The Westmore Citizen's Association meeting was called to order at 7:37 pm via Zoom, with 7 community members present; including board members President Beth lannetta and Secretary Frank Franz.

Old Business:

- Presbyterian Church update
 - A pedestrian path is planned up to Main Street from the Church.
 - This is part of church property.
 - A waiver is being requested on the six-foot fence regulation.
 - An additional parking area behind the church is planned, but the premise for the spaces doesn't seem to make sense.
 - The church says the spaces are needed for additional ADA parking, but there are only two ADA spots, plus churches do not need to comply with ADA requirements.
 - Another reason stated by the church is that the additional parking can be used by brides who wish not to be seen by guests before the ceremony.
 - The church has not provided the average number of weddings per year that occur at the church.
 - Back and forth is occurring between the planning commission and the church on several issues.
 - Future work sessions with the city council are also planned.
- The walk and talk meeting about the Kamp Washington small area plan was well attended.
 - 25-30 people were in attendance.
 - The stormwater design will drive some of the decisions.
 - Pedestrian planning is also something with which the Westmore community is concerned.

New Business:

- There are white arrows on the ground on the trail from Woodland Drive to the Presbyterian Church.
 - Improvements seem planned, but details are not available yet.
 - Frank is reaching out to Cathy Salgado for details.
- The next Westmore Citizen's Association meeting is Tuesday, July 19, 2022.
