


Ride a lot stay out of the chair and the cupboards you will live longer.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS



Legislative Affairs Officer Brian Lange

April 2019 Legislative Report

The 2019 legislative session in Olympia has been a roller coaster of activity from the start, including a Committee hearing on only day two of the session. I don't recall having so many hearings for bills supported by ABATE in such a short time that; while maybe not all were heavily attended, they were consistently well enough attended that it made an impression that ABATE was serious in getting them moving. I want to thank everyone who attended the hearings, signed in as "Pro" on our issues in support, and those who were able to testify.

Black Thursday was successful again this year. The riders once again had to deal with the fickle nature of Washington's January climate. I think Black Thursday is almost like the 4th of July in western Washington; where it is hit-or-miss whether it will rain or not, but the 5th of July is almost always a nice day. The Meet & Greet was a success again, with I believe over two dozen legislators actually coming to the event and most spending time with us. Now if we can keep building on that success, what amazing things could happen?

Sadly, the helmet bills and the lane sharing bill did not make it passed the cut-off dates, so they are not moving any further this session. However, we still have (at the time of this writing) a couple of bills still in the process. Both the Senate and House versions of the parking bills both were unanimously passed out of their originating chambers. The House version will be heard in the Senate Transportation Committee in just a few days. I am really hopeful that with the support these bills are receiving, we can actually get a parking bill passed this session.

I was very pleased to hear as I listened to the House Transportation Committee hearing on House Bill 1966, a "Vulnerable Users" penalty enhancement bill, when the prime sponsor of the bill stated that it was due to ABATE members coming to her in regard to the issue that she first became aware of the problem. This bill would double the fines for a handful of violations that have a high degree of correlation with collisions involving the state's "vulnerable users". While, due to the heavy snow no ABATE members were able to attend the hearing, ABATE was specifically mentioned during the hearing by legislators and lobbyists from other organizations several times. Since ABATE members brought this issue to Rep. Kilduff a couple of years ago, it has been gaining traction in the legislature. Even with no ABATE members present in the hearing, ABATE was being shown as a positive force in Olympia. HB1966 is, as of the time of this writing, still alive and moving through the process in the Senate.

As you read this, the session should be coming towards its scheduled close. I have high hopes that with the growing effort being shown by members to get personally involved, and learn the process bills have to follow, and how to track the progress of specific bills, ABATE will continue to be the leader in the field of motorcycle rights in Washington state. There are a growing number of members who have learned to use the legislature's website to provide them with email alerts on committee hearings so they can more easily follow bills through the process. If ABATE can keep this momentum going, I can't imagine the influence the organization could have.

However, and there always seems to be a "however" anymore doesn't there, the time may be coming for ABATE to consider taking a different tack on some issues. For nearly thirty years we have been fighting the war against the mandatory helmet law, winning some small victories here and there. Perhaps the time is growing close that ABATE, maybe in conjunction with other state and national motorcycle rights organizations, to consider filing a civil rights lawsuit against the State of Washington for violation of the 'equal protection' clause of the Fourteenth Amendment of the US Constitution involving the helmet law. There are multiple studies showing that the percentage of motorcyclists injured or killed due to head injuries is vastly lower than the percentage of automobile occupants. The Washington State Dept. of Health, the Centers for Disease Control, have released studies and reports showing that in the categories of; Emergency Room visits due to head injuries, hospitalizations due to head injuries, and fatalities due to head injuries, the percentage of automobile occupants many times higher that the percentages of

motorcyclists in the same categories. Yet we are the ones forced to wear that five pound coconut on our heads, while even the thought of requiring automobile occupants to do the same is laughable to legislators.

Finally, I want to let you all know that, due to personal matters needing to take priority, I will be stepping down as LAO for ABATE effective the last day of the legislative session (April 23rd, 2019). It has been an honor and a privilege to be your LAO these last several years. This has been a rewarding and fulfilling position, and I have enjoyed almost every minute of it. It is just getting to the point however, where I have to put all my focus on my own life, and restore the balance and stability there before I lose even more than I already have. I have already made a recommendation to Lyle on a person who I feel would make an outstanding advocate for ABATE and the motorcyclists of Washington State due to his experience with the process and the players involved, an already existing network of connections with legislators, and his dedication. I can only have faith that Lyle will appoint and the BOD will confirm an LAO we can all be proud work with.

Thank you again, for this opportunity. It has been a privilege and an honor. Catch you on the road sometime.





STERLING L. GORDON

Sterling L. Gordon, of Roslyn Wa, passed away Monday, January 14, 2019 in Ellensburg. He was 89. His passing was peaceful and in his last days he was surrounded by family and friends.

Sterling was born on July 2, 1929 in McClusky, North Dakota and was the son of Sterling L. Gordon and Christina B. Gatchell. He was preceded in death by his father Sterling, his mother Christina, brother Bob Holmes and sisters Marion Dozier, Gertrude (Gertie) Waldner and Bertha Herndon. He is survived by his three children and two grandchildren.

Sterling's mother moved the family to Yakima when he was a young boy. In 1948, he joined the Army and served in the 63rd Heavy Tank Battalion and was honorably discharged in 1950. After the Army, he lived on Vashon Island while working at Boeing until he began working at Foss Maritime. Sterling joined Foss Maritime in 1959 where he worked as a Towboat Captain. His Foss Career lasted for 33 years until his retirement in 1992. He truly loved working on the boats and being on the water. Sterling was well respected by his crews and fellow Towboat Captains.

He was a avid dirt bike and Harley rider and continued to ride well into his 80's. Sterling was known to do all his own mechanic work on his bikes and would customize them down to every last detail. He enjoyed riding locally with his buddies as well as making the long trip to Sturgis every year from 1977 through 1994.

Sterling also enjoyed the outdoors and loved camping, fishing, boating, and snowmobiling with family and friends. He shared his love of the outdoors and motorcycles with his children. The Gordons spent many weekends riding the local coal piles and bike trails together.

Sterling belonged to the Roslyn Eagles #696, the local VFW, Washington State ABATE #4181, and H.O.G (Harley Owners Group). He loved his community and was involved in many local charity fun runs helping raise money for local families in need. People who met him always had kind words to say about him and he always loved to help out friends and neighbors when he could.





