# LEGISLATIVE NEWS



There are two things I would like to discuss this month. I'll focus on the most important one first, then briefly make a request of anyone who would like to help ABATE keep moving forward in our cornerstone effort to fight the helmet law. But, first things first.

"What district do I live in?" This seems to be a common question as Black Thursday begins to get closer. "Who are my legislators?" is another equally common question. Well, in this report, I hope to help you answer both of those questions. If you don't already know your legislators, pay attention, because now is the time to get to know them. Take a look at the maps accompanying this article. They show the locations and numbers of the legislative districts in Washington State. Find where you live on the maps, and you will see your district number.

Then go online to *www.leg.wa.gov* and contact them. If you support what they have been doing in the legislature, tell them. If you don't, tell them that as well. Explain why you don't support what they have done; but do it in respectful, polite manner. Even just sending them an email can be important. Contacting your legislators, and making an appointment to discuss issues of importance to you is very important. It puts a face to the name of their constituents, and when they are able to recognize a face and put a name

to it in a positive way, you are already well on your way to becoming a powerful force for change.

You don't have to wait until the legislature is in session. Contact them and ask to meet in the district. Either in their office, or somewhere else that is convenient and comfortable for you both. Invite them to attend, and speak at your ABATE Chapter meeting. Even if they don't normally support ABATE, having them attend a meeting and listen to your Chapter's concerns can help. Being able to speak to constituents in a group, in the district, can be a big draw for a legislator. It also helps to drive home to your legislator who you are. Two of my legislators from the 20th District came to a couple of our Chapter meetings during the summer. When January came around, they both remembered our Chapter's name. More importantly, they remembered the names of our members who they had spoken with individually during and after the meeting. If they remember you in a positive way, you are much more likely to have a positive effect on how hard they work for or against a bill.

Contact your legislators. Get to know them, and let them get to know you. That time spent, can pay dividends later down the road. Imagine how you will feel when Black Thursday rolls around, and you attend your meeting with your legislator, and they greet you by name. It means you have put yourself into a position to possibly help affect change. Empower yourself, get to know your legislators, affect some positive change for our motorcycle community.


Now for the second thing, I wanted to discuss. About five years ago, Donnie "Mr. Breeze" Landsman wrote letters to many of the law enforcement agencies throughout the state asking for copies of any documentation they had on helmet recalls, and any lists of non-DOT compliant helmets. That was in 2010. I would like to ask any of our members who would like to do it, to write to your local law enforcement agency. Ask them for a copy of any documents they have on "motorcycle helmet recalls," and "Non-DOT Compliant" motorcycle helmets. When you get a reply, please scan it and email it to me at legislative1@abate-wa. org so I can add it to the letters already in ABATE's data base. If we can show that even law enforcement has no clear idea of what helmets have been recalled. or what helmets are non-DOT compliant with a stack of letters from law enforcement from around the state, it should have a positive effect on getting us moving farther forward on the issue. It will be hard for the WSP to counter dozens of letters from other law enforcement agencies stating they have no documentation on the issue. If you can help, and write those letters in your own words that would help considerably. The letter only need be a few sentences long. Simply asking for copies of any documents the agency has on motorcycle helmet recalls, or non-DOT compliant helmets.

I thank you for any assistance you can give. It will be worth it, if we can show there aren't any, and hasn't been any over a period of several years.

Catch you on the road sometime ... ◊

#### **Rat City Chapter**

Greetings from Rat City,

Are you "GoodtoGo?" ... or are you not? This is a new debate after revelations motorcycles will need a toll pass to use the lanes for free.

What are the penalties for not having a GoodtoGo pass? Will motorcyclists without passes be tolled the same rate as a single occupant car using the facility? What are the penalties? If motorcycles are singled out by enforcement, would this be considered "profiling?" These issues haven't been brought up, nor have they been clearly addressed. The answer that seems to come out repeatedly is "Get a GoodtoGo pass."

What aren't well publicized are the differences between the I-405 Express Toll Lanes (HOT Lanes) and the SR 167 HOT Lanes which have been around since 2008. There are no toll cameras on SR 167, and motorcyclists can use SR 167 without toll passes. As such, feel free to ride down the SR 167 HOT Lanes when coming to visit us for our annual Rat Roast which will be held August 29th in Kent. Feel free to bring a side dish as we'll be BBQing up some good brisket. Hope to see y'all there. Donations will be accepted for Rat City's Downed Rider Fund. Ride well. ◊

First I've got to tell you all what a great experience lobbying in the nation's capitol is. Even if we didn't make it to Washington, D.C. on the Road King, (that's a whole other story!) I did get there in time to visit the offices of all Washington's Congressmen and Congresswomen.

All the Aides were friendly and listened attentively and a couple openly disagreed with one or two of our talking points. I just asked them to please check their facts from a non-partisan source and re-think their opinions. And, isn't it wonderful that we live in a country where we can openly discuss our opposing views? (I think it had to do with the EPA and ethanol. And of course, they were much younger than I am.) I was lucky to see Jaime Herrera-Beutler and Derek Kilmer briefly. They were both cordial and Congresswoman Herrera-Beutler is a true supporter of Motorcycle Rights. She is a co-sponsor of the Sensenbrenner bill and pays attention to motorcycle riders' rights. It is interesting that in the recent roll call vote on HR 2577 (the Walberg Amendment) that the votes followed party lines.

The four Republican Representatives voted "Aye" and the six Democrats voted "no." Thankfully, the Amendment which prevents federal employees from lobbying in states to further the federal agenda on the tax payers' dollars passed with a 235 "Ayes" to 189 "Noes" vote. This indicates to me that we must work harder to educate many of our Legislators. Why would something as simple as a motorcycle helmet be such a political issue? We're all the same American people!

There were 22 states represented in the Bikers Inside the Beltway lobby day at the Capitol. It would be fabulous if next year

there were a more of us from Washington state making our voices heard in the other Washington. The date will be the Thursday after Mother's Day. Mark it on your calendar and join me.

# **MRF** REPORT

#### FROM Jeff Hennie, Motorcycle Riders Foundation, VP Government Relations & Public Affairs

A quick, short recess week saw little congressional or regulatory action. On Friday, Obama's Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) dealt what could be the beginning of the end for ethanol fuel growth. The EPA has been sitting on a proposal for a year and, half to lower ethanol requirements for oil refineries. The Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) is a law passed by Congress that mandates the amount of ethanol to be included in the nations fuel supply. Each year the RFS ticks up a little bit, until now.

The EPA has proposed that levels be slashed in 2015 and 2016 to the tune of about four and five million gallons, respectively. The drop in production requirements has angered those in the ethanol production world, and delighted those who do not want more ethanol in the fuel stream.

As for motorcyclists, the news is encouraging; the less ethanol being required will mean that the smaller amounts of ethanol will have to be spread thinner. This in theory, removes the need to increase the blend to E15 levels. The EPA knows that ethanol is unpopular and cites this as the main reason to lower production requirements. The market has spoken, and it is not in favor of ethanol.

Starting this Monday the short-term highway bill countdown begins. The new extension expires July 31. Look for another extension this summer, unless someone finds \$550 billion dollars lying around in the next 60 days.

On June 4th the United States House of Representatives agreed to an amendment to the 2016 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Appropriations bill that struck a provision that would have overturned the U.S. Department of Transportation lobby ban. The measure was approved on the House floor reports the Motorcycle Riders Foundation.

The Amendment offered by Congressman Tim Walberg (R-MI) along with Mr. Sensenbrenner (R-WI) and Mr. Ribble (R-WI), eliminates a provision in the 2016 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Appropriations act that would have allowed the Secretary of Transportation to discuss motorcycle safety initiatives with state legislators. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation thanks Congressman Walberg, Sensenbrenner, and Ribble for their dedication to freedom and motorcycling.

In 1998 Congress passed a law that made it illegal for the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) to lobby state legislatures on any issue. Prior to 1998, according to the Government Accountability Office (GAO), USDOT had spent tens of thousands of dollars traveling to states whenever a state debated changing their own state helmet law or any other law that USDOT deemed worthy to interfere on. Seeing this as a waste of taxpayer money, the congress prohibited anyone from USDOT to lobby states uninvited.

Mr. Walberg had this to say, "The federal government should not be in the business of lobbying state and local officials with federal money." He added, "I believe the most effective way to reduce motorcycle injuries and fatalities is to prevent these crashes from occurring in the first place, Madam Chairperson, that means putting between the ears as opposed to simply on the head."

"I cannot think of a single issue where the federal government should waste resources lobbying a state entity for something that the state doesn't want", said Jeff Hennie, Vice President of Government Relations and Public Affairs for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. He added "With such limited, precious motorcycle safety funds, they need to be used in areas of safety that are proven, not for bureaucratic waste."

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) thanks everyone who made calls on this important issue; your participation was key in getting this amendment to pass.
