PASTORS NOTE

Dear Friends,

For over 5 years we have been blessed to be partners with Family Promise of Kandiyohi County to serve homeless families in our area. As you know, the program resides on the 3rd floor of Westminster Hall, which we remodeled to suit their needs. We created office space, two handicapped accessible restrooms, a living area, a kitchenette, classrooms, and a laundry room. We are so pleased with this arrangement! Over the years scores of people – men, women, and children – have been given a roof over their head and food on the table because of your willingness to include this valuable ministry as part of our congregation's ministry.

You may not be surprised to hear that the demand for Family Promise's services has only increased with recent years, especially with the circumstances of the pandemic. Family Promise has been at capacity for nearly a year and has had to turn families away for lack of space. Which brings me to the point of this message: We were recently approached by the owners of G&S Staffing who own the red two-story house adjacent to the church. They are retiring, selling their building, and approached our church as a potential buyer. Our session immediately thought of our partnership with Family Promise when we learned of this opportunity and of the demand for their services.

The session has put together a task force to investigate what it would mean for our congregation to purchase the G&S Staffing building and to partner with Family Promise as a tenant expanding their ministry into that location to serve homeless families. The demand for their services is so great that they would continue to use the 3rd floor location in Westminster as well as any additional potential space in the G&S building.

At this point there are still many unanswered questions. The session task force consists of Bob Dincau, Sherry Myers, Betty Knutson, Mel Odens, and Pastor Scott. We are all doing the legwork to investigate what a purchase of the G&S building would mean for us. In January the task force will be hosting listening sessions via online meetings to share more information with you and to answer questions. If the congregation were to purchase this building and use it in partnership with Family Promise it would take a vote of session, a vote of the congregation, and the concurrence of the Presbytery. That's in addition to the ordinary steps one might take to purchase real estate.

What we need most from you at this time is your prayers. The session will only pursue this purchase if it is in line with the mission of the church. Pray for God's guidance as we examine this opportunity. Pray for our hearts to respond to the call of God to care for the people of our community. And pray for the session and task force as we pursue this process. And watch for more information via emails, Facebook postings, and mailings, about how you can be part of the conversation as we move forward.

Celebration of Communion

January 10, 2021

Christ is made present to us in the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not confined to a particular building, place, or time.

Because we believe that sharing Communion is an act of faith, and because we need the nourishment that comes from sharing Christ's feast, we will be celebrating Communion virtually in January.

- Pastor Scott and Pastor Leanne will lead us through the traditional and familiar words and actions of communion. They will break bread, pour the cup, and speak the words of institution, inviting Christ to be present with us wherever we are.
- If you are worshipping virtually you will supply your own bread and cup. There are no strict rules about this. The bread represents the common food of common people. It can be any variety of bread, crackers, rice cakes, or tortillas – whatever you have available to you. The cup, likewise, was the common beverage of the day. Traditionally, that would have been wine. In our worship service we use grape juice. You may use either of these, or whatever juice or beverage you have available. Remember, the bread and cup are symbols, the presence of Christ is made real in them by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Kandiyohi County Food Shelf



Kandiyohi County Food Shelf is thankful for the continued support and partnership with First Presbyterian Church. The Kandiyohi County Food Shelf is at 624 Pacific Ave SW, Willmar, 320-235-2641 and has been helping Kandiyohi County residents since 1982.

Currently, they are seeing people come from these top 3 towns; Willmar, New London and Raymond . They are serving an average of 650 households a month (2300 individuals) with a food order. Most household's live paycheck to paycheck and just one bad event such as getting laid off, a health issue or a death in the family and they are seeking help. Some of the newer people to the food shelf are coming because of decreased work in hospitality.

Hours of Operation and service during COVID-19:

Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 8am-3:45pm, Friday 8am-2pm

They are offering curbside pickup only. When you arrive at the Food Shelf, pull up to our front door where there is a sign with a phone number on it to call. They will get your food ready inside and will put it in your vehicle. Typically takes 3-5 minutes to receive your food.

A \$20 donation can help purchase almost \$200 worth of food through our Food Bank, Second Harvest Heartland. It is good to give money donations locally so the funds can stay in our community. Cash is King at the Food Shelf.

An average household will take home between 80-100 pounds of food depending upon what they choose. Meat, milk, cheese, miscellaneous dairy and produce are some of the main favorites at the Food Shelf.

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

The numbers for November are difficult to share as we have gone from black ink to red—\$377 expenses in excess of receipts. This number is not too great, but it has been a significant drop from October. Having noted that, we are still confident that with some December extra giving and the fourth quarter of investment income we will end the year on a positive note. Knowing what this year has been like for our church families and continues to be, we are gratified to be even close to break even, and again thank each of you for doing whatever you can to help the church continue to minister to members, friends and neighbors. We look forward to 2021 and the gradual return to a more normal life. We know it will take time but are confident we will be moving forward in the days and weeks ahead.

We now have the 2021 billing from Presbytery for the per capita expense, which has increased to \$43 per confirmed member. Our total obligation toward the operation of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly is \$10,148. It has been our practice to make monthly payments according to what we received from you during the first three months of the year, making the final payment in April. If you are able to pay your share during the first quarter of the new year it helps both the denomination and our operating expenses, as we will pay the balance regardless of how much it is. But, we remind you that paying as you are able through the year is a major help to the operations. We will make note of the benefits we receive for what is really a nominal cost per member in future reports. Church treasurer, financial secretary and pastors will be happy to answer your questions.

Extra giving to date is \$2,083. Extra giving helps to reduce the end of year deficit so that we can minimize our end of year appeal for help in balancing the budget. Some of our smaller sources of income are not happening. The extra giving continues to help toward reducing any end of year appeal.

The November General Fund numbers are in the sidebar and it is with gratitude and appreciation for our members and friends, who continue to make their donations by mail, in person, or on line. Our thanks to each of you for making what could be a difficult struggle a joy and pleasure.


