T. Marie is a Justice and Equity Activist and Trainer and the Lead for Conversation Gathering with Cortico, a nonprofit in cooperation with M.I.T.'s Media Lab.

Over the past several years, T. Marie has worked with communities across the nation that shift perspectives, facilitate connection, and deepen understanding in order to spark change individually and communal.

King is a trained Truth, Racial Healing and Transformation facilitator through the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, a trained Empathetic Facilitator through Create Forward and a faculty member with the Satyagraha Institute. She holds a B.A. in Urban and Global Economic Development, a M.A. in Leadership and Divinity.

Dr. Hollie C. Cost is a professor of special education, special education coordinator and director of University Outreach at the University of Montevallo and former two-term mayor of the City of Montevallo. Dr. Cost fully embraces Marian Wright Edelman's position that "service is the rent we pay for being." She works collaboratively with university faculty, staff and students as well as

community members to develop a shared vision and implement needed change. Her community enhancement initiatives focus upon the arts, sustainability, social justice and education with a central mission of youth engagement. She has demonstrated her commitment to empowering youth through initiatives such as the Kettering Foundation Community Politics Exchange, the establishment of the Montevallo Junior City Council, spearheading the David Mathews Center for Civic Life-Students' Institute, and collaboratively founding the Montevallo Sister City Commission. Effective June 1st, Dr. Cost will begin her new position as the Assistant Vice President of University Outreach and Public Service at Auburn University.
