Reporting Community Issues

Whether it is a blocked storm drain, graffiti on a wall, damaged playground equipment, illegal dumping, or anything else for which the City of Fairfax is responsible, use Fairfax City Resolve website or download the app to get the problem fixed fast. This new service allows you to easily report problems the community. Your request will be routed to the appropriate department and you will receive an email notifying you that a ticket has been created. You will receive an email when the problem has been assigned, and another one when the problem has been resolved.

The Westmore community has always gotten swift action when we've posted issues on the Facebook page, and we are grateful! This new portal will help connect you with the appropriate department as needed and will provide a more reliable means of communication.



City of Fairfax Police will be visiting our neighborhood for this year's National Night Out on **Tuesday, August 3, 2021 from 6 PM to 9 PM**. Officers will be broken into teams to visit registered neighborhoods throughout the evening to engage City residents and their families. We gather at the pavilion at **Westmore Park** located at the intersection of Oakwood Drive and Fern Street.

Lock • Take • Hide

The City of Fairfax Police Department recommends citizens practice three key actions with their valuables at home and away, particularly when they are in vehicles:

Lock vehicles even when they're parked in areas that are considered "secure" (driveway, limited-access parking lots, well-lit areas), LOCK YOUR VEHICLE.

Take your keys with you when you leave your vehicle. When possible, take your valuables — handbags, backpacks, purchases — with you, especially when leaving the vehicle overnight.

Hide valuables in the vehicle (in enclosed trunks, glove boxes, consoles, under seats)

Elimination of Plastic Bags for Yard Waste

City of Fairfax City Council voted to prohibit the use of plastic bags for the set out and collection of yard waste material, which consists of grass clippings, leaves, vines, and brush created during general landscape maintenance.

The change requires Fairfax City residents who receive curbside collection of yard waste to use reusable containers, paper yard waste bags, or to bundle their yard waste. Although the new rule takes effect immediately, a transitional period from June 2021 to February 2022 will allow time for customer notification and education on the new rule. During the transitional period, yard waste set out in plastic bags will still continue to be collected.

The city plans to begin enforcement on March 1, 2022. At that time, yard waste that is set out in plastic bags will be identified with a red tag to notify the occupant of the violation and the material will be left on the curb.
