

The Rebuilding Grants Program, established by the Creek Fire Recovery Collaborative, is now accepting applications for our third grant cycle. To date, the program has awarded \$220,000 to 15 homeowners. This round we are offering up to \$5,000 to six qualified low and middle-class residents to tackle some of the barriers to rebuilding their primary residences lost in the 2020 Creek Fire.

GUIDELINES

APPLICATION DEADLINE: FEBRUARY 10, 2023, AT 5PM PROJECTS MUST BE COMPLETED FROM: **MARCH 1 TO MAY 31, 2023**

Funding from this program is available to assist homeowners that had a loss of a primary residence due to the 2020 Creek Fire. Grant funds must relate to rebuilding a primary dwelling unit and can be used for the following rebuilding-related expenses: repairs to water, septic, and electrical systems, architecture and engineering fees, permit and plan check fees, grading, foundations, and more. If awarded, funds will be paid directly to vendors for rebuilding-related expenses. No reimbursements will be permitted and no survivors will be given cash directly. Funding for projects is conditional upon following California Building Code and proposed projects are required to pull permits as necessary.

OUALIFYING CRITERIA

- Be rebuilding a primary residence that was a total loss resulting from the Creek Fire. Be enrolled in the Disaster Case Management
- Program.
- One grant application per household
- Grants cannot be retroactive.
- Income must not exceed the Rebuilding Grants Program income criteria below.
- Qualifying income is Adjusted Gross Annual Income.
- Must be intended for owner-occupied residence by the grant applicant and the built property must not be listed or intended for sale.
- Households/couples not filing jointly may not apply for separate grants.
- Cannot have received more than \$20,000 previously from the Rebuilding Grants Program.

- 1. Copy of State issued ID for the applicant
- 2. Proof of income (W2, 1099, Tax Returns) 3. Proof of property/home ownership
- 4. If, Creek Fire affected, proof of residence in 2020
- 5. If insured, a copy of your insurance declaration
- 6. Contracts from Licensed and Insured Contractors or estimates for requests.
