“Be of good Courage”

Joshua 1: 5-9 – (5) No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you (Hebrews 13:5) (6) Be Strong and Courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their ancestors to give them. (7) Be Strong and very Courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go. (8) Keep this book of the law always on your lips. Meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. (9) Have I not commanded you? Be Strong and Courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.

Deuteronomy 31:23 – The Lord commanded Joshua, Son of Nun: Be strong and courageous, for you will bring the Israelites into the land I promised them on an oath, and I, myself will be with you.

Courage – Webster’s – the ability to do something that frightens one. Strength in the face of pain or grief.

Courage – H533 – Strong’s – A primitive root – to be alert physically or mentally. Sted-fastly minded, strong, Establish, fortify, harden, prevail, obstinate.

Courage – H2388 – Strong’s – to fasten up. To seize, be strong, obstinate, to bind, restrain, be constant, harden.

Courage is found 19 times in the Old Testament, only 1 time in the New Testament.

Sted-Fastly – to be stationary, to preserve, to Stand.

1 Corinthians 16:13

Ephesians 6:11, 13, 14

Philippians 4:1

Establish is found 39 times in the Old Testament, 4 times in the New Testament.

**Establish – H6965 – to rise, abide, accomplish
H3559 – to be erect (stand perpendicular) to set up**

H539 – build up or support; to foster, to render firm or faithful, to trust or believe

H2388 – to fasten up

H3245 – to set, to found, to sit down together, take counsel, settle

H5564 – to prop, to lean upon or take hold

**G4741 – to set fast, to turn resolutely in a certain direction or to confirm.
(1 Thessalonians 3:2)**

Obstinate – stubbornly refusing to change one’s opinion or chosen course of action despite attempts to persuade one to do so.

2 Kings 7 – The four men with leprosy

Hebrews 11: 17-40 – By Faith

The book of Acts – Courage in the face of threats and death

John 14: 1 – Do not let your hearts (minds) be troubled (agitated), you believe in Jehovah believe also in me.

John 14:27 – Peace I leave you, my peace I give unto you, not as the world gives, give I unto you. Let not your heart (mind) be troubled (agitated) and do not be afraid (to be frightened or alarmed).

Agitate – make troubled or nervous. Stir or disturb to cause action
