Since the date is unusual, we thought we would plan something unusual for the GSD event: a Make-and-Take clinic. Members that purchase a kit, will spend the morning learning how to finish and assemble a laser cut kit.

If you decide that you do not want to participate in assembling your own version of the kit, you are still welcome to attend. But, a hands-on experience at learning techniques is not an opportunity you want to miss. So, please register!

Ron Klaiss, owner of Mine Mount Models, will be leading the Make-and-Take clinic, teaching you

many of the techniques he uses to build great models. The kit we will be building is the HO Scale Skip's Bait and Tackle from Mine Mount Models. The structure is versatile for use as any business, not just a bait and tackle shop. Ron will also have a supply of his many other kits, for sale, at the event.

What a great opportunity to learn new skills, build confidence, and construct a model, while in the company of friends. HAROLD F. WERTHWEIN

OCTOBER 3, 1921 - DECEMBER 15, 2019

Harold became well known in the world of model railroading when, upon his retirement from Picatinny Arsenal in northern New Jersey, he started construction of an HO scale layout representing the Delaware Division of the Erie Railroad between Port Jervis and Binghamton, N.Y. This layout filled the entire basement of his ranch-style home and was later expanded to include the various branches that worked the coal mines in northeastern Pennsylvania. The layout was featured in magazines and videos, making a star of Harold, but true to his character, he took it all in stride with his usual quiet modesty. The layout hosted hundreds of operating sessions during Harold's life, acting as a monthly meeting point for model railroaders in and around the northern New Jersey area.

His wit was sharp and the sparkle in his eye showed he enjoyed what he was doing. The operating sessions he hosted were the seed of what became the vibrant model railroading community in northern New Jersey (and pulling in folks from adjacent Pennsylvania and New York).

Harold was a master manager who quickly identified talents in his operators and put them to good use in many areas around the layout. The final layout was a true collaboration between Harold and dozens of talented modelers, resulting in a masterpiece.

As much as he was a manager, he was equally a mentor, helping others and offering advice and tips to other modelers just starting on their own layouts. Virtually every major model railroad in the area bears the stamp of Harold Werthwein somewhere on it.

During the last month of his life, Harold was moved into hospice. A final operating session on the Delaware Division was held on December 14, 2019, with record attendance to see the final run of Harold's masterpiece. People from far and wide gathered to honor the man who affected each one of them in some way, great or small. The attendees demonstrated the same respect to one another that Harold had for every person who ever walked into his basement. The day following the session, Harold passed away, leaving behind a legacy of service, friendship and accomplishment that will be remembered long afterwards. He was a truly remarkable individual in every way.

Rest in peace, Harold.

TOOLS AND TIPS: THE LAST STEP IN LEARNING IS DOING

To learn various aspects of modeling we have many sources of instruction including books, magazine articles, YouTube videos, online forums, blogs and even columns in newsletters. They can help you understand how to execute a technique or achieve an effect in your modeling but you need to do it yourself to really understand how the concept works. Live demonstrations and clinics are more helpful because they allow an interaction where the audience is able to ask questions or to see the model close up or even handle it. In recent years the Garden State Division has hosted Works-in-Progress clinic events with smaller groups and shorter clinics. They allowed the audience a closer look and even better interaction with the clinician. For some of these sessions, the audience was invited to try for themselves.

The best type of clinic for learning something is one where you receive instruction and then you do it yourself to see how well you learned. In general, this is not revolutionary and that process of instruction followed by testing of your understanding has been the basis of education throughout our school years. However, learning to build models is much more fun.

Hands on and Make-and-Take clinics are common at regional conventions. A very popular version at NMRA national conventions is the Modeling with the Masters program that includes instruction and assistance by Master Model Railroaders. More recently that program has been available at some regional conventions as well.

At the Garden State Division 2020 Winter event, we will have the opportunity to participate in a Make-and-Take clinic and learn the necessary skills to build a laser cut wood craftsman kit. If you never built such a kit, here is your opportunity to do it with help not from reading the instructions but with guidance and instruction from the designer and builder, Ron Klaiss, owner of Mine Mount Models. If you have already seen a craftsman kit and were intimidated by looking at the parts, let Ron show you the steps that make building the kit a project that any model railroader can accomplish. If you are already a builder of these kits, come and add another structure to your inventory and maybe share some tips. If you are an armchair model railroader, this clinic will be a great time for you to get out of the chair, come to the table, get hands on and build the kit with the rest of us.

I am looking forward to the event and I hope that you will join me in building your first or your latest laser cut wood structure. WP


