eenc.org/

EENC hosted their virtual Board Retreat to kick off 2021 January 22-24. During this time, the board began work on the 2021-2023 strategic plan with work focusing around four main themes: Advocacy for the Field of EE, Partnerships for Building Capacity to Advance EE, Increase Recognition of EENC as a Resource, and Building Internal Capacity. Woven throughout all four themes is work forwarding inclusion, diversity, and equity, broadening the definition of EE, and creating ways to measure progress.



January was also the month that EENC opened applications for our mini-grant program. In its third year, the goal of this grant program is to provide support to promote excellence in environmental education across North Carolina. EENC will award \$2500 in mini-grants, with awards ranging from \$50 to \$250. Each member can submit one proposal per year, either on their own behalf or on behalf of an organization or school.

EENC is kicking off a series of online Guidelines workshops focusing on the K-12 Learner Guidelines or the Professional Development Guidelines. These workshops require individual work and assignments that are tied together with online sessions during the two-week period. These workshops are open to anyone, so feel free to share the information. More information on each workshop and how to register can be found by following the links below. 
