**BE IT REMEMBERED**, at a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court of Dallas County, Texas, held on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2022 on a motion made by **Dr. Elba Garcia**, **Commissioner of District 4** and seconded by **John Wiley Price**, **Cpommissioner District 3**, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS	Community Health Worker's (CHW) Week wil be observed April 26-30, 2022. The DFW-CHW
	Association recognizes this week as a joint effort with the State of Texas, which has declared April
	16th as Texas CHW Day; and

WHEREAS	The DFW-CHW Association's mission is to strengthen the community health workforce through
	professional development, education, networking, and community outreach; and

WHEREAS	Texas was the first state to formally recognize Community Health Workers as members of the public
	health workforce through the passing of House Bill 1864, and is one of the few states that offers a
	statewide CHW certification; and

WHEREAS	in Dallas County, Community Health Worker's Week recognizes their passion and dedication to
	improve community health, and celebrates the legacy of Community Health Workers and their
	community partnerships, working to improve the health of their most vulnerable community members;
	and

WHEREAS	Community Health Workers are nationally recognized as essential front line public health workers by
	government agencies; and

WHEREAS	leadership from Community Health Workers along with leadership from State, City, and local health
	officials are key to their sustainability and integration; and

WHEREAS	Community Health Workers play a key role in advancing health equity, increasing access to care, and
	reducing health disparities; and

WHEREAS	improving the health of populations requires sustainable, multi-sector collaborations between	
	healthcare providers, public and private agencies, and their community stakeholders; and	

WHEREAS	the more than 4,000 Texas Community Health Workers and Community Health Worker Instructors
	serve a vital role in improving the health of their communities through community outreach and health
	education; and

WHEREAS	the thousands of Community Health Workers in Dallas County work tirelessly to meet the health
	needs of the most vulnerable populations in our communities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Dallas County Commissioners Court does hereby declare the week of April 26-30, 2022 as Community Health Worker's Week in Dallas County, and further appreciates and commends every Community Health Worker for their outstanding and dedicated service to provide a better quality of life to those in need.
