

ANCHOR ACTIVITIES

One classroom differentiation strategy is utilizing **Anchor Activities** in your classroom.

What are they? Anchor activities are an activity that is meaningfully connected to the lesson, engaging, and worthwhile for the students. They are intended for early finishers, the beginning of the day, or any extra time, turning idle time into active learning.

Why should I use them? By having a set activity to turn to during idle times, students are empowered to take control of their own learning. It often gives students the opportunity to think about the topic in a new way, making deeper connections.


