

When you receive this mailing you are not required to do anything however if no one responds the insurance will go away. One of the things you should do is name a beneficiary and if you have named a beneficiary and it has changed, it will go to whoever is listed as your beneficiary. There is an option in this one where you pay two dollars for one year and it will add another thousand dollars to the four thousand that is free to you. When you are contacted, the first thing you should do is to get their name and if you do not wish to go any further than the free insurance but the person on the phone tries to tell you that you have to meet with them or they are rude and disrespectful, send me their name and the time and date they called and I will send it to their boss for disciplinary action.



LEGISLATIVE NEWS



Legislative Affairs Officer **Brian Lange**

ABATE of Washington lost one of its staunchest supporters in the legislature on Wednesday, March 9, Senator Don Benton celebrated his retirement on that day. Why does that matter to ABATE? Because Senator Benton was the prime sponsor of ABATE's helmet bills in the Senate for the past several years. He was also the Vice Chair of the Senate Transportation Committee, and the Chair of the Senate Financial Institutions and Insurance Committee. His retirement alone will shake up the power structure of the Senate for the next bi-ennium. Add to that, this is an election year, and ABATE has a great deal of work cut-out for us.

The independent members in the Vancouver area, especially those in the 17th District should show support for the candidate that best supports ABATE and the motorcycling community of Washington State. Once you find the candidate who will support us, show your support for them. Get to know them and even volunteer for them. Volunteer to stuff envelopes, set-up campaign signs, or door knock for them. This could be a key factor in bringing a motorcycle friendly legislature to Olympia.

While the departure of Senator Benson will have an effect on the Senate power structure that ABATE is unable to currently have a hand in guiding, there are several key Senators and Representatives whose defeat in the elections in November can have a positive effect for us. I will be sending out a list of legislators who support us and oppose us, and those who tend to be fence sitters, to the Chapter LAOs. I will also email out a

list of key races to all members in the next few weeks so that ABATE could possibly have a positive effect on the outcome of the election. Just as I have already described for the members in Vancouver, ABATE members throughout the state need to volunteer to support those legislators who support us, and help to defeat the ones that don't. Whether it is as simple as displaying a campaign sign in your yard, volunteering in the campaign office, or knocking on doors, becoming a part of the election team will keep you remembered by the legislator next January. Knowing that you helped to get them elected will also help provide you with a little pride in that fact, and add to a friendly working relationship between you and your legislator.

By the end of May all candidates for office in the state will have filed to run for office. The candidates will be listed by office they are running for and will be posted on a website run by the Secretary of State's Office. Here is the link to that website: http://results.vote.wa.gov/ results/current/

Keep in mind that it will show all the candidates running for office in September's Primary Election. After the primary, the list will be reduced to two candidates to be voted on in the November General Election. If your Chapter would like to endorse a candidate, they should be informed of that fact by about the first week of June at the latest. That way they can use the endorsement of your ABATE Chapter in their press releases, flyers and ads before the primary election. It is in the

best interests of our motorcycling lives to be proactive in our efforts to reelect legislators who support our freedoms. While being just as proactive in our efforts to defeat those that have opposed our efforts to exercise our rights in the legislature.

In 2015, ABATE's helmet law amendment bill (SB5198) had an Executive Session and was voted out of Committee pursuant to "signatures." That means the bill actually needed a majority of signatures voting to pass the bill out of Committee. Two Senators didn't bother to even sign the report, and our helmet bill missed moving out of Committee by one signature. For the first time since the helmet law was instituted in 1990, a bill to restore Freedom of Choice to the helmet issue was given an Executive Session in Committee, and ABATE's opponents had to resort to a political tactic like this to thwart the motorcycling community on an issue of Freedom.

These are just two of the legislators that have delayed our ability to exercise our rights. Do you think it would make a difference if all the ABATE members in the districts of those two Senators began to openly show support for their opponents by posting signs, knocking on doors, or volunteering to help in their campaigns? Word of mouth is a great weapon during an election campaign. People spreading the word about their dissatisfaction with a legislator will get a

reaction. A candidate running against that incumbent should be willing to make use of the displeasure of the constituency.

Before I close, there is another way to get to know your legislators better, and for them to get to know you better as people. The Pacific County Chapter invited their legislators to a Meet & Greet at the end of one of their charity runs. Can you imagine getting to show off our community to the legislators as they experience first hand the power of motorcyclists helping their community? It would also be a good way of sharing a common experience, and building a bond with your legislator. That is the sort of thing that can lead to a productive working relationship between legislators and ABATE members. I am sure there are many chapters that could make an appointment to see their legislator in their district office and make a run out of it. The key is getting to know your legislator by sight, and getting them to recognize your face, even better if they remember your name. That is the first step in getting things moving next session. We have to start now, and not wait until next Black Thursday.

As Senator Benton said to those of us on the steps of the Capitol on Black Thursday: "Don't give up. You're wearing them down." Let's wear them down completely. ◊
