

As the current ranking minority member of the Transportation Committee, it would be a benefit to all motorcyclists in the state to have him win re-election this year. While he personally thinks a motorcyclist is better off wearing a helmet, Rep. Orcutt believes its use should not be mandated as not wearing a helmet endangers no one other than the rider themselves.

Elk Country Chapter's "3 Pass Run" will be history by the time you read this. Since it is on the same day as the Tri-Cities B.O.D. meeting, I hope the weather cooperates. Riding over three mountain passes, the lowest of which is 4,500 ft., makes for some spectacular riding.

Elk Country Chapter's inaugural "ABATE Chapters Run" will be coming up in a few weeks as you read this. Starting in Morton and riding to the homes of the Spanaway, Key Peninsula, Mason County and Olympia Chapters. This poker run will end in Lacey at the Tea Leaf 2 so that any ABATE members who attend will be able to ride a reasonable distance home. Riding over Mountain Hwy, Tacoma Narrows Bridge, Hwy 16, Hwy 302, & Hwy 3, before riding through Shelton to end in Lacey. For those who haven't been, those are some very fun roads to ride on a bike. 

"In 1998, the bikers of this nation wrapped up a two-year lobbying effort with the signing of the TEA 21 (Intermodal Surface Transportation Equity Act reauthorization bill which became Transportation Equity Act for the Twenty First Century). In this bill was the work of the collective "we." A ban on NHTSA lobbying states to enact laws. The prohibition of motorcycle bans on highways and roads that use federal monies. A change in NHTSA's mission statement to include "accident PREVENTION." Also, the inclusion of motorcycles in the development of the Intelligent Transportation System.

Each time some of this hard-gained ground has been threatened, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) has rallied constitutionally-minded motorcyclists to contact their legislators.

> The MRF issued a Call to Action on Saturday, June 7 regarding an imminent vote on an appropriations bill, Monday, June 9. With not even 48 hours with which to work, we saw a swift surgical strike by the bikers of our nation once again.

> Thank you - to the constituent bikers who called U.S. Congressional House members and let them know that Section 102 of HR 4745 was inappropriate; that you considered it a violation of previous agreements, and an infringement upon the 10th Amendment of our


U.S. Constitution.






