Dear Friends,

In my youth I had the privilege of attending camp at Camp Rimrock, the Presbyterian camp in the Black Hills. I loved camp. I really loved M.A.D Camp (Music, Art, and Drama Camp)! It was all my favorite activities. In the span of one week we rehearsed and performed a musical. It was intense, but so much fun. And I have never forgotten a single musical we performed. I can still sing the songs today. My favorite musical was the year we performed "Fat, Fat, Jehoshaphat."

If you are not familiar with the story, here it is in a nutshell. Jehoshaphat was the king of the nation of Judah, who found themselves in the unfortunate position of facing invasion from three rival nations: the Moabites, the Ammonites, and the Meunites. With this threat bearing down on his nation, Jehoshaphat seeks the Lord and asks all Judah to fast (which is how fat, fat, Jehoshaphat becomes flat, flat, Jehoshaphat). Through a prophet named Jahaziel, the Lord tells Jehoshaphat that He will deliver Judah without a fight. Believing the word of the prophet to be true, Jehoshaphat does something radical - he goes out to battle with the choir leading the way in front of the soldiers, singing praise to the Lord. While the nation of Judah sings praises to God, they watch their enemies turn on one other and destroy each other without Judah having to lift a sword. If you would like to read the story for yourself, you can find it in 2 Chronicles, chapter 20.

I have been thinking about this story as the COVID-19 pandemic stretches into another month, prompting further cancellations and disruptions. It feels as if we are under attack on multiple fronts: we are battling an illness whose impact we cannot fully predict; we are fighting to keep our heads above water financially; we are caught in the crossfire of political posturing. Like the nation of Judah, we might be tempted to give in to fear and despair; we may be wondering how we can survive against this foe. Perhaps this is the time to take direction from the good king and turn to God in prayer. There will, no doubt be losses - loss of income, loss of security, loss of loved ones. But giving in to fear and despair will not change the outcome. Our best hope is to practice a faithful fast - fasting from worship in our sanctuary, fasting from public gatherings, fasting from blame and finger-pointing. And, like the nation of Judah, let us lead with praise. Lift your voice in songs of praise and choruses of encouragement. May songs of hope sustain us and lift our spirits as we remember *the battle is not ours; it belongs to God* (2 Chronicles 20:15).

Virtual Communion

Christ is made present to us in the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not confined to a particular building, place, or time. Because we believe that sharing Communion is an act of faith, and because we need the nourishment that comes from sharing Christ's feast, we will be celebrating Communion *virtually* for the month of May. What does that mean?

- Pastor Scott and Pastor Leanne will lead us through the traditional and familiar words and actions of communion. They will break bread, pour the cup, and speak the words of institution, inviting Christ to be present with us wherever we are.
- You will supply your own bread and cup. There are no strict rules about this. The bread represents the common food of common people. It can be any variety of bread, crackers, rice cakes, or tortillas – whatever you have available to you. The cup, likewise, was the common beverage of the day. Traditionally, that would have been wine. In our worship service we use grape juice. You may use either of these, or whatever juice or beverage you have available. Remember, the bread and cup are symbols, the presence of Christ is made real in them by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Please let us know that you shared in this wider offering of God's gracious feast by commenting on the Facebook worship video feed or sending a message (text or email) to the pastors.

Caring Hearts Fund



As a Church known for being “a church with heart in the heart of Willmar,” we often have individuals and families walking in asking for help with food, gas money, shelter, or other incidentals. Many of us take for granted that we will have gas in our tanks to get to a medical appointment or work. We could find it in our family budget to purchase a warm coat, or a bus ticket to visit a family member who is ill. We don’t wonder if we will have a place to sleep when it’s pouring rain or bitter cold outside. Now, in this season of

COVID-19, families are experiencing extra hardships. Our pastors offer the hospitality of a listening ear, a word of encouragement, and prayer. When possible, they help connect these folks to resources in the community that can help meet their needs. When there aren’t other options available, they do their best to help in the small ways that resources allow. That is why we have a fund called the *Caring Hearts Fund*. This fund provides the pastors with funds that can be used, at their discretion, to respond to the needs of our neighbors. **May is the month that our mission offering goes to this Caring Hearts Fund. Please consider supporting this important ministry to our community.**

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP **COMMITTEE REPORT**

We are grateful that the March numbers are very similar to February! March was a five-Sunday month which usually gives a little spurt in giving, but with the pandemic we started worship on line for three of those Sundays. March completed the first quarter and so we had investment income as part of these totals.

We will pay the per capita balance to Presbytery by April 30. We remind you to pay the \$42 per confirmed member as you are able and we welcome the payment at any time during the year. Our total obligation is \$ 9,783 this year.

Extra giving to date is \$208. Operating expenses go on, whether the doors are open or not, with some not as high and others higher. And we know the same is true for each of you. Some people will have to set aside their commitment and pledge until things return to normal. Please consider an extra gift if you can.

A big thank you to those who have mailed in their contributions. For some time we have looked at setting up on line giving. With the website in place it is possible for us to add this alternative mode of giving. The application has been sent to the Presbyterian Foundation and they are processing. There are many churches who are applying due to the pandemic but we hope it will be in place by the time you read this. All the funds, monthly mission causes, etc. will be available for you to select.

Online giving will be one more choice in addition to regular giving by check and cash. You will still be able to make gifts in other ways. We provide for automatic bank transfers monthly. People who reach the age of required distributions from IRA accounts may direct that distribution to the church (or other non-profit) and may realize some tax benefit as well. Gifts of appreciated stock or other assets may be given. At any time if any alternative giving interests you, talk to Deb or Bea with any questions.





WESTMINSTER HALL
FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
WILLMAR, MINNESOTA
MAY 13 AND MAY 17, 1953

Westminster Hall, the Christian Education wing of our church was formally dedicated on Sunday, May 17, 1953. The Willmar Tribune, dated May 15, 1953, detailed the special events of the day:

Sunday School

The Sunday School's portion of the program, which begins at 10:15 a.m., will include songs by the children in the beginner and primary departments, to be followed by the litany of dedication, led by W. G. Ferguson, Sunday School Superintendent. The Chapel Choir, under the direction of Mrs. C. R. Channer, will sing "I Was Glad," followed by the dedicatory prayer by Dr. C.M. Kleinhuizen.

Morning Worship

At the morning worship service, beginning at 11:00 a.m., Mr. Eldon Wenzel, Minnesota Synod executive, will deliver the dedication sermon which has been entitled "Beyond the Incidental." Music for the morning service will include a selection by the choir, under the direction of Mrs. C. M. Kleinhuizen, a vocal solo by Mrs. A. L. Walkup, and the organ prelude and postlude by Organist Mrs. G. M. Robbins.

Open House

Sunday afternoon will be devoted to a three-hour open house event at Westminster Hall, to which the general public is cordially invited. The Women's Association of the church, with Mrs. J. H. Robertson, president, and Mrs. Rudolph Sanderson, second vice president in charge, will serve refreshments to the visitors.

Sunday Evening

Dr. Charles J. Turck, president of Macalester College in St. Paul, will be the guest speaker at a community service Sunday evening, beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the church sanctuary. Dr. Turck's address will deal with the relation of church and state with emphasis on Christian education. The choir of the First Methodist Church of Willmar, under the direction of S. R. Sonnicksen, will furnish the special music. Following the evening program, Westminster Hall will again be open to visitors from 8:30 to 10:00 p.m., which will mark the close of the day's events.
