PASTORS NOTE

Dear Friends,

Since I'm writing this letter to you in February, I have no idea what weather will greet you at the beginning of March as this arrives in your mailbox or inbox. But I know there is a bit of weather folklore that proclaims March will come in like a *lion* or a *lamb*. I'm not sure if there is atmospheric science to support this claim, but I've never forgotten the concept. Mostly because gluing cotton ball wool coats and yarn manes to paper was a satisfying art project for my younger self. Made even more fun when there was a little competition involved, guessing which it would be to meet us on March 1st.

As I've matured in life and in faith, I am less concerned with old wives' tale weather predictions and more concerned with the spiritual seasons in which we find ourselves. It is my call and vocation, after all, to be concerned with the spiritual well-being of the flock I shepherd as your pastor. And I know that for many of you, weather aside, this is a *lion* season. Life is not gentle or peaceful. There is a roar of worry, conflict, struggle, and change that surrounds you. It was an easy guess, because the prowling presence of unrest is a constant in our human lives. There is always a new challenge, a new struggle, a new decision, ahead of us. Even good changes are uncomfortable. We find ourselves longing for mild lamb-like weather for our lives: gentle breezes; green pastures; still waters; sunlight on our path.

Here is the consolation I have found in faith. Life is not *lion* or *lamb*. Life is *lion and lamb*. Because the Lord of our lives, the one who protects and guides us, the one who nurtures and provides for us is not *lion or lamb*. Jesus is *lion and lamb*. He is simultaneously gentle and fierce, conqueror and sacrifice, defender and nurturer. *Lion of Judah and Lamb of God* who takes away the sin of the world. It is a false binary, perhaps not in weather, but certainly in life, to claim that Jesus is one or the other. Jesus is both *lion and lamb* all the time. And if that is true of Jesus, it can be true for us. That prowling presence of unrest may be a constant in our lives, but so too is the love and care of Christ. The storm may rage, but we are lambs in the care of the good shepherd. The good shepherd who is also a prowling lion, keeping guard around us. Fierce and tender. With us in all circumstances.

At the end of the month - the 31st to be precise - we will celebrate Easter Sunday. The day we rejoice that the lamb of God who carried the weight of our sins is also the one who conquered the grave. Whether the weather is stormy or calm, may we rest in the comfort of the one who loves us this much. We look forward to seeing you at our holy week services and Easter Sunday to celebrate that love.

Sometimes it seems like the gaps in our world are only widening. Hundreds of millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education and opportunity. Crises like conflict and climate change are worsening existing inequalities and injustices. It can be a lot to take in and process.

If we all do a little, it adds up to a lot!

Join Our Mission Trip to Kentucky!

The FPC Mission Committee is excited to offer an opportunity to help with disaster recovery by rebuilding tornado damaged homes in Kentucky. We are partnering with the Eden Prairie United Methodist Church on a mission trip to Madisonville, Kentucky from **April 13-20, 2024**.



In December 2021, Kentucky was hit by record-setting, catastrophic tornadoes. The Fuller Disaster Center Response has been leading recovery efforts and are seeking volunteers to help rebuild homes that were destroyed. Many families have been waiting for two or more years. If you can swing a hammer, a paintbrush, or a broom, we'd love to have you join our adult mission team.

Our team will be heading to Madisonville, Kentucky on Saturday, April 13 and arrive on Sunday, for a welcome and informational dinner. We'll work Monday through Friday and return home on Saturday, April 20. Housing is provided by a host church; tools and building materials are also provided.

You'll have the opportunity to use your hands (and your hearts) to make a difference, connect with others, laugh, learn new skills, and so much more.

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

2024 is starting out on a positive note with income greater than expenses. We know there are some hefty expenses coming, so this is a real plus to start with a bit of a surplus. Milder weather, and very little snow removal in February is encouraging. While we need to take care of our facility and ensure safety and comfort of members and visitors, program and mission are the more joyful part of our operations.

In recent conversations, people wondered what and how designated funds happen. When a donor makes a gift and marks it as "Building and Remodeling" or "Food Shelf", that is a binding contract and that gift must be used or saved for that purpose, no matter how short another fund might be. So, a designation has been established by the donor. Designations may also happen under the direction of the Session. For example, the church might be the beneficiary of an estate gift, with no designation established in the will or trust document. It may be left as undesignated or General Fund money, or the Session may establish a purpose for the bequest, and make a designation. A designation can only be changed or released by the person or body who made the original designation.

The Per Capita for 2024 is \$45 per confirmed member. If you are new to First Presbyterian or are not familiar with per capita, talk to the pastors or Budget Committee members to understand how this money is used. Per capita is paid in support of the three governing bodies of the Presbyterian Church USA, our presbytery, the synod and the General Assembly. This goes toward operating or administrative expenses of each body. The work of the greater church, Mission, Disaster, Hunger etc. are supported by designated giving. When you think about it, it is a bargain to operate the governance of the greater church at \$45 per member. Compare this to any secular charity and be impressed! We have a practice of taking per capita giving each month for the first three months of the year and paying as received. We then pay the balance in the fourth month. Remember, we welcome your payment as early as possible but receive any time during the year you are able to pay.

There has been nothing given for Extra Giving in 2024. This ongoing practice helps with the end of year shortfall. God appreciates a cheerful giver, and so do we, the Budget and Finance Committee, financial secretary and treasurer! Thank you, we could not do this without you, nor could First Presbyterian be the Church in the Heart of Willmar with Heart!

PER CAPITA

2024 Per Capita is \$45, please pay as you are able. We will pay per capita to the Presbytery as it is given, through April with the balance paid in May. We appreciate your payment whenever you are able, but the sooner the better for the church cash flow.

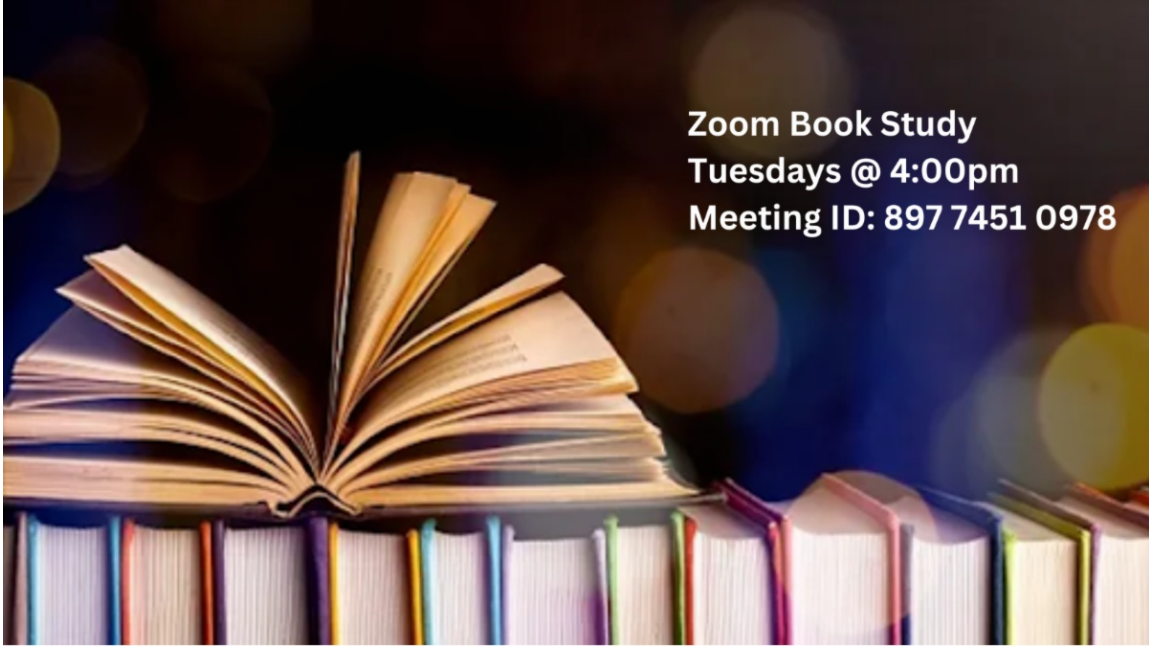
