more training to help stop the fatalities. With the increase in the number of riders, the death rate continues to rise. I like the training idea. The trouble with the folks who are running the DOL is they are using data from the WSP, who also influences their thinking. I do not want to wear a green vest or a yellow flashing light on my bike.

Back to training, according to the numbers, the DOL shows 75% of the fatalities involved one or more of these factors: rider has less than two years experience; unendorsed rider, or unknown experience level.

We as leaders in the community have to encourage younger folks to get the



proper training and show the young folks how to stay alive on the road. Look forward to seeing the folks at STEAM...♦



## Legislative Affairs Officer Brian Lange

Over the past few weeks I have been speaking with legislators about what they believe is the most effective means of testifying during Committee hearings. Beyond the usual – politeness, clarity, conciseness, knowledge, etc. – there is one other point that gets forgotten, personal experience with the matter at hand. Virtually everyone brings knowledge and data to support their position. However this can lead to a battle of statistics, which either confuses the Committee members, or allows them to “tune-out.” When that happens, we have lost our effectiveness.

To use the helmet issue as an example, it has been suggested by some Committee members that witnesses stating the personal issues they have with being forced to wear a helmet is more effective. With the information being conveyed in a concise and intelligent manner, the personal focus sinks in more deeply into the minds of the legislators.

Let's say that a person with neck issues testifies how the added weight of the helmet on their head causes fatigue and pain while riding. This fatigue and pain can lead to distraction and inattention while on the road. We all know the added risk of an accident that fatigue and distracted driving can create, yet we have no option in Washington State other than to wear what causes that fatigue, pain and distraction. This same person testifying how wearing a helmet while riding can lead to days of neck pain brings a more personal note that the Committee members can relate to.

In a Committee hearing, ABATE will continue to provide the best information we can. If we can bring forward one or two individuals who can relate the personally detrimental effects of helmets to the Committee in coordination with other testimony, we will continue our progress towards making Washington the 32nd state in the Union to have a Freedom of Choice helmet law.

If you have personal experience with the detrimental effects of being forced

to wear a helmet and would be willing to testify during a Committee hearing, contact me at [legislative1@abate-wa.org](mailto:legislative1@abate-wa.org) to discuss any options for you to help.

Also, I would like to address the Chapter LAO's directly, especially those closest to Olympia. It will help ABATE become even more effective in Olympia if we can maintain a presence at the capitol. To do this, we will need the cooperation of all the LAO's in maintaining at least email contact with me. In that way, we can more efficiently and effectively keep our message being heard in Olympia. If all the LAO's are on the same page with what ABATE is trying to accomplish we can present a much more united front to the legislature during the upcoming short session.

For those chapters within about a 90-minute ride of the capitol (farther if you are willing to spend the time), I would like to create a sort of “rapid response” team of LAO's and Chapter Coordinators who would be able to spend time at the capitol actually meeting with legislators during the session. All going by the same playbook and having the same goals in mind. With a little coordination, we should be able to have people available on different days to meet with legislators and discuss our issues. It is because I realize the difficulties involved in having time to travel to the capitol, that I am proposing this team concept. My own job only allows me a few hours one day per week to be able to spend in Olympia, as well as the sporadic assistance of one or two other members volunteering during the session. As was proven last session, that simply isn't enough. We simply need the Chapter LAO's to step up as much as possible, and make ABATE an even more effective legislative organization than it is.

The Chapter LAO's across the state can help in this process by networking



with each other, acting as a clearing house for local district calls to action involving specific legislators, and helping keep the Chapters up to date on the latest details of our progress in the legislature.

The details will have to be worked out prior to the start of the legislative session. **That is why I am asking all LAO's and any Chapter Coordinators who do not have an LAO to participate. Contact me via email at the legislative address [legislative1@abate-wa.org](mailto:legislative1@abate-wa.org) and we can begin to have a cohesive plan, if not by the October BOD and STEAM, then at least before the January BOD.** Together, we can maintain a cohesive and unified front before the legislators. Keeping the pressure on to get our Bills passed like we have only dreamed before. It can be done. Be a part of it, share in the success by coming together and building a strong team to keep ABATE of Washington a leader among the Motorcycle Rights Organizations.

I'm looking forward to hearing from you, and working together. ♦

## United States House of Representatives Subcommittee Improves Motorcycle Safety with Amendments to Highway Bill

SEPTEMBER 11, 2015—The Science Committee, Subcommittee on Research and Technology, approved two amendments that both greatly benefit motorcyclists. The first amendment halts the federal funding of motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints and then assigns a study to the National Academy of Sciences to determine the best methods of preventing motorcycle crashes.

The amendment sponsor, Representative Randy Hultgren (R-IL) had this to say: "If the federal government is providing grants to improve motorcycle safety, these grants should be focused on ways that actually improve the safety of motorcycle riders."

The second amendment would prohibit the Federal Department of Transportation from lobbying for actions at the federal, state or local levels of government. Currently the lobby ban is only applicable at the state level.

Hultgren added, "I do believe that we can be doing more to improve the safety of motorcyclists on the road, and there are reasonable laws that motorcyclists should all follow. But before the federal government casts down another top-down mandate on local law enforcement officers, we should be sure that we are not wasting valuable police time, while singling out and infringing on the rights of law abiding motorcycle riders, unless there is a compelling

safety related reason for doing so."

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation would like to thank Mr. Hultgren for his dedication to motorcyclists. We also cannot thank enough the Chairman Emeritus, the Honorable James F. Sensenbrenner, for his tireless work improving the lives of motorcyclists across the country. #

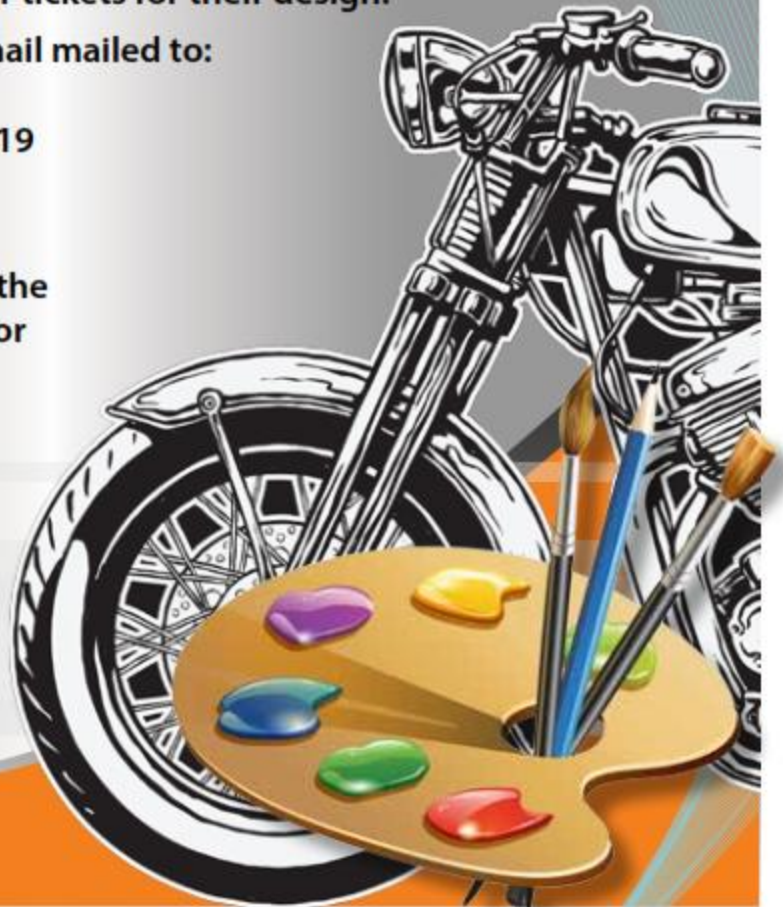

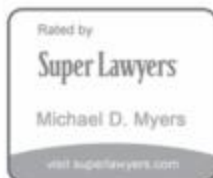

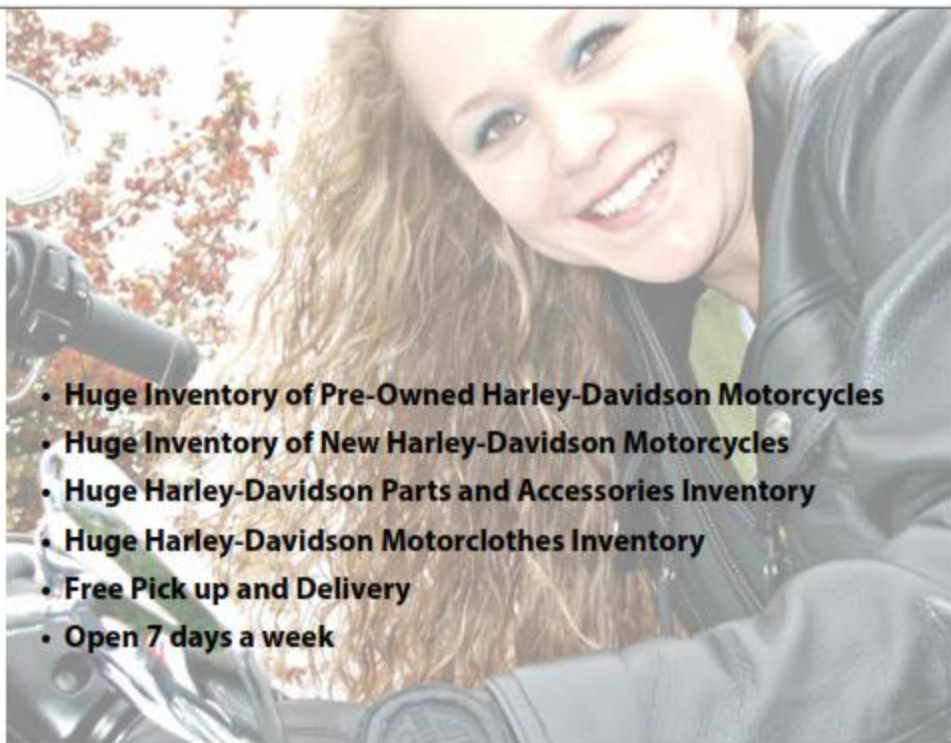
