

## **Legislative Report**

Even with the restrictions that have been enforced due to COVID-19, ABATE is moving forward with three bills this biennium. As of the time of this writing, one bill has already been dropped and has been numbered HB-1106. That bill is the "Lane Sharing For Safety Act", and was sponsored by; Rep. Drew MacEwen (35 th Dist.), Rep. Chris Corry (14th Dist.), Rep. Larry Hoff (18th Dist.), and Rep. Joe Schmick (9 th Dist.). If these legislators are your representatives, please call or email their offices and thank them. I believe this may be the most sponsors we have had for a lane-sharing bill. As of



Jan. 14th, it has been referred to the House Transportation Committee. If any hearing on the bill is announced, a Call-To-Action to sign up for the online hearing will be sent out with the necessary information. I believe the reason this bill has gained the support it has is because of the simplicity of the language. It is focused totally on the when, where, and how of lane-sharing. With no other extraneous language about other actions at all. This bill also states that studies show lane-sharing is safer for motorcyclists, and that this bill was written to follow the California Highway Patrol's guidelines.

#### PANDEMIC KICKSTARTED A MOTORCYCLE BOOM

From soft sales and even negative growth at some companies to the specter of businesses collapsing in the face of Coronavirus, to sudden sales spikes and even triple-digit growth, 2020 has been a whiplash year for the motorcycle industry.

Prior to the COVID-19 outbreak, red flags were waving in many pockets of motorcycle commerce according to Forbes.com, and there was a growing dark cloud hovering over the industry, generated in large part by one particular problem: Not enough new riders are buying motorcycles and replacing those that are leaving the sport.
