⁴For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, ⁵so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. (Romans 12: 4-5) Friends,

You may be familiar with the expression, "I'm spiritual, but not religious." It has certainly grown in popularity over the past few decades. While I applaud anyone who has a genuine faith and spirituality, as I'm convinced this is better than not. But what does one miss out on by not being an active part of a faith community? What do you miss by going it alone?

I ran across this list that tries to address this question. From author and church leader Sharad Yadav (with some small edits for language):

- "As I try to remember why the [heck] I do this for a living, here is a handful of reasons, dear friends, to consider joining a church:
- 1. To join a church is to commit to a social circle you do not get to choose and can therefore show you whether your spirituality is [baloney] or not.
- 2. Joining a church is a way of practicing among a small group of people over a significant period of time what you'd like the world to be like.
- 3. To join a church is to live in rebellion against the neoliberal and capitalist forces which are brainwashing you into making your consumer desire the center of the world, reducing all your experiences of the world (including all the people in it) to instruments and resources.
- 4. Joining a church is to organize your life around a time to confess your limitations, culpability and imperfections together with other people so that you can get used to receiving divine forgiveness and hope in response to your honesty.
- 5. To join a church is to resist all traditional loyalties to state, party, culture, family or affinity in an act of loyalty to a group that transcends all natural categories.
- 6. Joining a church organizes your financial priorities around supporting an inclusive community for vulnerable people . . . that you actually have to live with.
- 7. To join a church is to cultivate an environment unlike your home, work or play where your life is not measured according to any other purpose or goal than to discover and enjoy your own humanity.
- 8. Joining a church is a way of maintaining healthy skepticism about human knowledge and capacities in the language of divine mystery.
- 9. To join a church is to cultivate an imagination for how your unique talents and creative potential can be offered on purpose for love instead of money.
- 10. Joining a church is a life lesson in how to deal with [jerks] without retaliating, dehumanizing or running away (in the desperate hope of not becoming [a jerk yourself])".

This fall we have been working through the 7 Marks of Congregational Vitality from our denomination's Vital Congregations Initiative. These 10 items intersect with so many of those marks. Do any of the items speak to your heart today? Would any of them enrich or enliven your spiritual or personal life? Would any of them help with your loneliness or anxiety or sense of disconnection? I encourage you to spend some time pondering and praying about these questions. And I look forward to seeing you soon!

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

Our church designated October as Wills Emphases: month. Across the denomination there is a recognition of this important part of our church life, and at some time during the year, the churches provide for some opportunity of looking at our past and honor the memory of those who have gone before and offer education on how we might consider your own plans. Sunday, October 16, Andrew Kveene, financial advisor for our church was guest and shared a minute for mission and then attended fellowship following worship. In introducing Andrew, Ben Lang noted some of the ways we have benefited from some who preceded us. Some gifts were large some small, but each has served to continue some part of this church's mission that was important to these people. How do you want to be remembered?

Means of providing is as varied as the people doing the providing. A part, or all of retirement funds; naming the church as life insurance beneficiary; a simple dollar amount or percentage of estate, stated in the will; or providing a current investment like a charitable gift annuity giving current income to you with distribution to church at you passing, are all possibilities. Your financial or legal advisor can assist you if you need some assistance with your planning.

Looking at the sidebar, you will see that 2023 continues to show a healthy financial picture for our church. There are several things combining to make this happen. The investments continue to do well for us with good stewardship and guidance from our financial advisor. Some expenses we put into the budget were not as high as expected, or for some reason have not been necessary this year. Our staff and committees continue to be careful and prudent about how they carry on the daily business of the church. And last, but certainly not least, our church family continues to be faithful in their giving throughout the year. We at First Presbyterian in Willmar are so very blessed and have a wonderful church family and staff. In the words of Tiny Tim, "God bless us, every one."

The Per Capita for 2023 is \$44 per confirmed member. We have now paid our total Per Capita for 2023. Whatever portion of the per capita that you are able to contribute, we appreciate the help. This is a record year for member support for the Per Capita. And, this strong support is evident in the operating income covering the operating expenses. Thank you for your support and for recognizing how important this expenditure is. Our denomination does an amazing job of budgeting and keeping this cost so low, at all levels, and still serving the needs.

\$552 has been given for Extra Giving dollars so far this year. This ongoing practice helps with the end of year shortfall. God appreciates a cheerful giver, and so do we, the Budget and Finance Committee, financial secretary and treasurer! Thank you, we could not do this without you, nor could First Presbyterian be the Church in the Heart of Willmar with Heart!




Dear Church Family,
