





Spring Opener 2014

Hi Everyone. Spring Opener 2014 will once again be at the Silver Ridge Ranch in Easton WA. right off exit 70 on I-90. As in the past Jimmy George and his committee are making each year better than the last and I believe you will truly enjoy what is planned for this year. There are a few additions to the events for this year such as a poker run on Fri., bikini bike wash, live music Thursday, Friday, and Saturday with Hell's Belle's all girl AC/DC tribute band headlining the show Saturday Night. There will be the usual events like bike games, bike show, scavenger hunt, tattoo contest, vendors and much more in other words something for everyone.

Even though we want everyone to attend and have a righteous time, as it is at any event there are things you can do and things you can't. We will start with the camp fires, you CAN have a camp fire in a designated fire pit or in an acceptable fire pit you bring with you. If you bring you own fire pit it must have legs so it sits off the ground. If you do not bring your own firewood you can purchase it from the ranch there will be no other firewood vendor. You CANNOT make a fire on the ground, the ranch has permits for fire pits and can lose their permit if someone has a fire on the ground and if they lose their permit there will be no fires at all. If you have your own fire pit do not dump the ashes on the ground, make sure they are cold and out and put them in the garbage. The next item is probably the most controversial, you CAN have a service animal at the event but you CANNOT have a pet. I know that there are some people that consider their pets as part of the family and would not dream of leaving them behind but this is one time you will have to, if you bring a pet that is not a service animal you will be asked to leave. If you have a legitimate SERVICE ANIMAL there are certain rules you have to follow, they must be on a leash at all times, you must pick up after your service animal, that means carrying a bag with you to pick up poop (no one wants to step in poop), your service animal cannot be noisy, unruly, or a danger to anyone. If you do not follow these rules you will be asked to leave. BAD ATTITUDES are not wanted if you have one and cannot leave it at home then stay home with it. If you drink and want to get in someone's face or fight don't drink or stay home. NO DISCHARGING FIREARMS OR PYROTECHNICS of any kind. There are a number of reasons for this, first and foremost is the safety of others, also the ranch has horses and if you scare their horses they could kick us out, also it is against the law, once again if you can't

follow the rules you will be asked to leave. I know what some of you are saying "Man we are bikers what's with all the rules" well here is the way it is, it doesn't matter if you a biker, motorcycle enthusiast, non-biker, or just everyday citizen attending the event. Everyone who pays their money to attend deserves the same respect that you would expect someone to give you. I also know that the NO'S and the CANNOT people are a very small number and the majority of the people just want to party, listen to music, and enjoy the company of good friends new and old. So just come and have fun, enjoy the bike show, bike games, music and all the other festivities.

ABATE of Washington Legislative Press Release May 1st, 2014 Lenny Pletsch – Safety and Education Chairman Department of Licensing 'NEW' Drivers Guide

Olympia WA – The Washington State Department of Licensing (DOL) has published a 'NEW' edition of Drivers Guide that includes additional pages and public information about Motorcycles.

In conjunction with the Governor Jay Inslee's proclamation of

MAY MOTORCYCLE AWARENESS MONTH, in which the Governor encouraged all related state departments to utilize technologies to promote caution and observe motorcycles, the Department of Licensing has release a new edition of the Washington State Drivers Guide. While the timing of the new edition may be coincidental, the additional pages in section 4, and the Public Service Announcement (PSA) 'Look Twice, Save A Life' at the end of section 5, are the result of years of work by the ABATE Safety & Education committee.

ABATE began discussions in 2008, with the Motorcycle Safety Program Manager of the DOL, to increase the information and training included in the Drivers Guide in a manner similar to our neighboring states of Oregon and Idaho. The biggest stumbling block was not the approval of the additional information, but with the need to deplete the Drivers Guides that were already printed. ABATE of Washington would like to acknowledge Steve Stewart of the DOL for helping begin the process, Bruce Thomas of the DOL for negotiating the additional pages and Andrea Nygard of the DOL for following through to ensure that the information was included in the latest edition. After 6 years of planning, the additional information is now part of the education of the travelling public of Washington. ABATE of Washington is pleased that the 'NEW' edition is in print, and is available for viewing at www.dol.wa.gov

ABATE encourages all vehicle operators to take a moment to read the new information that starts in Section 4, Page 36 (electronic page 96), as well as the PSA at the very end of Section 5 (electronic page 114).

ABATE would also like to thank all individuals and groups who may have been involved in assuring that the education of the travelling public is kept as a forefront part to the safety of Motorcyclists, as well as all road users in the State.





6th Annual Michael "Boz" Kerr Bikers Inside the Beltway Success

This year was another highly successful Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) event in our Nation's Capital. We were blessed with perfect weather and a robust number of citizen motorcycle lobbyists on the most important day of the year for motorcyclists.

Motorcyclists from Connecticut, Maryland, Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin, Indiana, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Michigan, South Carolina, District of Columbia, New Jersey, New York, Florida, North Carolina, Colorado, and Minnesota were in attendance.

This year's event resulted in nearly 250 individual meetings with Senate and House offices to advance the MRF agenda in Washington D.C. The event also coincided with the introduction of a portion of the highway legislation that expires at the end the fiscal year, September 30th. The Senate Environment and Public Works Committee introduced their portion of the highway bill, which does not affect us. What this does show, is that Congress has begun in earnest to work on the much needed highway bill. This year's attendees lobbied their members of Congress to advance the following bills;

- H.R. 1861 to prohibit the Federal funding of motor-cycle only roadside checkpoints
- S 2078 to prohibit the Federal funding of motorcycle only roadside checkpoints
- H.R. 875 to require the EPA to halt the sale of E15 gasoline and conduct an independent study on the effect of the blend of internal combustion engines.

- H.R. 2414 to enact black Box privacy legislation
- S 1925 to enact black Box privacy legislation

Another topic at the event was a push back on President Obama's transportation proposal, GROW AMERICA which is calling for mandatory helmet laws. The Obama proposal is not very popular with Congress according to members of Congress and the staff.

Please call, email, or write a letter to our Senators and Representatives in Washington, D.C. and tell them to support these issues. Remember they work for us—you and me and we must let them know how WE want them to handle issues. That is our duty!

Ride Your Motorcycle to Work Day 2014

Monday, June 16, 2014

Ride your motorcycle or scooter on this day to demonstrate:

- * The number of motorcyclists to the general public and to politicians.
- * That motorcyclists are from all occupations and all walks of life.
- * That motorcyclists can reduce traffic and parking congestion in large cities.
- * That motorcycles are for transportation as well as recreation.
- * That motorcycling is a social good.

Ride to Work Day was inspired by "Work to Ride - Ride to Work" marketing materials created between 1989 and 1991 by the Aero Design and Manufacturing Company, a Minnesota based manufacturer of motorcycle riders clothing. In 1992 these items inspired motorcycle magazine editor Fred Rau to write an editorial calling for a national ride to work day.

The first annual Ride to Work Day event was proposed in Road Rider magazine (now titled Motorcycle Consumer News) in the May 1992 issue. This is an excerpt from that "Ride to Work" editorial: "You may remember several months ago when Bob Carpenter, commenting in his 'Two Up' column, mentioned how neat he thought it would be if there was one day a year when everyone who owned a motorcycle used it to ride to work. That comment was prompted by a T-shirt produced by Aerostich RiderWear that simply said, 'Work To Ride, Ride To Work.' Everyone seemed to think that a national 'Ride To Work' day was one heck of a good idea."

The first Ride to Work Day event date was July 22nd, 1992. For several years various motorcycle businesses informally promoted every third Wednesday in July as Ride To Work Day. These early advocates included Road Rider Magazine, Dunlop Tires, and Aerostich/Riderwearhouse. The event continued to grow as an informal grass roots demonstration every year until 2000. That year a non-profit organization, Ride to Work was formed to help organize and promote Ride to Work Day. The first Ride to Work Day event led by this group was the third Wednesday in July of 2001. This day was the annual day until 2008, when it was changed to the Third Monday In June. This change was made to climatically better accommodate riders world-wide, and to give more riders an opportunity to participate.

Ride to Work is a 501 c4 nonprofit, all-volunteer effort. Organizers include Andy Goldfine, Lynn Wisneski and Christine Holt.

What needs attention in ABATE by Ron Fryer

1. Membership.

Every member should be looking for new members all the time. Invite those who you meet at dealerships, on rides and in motorcycle shops. If every member brought in just one new member in the next year, we would double our membership.

2. Brotherhood.

Members should be building each other up instead of tearing each other down. As a member, we can attend other chapter events and get to know each other better. As a Chapter, we can have a run to another Chapter's event and show support for that Chapter.

Be careful what you say on social media. By saying uplifting things and praising the work that others do, you will be improving the reputation of ABATE; increasing brotherhood among members as well as attracting new members.

3. Legislative.

Get involved with your local legislators. Get to know them personally. Find out what their views are about motorcycle issues. Take them to lunch. Find out about their families, hobbies, and other interests. Help them with their campaigns, putting up signs, making phone calls, or even stuffing envelopes. Show up at their tea parties and rallies. Let them know that you support them. If you do, they will listen to what you have to say and help ABATE with their goals.

Just think...If every legislator in the State was known by an ABATE member well enough to recognize them by sight and call them by name, how do you think ABATE would be received on Black Thursday; or any other day? How do you think they would respond to your phone call or email? Think it's worth it to get to know your legislators? Damn right it is!

How would it make you feel if you were walking down the hall in the Senate or the House and you were recognized by the staff and invited into the office to find out your opinion on a bill? Would you feel good about that? I can tell you that it has happened to me fairly often, and it makes me feel that my opinion really means something to that legislator. You can have that same great feeling yourself if you will just get to know your legislators. Look them up on line if you don't know who they are...then go meet them and get to know them. It's really worth it!

4. Bylaws.

Every member should be familiar with the bylaws and policies. These are the rules that every ABATE member and State and Chapter Officers need to follow to achieve harmony in what they do as well as know what to expect in return. Every member should be familiar with not just the State Bylaws, but their Chapter bylaws as well.

The State Bylaws are currently being reviewed by the Bylaws Committee and recommendations concerning separating bylaws and policies as well as clarifications and changes for clarification will soon be made. The intent is to make the State Bylaws easier to understand and the State Policies as further explanation and clarification of the related bylaw. It is a long and tedious process, but will be well worth the effort when completed.

Bylaws and policies will still need membership approval in order to be changed, just as it has been in the past. Any member can propose a change by writing up the proposed language and submitting it to the ECOM and the Bylaws Committee for review, who will then send it out to the Chapters for a vote. ABATE is a democracy, and every member vote counts when a decision is needed.

5. Meetings.


State and Chapter meetings need to be run efficiently so that they do not run on and on for hours. Committee work needs to be done in committees; not in meetings. There are rules regarding how long people can speak in State meetings, and they should be adhered to.

Meetings must be run fairly, and each member should have a chance to speak. The member speaking should remember to stay on the subject and keep to the point. Officers should show the same courtesy.

If a subject is brought up that the Officers do not like, they should hear it anyway. All ideas have merit, and even if they may not be appropriate for ABATE, they may spark other ideas that are.

There are additional thoughts on what is needed, but I think I have brought forth enough for now. I hope these ideas will spark some thought on your part. The purpose of this article is to invoke thinking about what can be done to improve ABATE of Washington.



Policies for the ABATE Newsletter

The deadline for submissions to the ABATE Newsletter is the 15th of the month prior to publication.

Chapter reports must be submitted by the Chapter Coordinator, Deputy Coordinator or a person authorized by the Chapter Coordinator in writing.

Chapter announcements and flyers are free with the following restrictions:

- Chapters are limited to one full page ad per month
- If the event is during the first week of the month, then a full page ad is allowed in the previous month's issue.
- If the event is not in the first week of the month, the full page ad is limited to the issue published in the month of the event.
- Chapters may place ½ page ads for up to two months prior to the event except for the issue that the full page ad is inserted. Chapters may not have a ½ page ad and a full page ad for the same event in the same issue. Full page ads may be allowed if there is space available in months prior to the month of the event at the sole discretion of the Newsletter Team.
- All flyers submitted for publication for Chapter events must have "ABATE of Washington" and the Chapter name at the top of the flyer. Use of the ABATE logo is optional. Any flyers submitted without this information will not be considered Chapter events and will be subject to policies contained in these rules. This may require payment before the flyer can be published.

Charities with 501 (c) (3) status must submit a copy of their IRS status letter to the Newsletter Team before their ad can be published. All events must be motorcycle related. There is no charge for charities to place ads under these conditions on a space available basis. If there is no space available, the charity has the option to pay for the ad at current published rates.

No other discounts or free ads will be allowed.

Commissions: Any ABATE member or Chapter may earn 10% on any ads sold for the newsletter.
