

We also have the Steps for the group picture and any one who wants to say a few words. The Columbia Room is reserved for base of operations. You can take a break or pick up info and go to appointments.


APPOINTMENTS: Now would be the time to organize your folks for who will be speaking at the meeting with the Reps and Senators. If you're new, check





It is always good to be able to have quality sources for your information. Dependable, reliable sources are the best. When it comes to motorcycle accidents and fatalities, it is best to go straight to the horse's mouth and get your data from local law enforcement and the Washington State Patrol. If you go online, you should be able to find the website for your county sheriff. Then on that website, you should look for a link from the home page for "public information" or "public records" requests. Many have a downloadable form in pdf format so you can fill it out and send in your request. Here is the link to the WSP public records request form: http://www.wsp.wa.gov/publications/pubrec/recreq.pdf

There are also links to request statewide collision data that could be quite helpful in researching motorcycle collision data in Washington State. One link is to the Statewide Travel and Collision Data Office's "Request For Crash Data" pdf form http://www.wsdot. wa.gov/mapsdata/collision/pdf/780 032 RequestforCrashData w textfields.pdf

As you fill out the request form, be as specific and detailed as possible. For example, you may want to ask for records for "all motorcycle crashes on state highways in 2014," instead of just "motorcycle crashes."

Washington law (Chapter 42.56 RCW) requires that identifiable public records be made available to members of the public for inspection and copying upon request. Only records that are exempt by law may be withheld from disclosure. The Act also requires that the public records requested are "identifiable." Your public records disclosure request must include a reasonable description that would allow an agency employee to locate the records. A general question is not a public disclosure

Pursuant to the provisions of RCW 42.56, upon receipt of a Public Disclosure

Request an agency is required within five (5) business days to provide a 'reasonable timeframe' to respond. That doesn't mean they have to provide you with the information within five days, but they do have to inform you of an estimated length of time it will take to gather the information and provide it. Don't expect this to be a free service however. The agency can charge a "per page" fee for the records, so be prepared for that. Especially if there are several pages involved. I know the Spokane County Sheriff Office charges 0.26 per page.

Another useful source of information is the Washington Traffic Safety Commission. They do not have a online form, but simply a formal written request. You can either send it by snail mail to:

Or you can fax the request to: 360-586-6489. Also, you can email your request to: gnelson@wtsc.wa.gov

To request copies of photos, witness statements, officer's notes, or any other records involving a collision or traffic incident, please send a written request to the WSP district office for the county where the incident occurred. The following is a link to the location of the WSP district offices found on the Washington State Patrol website: http://www.wsp. wa.gov/publications/district locations. htm#tacoma

By using the public records the government has already compiled, ABATE of Washington and its members can build a strong factual case on any issue that the government might have records of. The fact that they do not have records can also be quite telling. For example, we have letters from over thirty (30) law enforcement agencies in Washington State that say they have no records on DOT compliant motorcycle helmets, non-compliant helmets, helmet manufacturer recalls, or

helmet testing. More responses are expected by the time you are reading this. The hope is to have copies of fifty (50) letters from different law enforcement agencies all saying that they have no records on helmets that are DOT compliant or not prior to the start of the short legislative session in January.

The government has the records, it is up to us as citizens to exercise our rights and use those public records in our ongoing struggle to preserve and defend the rights of the motorcycling community here in Washington State. Get involved and help us win the struggle.

Rain or shine, show up at Black Thursday, and get your legislators to understand our issues. When the WSP representative in a Senate hearing can only come up with the comment that "helmets protect riders from flying lug nuts..." after ABATE and other MRO's in Washington State have testified to amend the helmet law, it would appear that this is more about control than safety to the WSP. If fifteen thousand (15,000) motorcyclists can show up in freezing temperatures

in Olympia for the Toy Run, we should be able to get more than three hundred (300) to make the effort a month later to protect their rights base in the legislature. If you can't make it on a bike, cage it. Or, even better carpool with your friends. Rent a van and pack it full...just be there. Warm blooded constituents are what we need to press the point to the legislators. Especially if your district is represented by a legislator on the House Transportation Committee, you should be there. Pressure to hold a hearing on our bills in the House needs to be respectfully applied so that the Committee Chair will have no excuse not to hold a hearing. That is when our collecting of records will be able to bear fruit. This isn't a one or two day a year effort. Chapter Rep Region 5

After the October ABATE of Washington Board of Directors meeting, many of us Chapter Coordinators have questions about where our organization is going. We all believe in the original purpose of ABATE. We believe we are: A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments. We believe, "The purposes and objects for which the corporation is organized are:

- To promote motorcycle safety education programs, motorcycle awareness programs, and motorcycle rider training programs;
- (2) To promote fair motorcycle legislation, to prevent enactment or work to repeal existing unfair motorcycle legislation.
- (3) The corporation may exercise all rights, powers, and privileges that are now or hereafter may be conferred by law upon nonprofit corporations, including specifically the powers enumerated by Section 24.03.035 of the Revised Code of Washington." (Article III., Articles of Incorporation of A.B.A.T.E. of Washington, filed Mar 21 1979, with the Secretary of State, State of Washington, D287483.)

We think that our rights as members and Directors of ABATE, and American citizens have been violated by the totalitarian acts of members of the executive officers. The wishes of the members were completely disregarded, despite the Coordinators' protests, by the way the budget vote was handled. It is also a blatant disregard of bylaws and standard operating procedures for a committee to enter into a contract for the organization without the approval of the members. (ABATE of Washington, State Bylaws, Article X, 10.5)

Many of us also question the way Robert's Rules and standard operating procedures are ignored by Executive officers being the active members of committees making decisions that affect the organization without any reports to the board of directors. Reports to the board of directors are a requirement of a functioning committee. The committee chair is in a position of trust. Trust by the governing group (the BOD) to do the job charged to it, to the best of their ability for the good of the organization. There seems to be a serious amount of "totalitarianism" going on here. Maybe it is time for a complete independent audit of ABATE of Washington to get back on track?

Several of us have studied the bylaws of ABATE of Washington and are unable to find anything that says that nonchapter affiliated members don't have voting rights. Article III, 3.3, does say "Members shall have the right to vote,...."

In our opinion we think the organization as a whole is falling behind in the number one purpose of our being. We all like to have fun but we think we focus too much on one "fun"

event and put our prime purpose in second place. Can we alter our direction back to our purpose?

I believe that our basic rights guaranteed by the 1st
Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of
America have been threatened by officers of ABATE of
Washington telling members of the Board of Directors that
questions asked about committee work is "none of your f_
business." ABATE of Washington is a membership based
organization. That means that everything done by ABATE of
Washington IS my business and all other members' business.


Our annual Trunk-or-Treat went very well, our name ABATE is being very well recognized by our community, with great appreciation for what we do in our LIL town...

Our meetings are going well. We just got 3 new members to join with the possibility of another one soon. The report back from STEAM & BOD was much appreciated.







Congress Buys More Time to Pass Highway Bill

November 21, 2015—In an effort to allow more time to pass a long-term highway bill, Congress has passed an extension that allows for more negotiation time for this important piece of legislation. The extension, signed by President Obama via autopen on Friday, November 20, renews the government's authority to keep highway and transit funding flowing to states through December 4 and gives Congress until then to iron out any differences in the long-term spending bill.

As previously reported by the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF), the highway bill contains key issues of vital concern to motorcyclists. First, the bill ends the federal funding of motorcycle-only checkpoints. It re-convenes the National Motorcycle Advisory Council (NMAC), a group that advises the Secretary of Transportation on how infrastructure issues affect motorcyclists. It maintains the ban that prohibits the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) from lobbying states to pass mandatory helmet legislation, and it allows for funding of a study to determine the best ways to prevent motorcycle crashes.

Both the House and Senate have already passed separate versions of the bill. The House version calls for spending \$261 billion on highways and \$55 billion on transit over six years, but only if Congress can find a way to pay for the final three years. In contrast, the Senate's version contains only three years of funding, with the extra three years as conditional.

In order to maximize funding for roads and transit projects, transportation groups and some lawmakers are urging the highway bill's conference committee to allow for more money over fewer years. "As you begin conference negotiations to reconcile House and Senate proposals for a multi-year

surface transportation reauthorization bill," wrote a group of 26 senators in a letter to members of the conference committee, "we urge you to consider the urgent need for an increase in infrastructure investment around the country, and report a final proposal that can best address these needs by maximizing annual investment levels for all surface transportation programs over a shorter authorization period."

The MRF will keep you apprised of developments as the conference committee continues its work on the highway bill. #

United States House of Representatives Transportation Committee Passes Long Term Highway Legislation

October, 2015—The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) is pleased to report that the US House of Representatives Transportation and Infrastructure Committee has passed a six-year highway bill. The bill, H.R. 3763, otherwise known as the Surface Transportation Reauthorization and Reform Act (STRRA) of 2015, was passed unanimously by the committee chaired by Representative Bill Schuster (R-PA).

The bill contains a few provisions near and dear to the motorcyclists of America. Most importantly, it ends the federal funding of the highly unpopular motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints. "Ending the checkpoints was, and is, 'Priority Number One' for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation," said Jeff Hennie, Vice President of Government Relations and Public Affairs for the MRF. "We are knocking on the doorstep of accomplishing this because similar language is already in the Senate highway bill."

Additionally, the bill re-launches the much-needed Federal Motorcycle Advisory Council (FMAC). The FMAC was initially set up under a previous highway bill and served the country well, but because of some bureaucratic red tape the council was done away with. This bill revives the FMAC for the purpose of developing recommendations to the sitting Secretary of Transportation on all things regarding motorcycles and motorcycle-related infrastructure. Lastly, H.R. 3763 commissions a study to be conducted by the National Academy of Sciences on the best practices for preventing motorcycle crashes. While it will be a while before the study is begun and the results analyzed, it will be very significant as it will be the first study ever that is totally about crash prevention and not about helmets.

"This bill improves the everyday lives of motorcyclists in a very profound way," added Hennie. "Living in a world where we can be pulled over for just riding a motorcycle has been an unacceptable practice. Ending those unwarranted stops has been the focal point of the MRF legislative agenda since they began, and we thank the Congress for hearing our demands and serving justice." #

Of course we had a lot of help from ABATE membership, the COC, US Defenders, and Independent motorcyclists from across this state.


