#### Friends,

First of all, Pastor Leanne and I would like to extend a personal invitation to you. I'll speak more about that invitation in the paragraphs below, but first I want to share some words about what we've all lived through in the past two years. I was just talking to a fellow father of a college-aged daughter about how school was going. He shared how difficult the pandemic was for her. The social isolation and distance learning came at a time in her life when she was meant to step out, have new experiences, and make new friends, and therefore couldn't have come at a worse time. She really struggled with isolation, discouragement, and anxiety brought on by it all. She's doing much better now, but she definitely came through the pandemic a bit beat up and a little worse for wear. As a fellow parent, my heart went out to him as he shared the story of his daughter's experience.

Maybe her experience resonates with you too? The pandemic has taken its toll in various ways on all of us. Not only that, but during the months of isolation many of us were cut off or withdrew from Christian fellowship and regular worship attendance. And that separation maybe became a habit after a few months and you've felt yourself a bit distant from your church family.

If there's one thing that I've learned from this pandemic, it is that our mental, physical, and spiritual health are all interrelated. You've maybe been beaten down emotionally and spiritually and are feeling a bit low or in need of encouragement. If so, now is *not* the time to cut yourself off from the lifegiving vine that is abiding in Jesus. To abide in Christ is to experience fullness of life and the warmth of the love of God.

**Maybe you need to reconnect?** It is our earnest prayer and the goal of our every effort that your church would be a place where you experience this fullness of life and the love of Christ. That is why Leanne and I are endeavoring to create opportunities to reconnect with you, to hear your stories, learn of how we can support you, to hear your prayer concerns, to support your families, and walk alongside of you.

**Therefore we'd like to personally invite you** to table fellowship and conversation. We have set aside certain times to make this happen throughout the coming year:

- Sunday Lunch at your place or out somewhere
- Wednesday night dinner at your place or out somewhere
- Weekday coffee anywhere, at a time that works for you

It's sort of an old-fashioned thing, isn't it? Sunday lunch with the pastors? But that doesn't mean it's not a good thing. To schedule a time to reconnect, call, text, or email Leanne or me. Or call or email Shara at the church office. If it's a meal or coffee out, the pastors will pay their own way, so no need to worry about that!

We look forward to spending time with you and learning what we can do to support you on your spiritual walk. In the meantime, I want to encourage you to reconnect with your church family: join us for Sunday morning worship; drop in on a Sunday school class; join one of our bible studies scheduled throughout the week; call a church friend you haven't spoken to in a while. Regardless, know that you are loved, and may you abide in the vine that is Christ.

# The Kandiyohi County Food Shelf

The Kandiyohi County Food Shelf has been serving families in Kandiyohi County since 1982. Currently they are helping an average of 450 families a month. A family typically goes



home with 50-100 pounds of food which includes dairy, canned fruits/vegetables, grains, canned protein, snacks and beverages, cooking and baking, packaged dinners, frozen meat and sweets and breads.

They currently are offering 3 types of service: curbside, in person, and delivery. Most people are choosing curbside as it's fast and they get a variety of items.

The Food Shelf serves all of Kandiyohi County with the 3 towns we are seeing the most people come to us are from Willmar, New London, and Raymond.

The Food Shelf relies solely on donations from churches, businesses, individuals and grants to continue to do what they do. A \$20 donation can help them purchase \$200 worth of food thru their food bank Second Harvest Heartland in Brooklyn Park. The Food Shelf receives 2 semi loads of food monthly.

Most household's live paycheck to paycheck and just one event such as getting laid off, a health issue or a death in the family and they are seeking help from the food shelf.

The Food shelf is open Monday, Tuesday and Thursday's 8am-3:45pm and Friday's 8am-2pm.

# TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

Though this will reach you as the first Voice in 2022, we are reporting on the end of year for the financial position of our church. Perhaps you noticed that no one from the Budget and Stewardship Committee gave a minute for mission, requesting an end of year extra giving to help reduce or better yet, eliminate the deficit! The Committee looked at the results of previous years, where we have had small surpluses, and consequently have accumulated a small balance in the General Fund that should be able to cover whatever the deficit (expenses greater than income) for 2021, so this year the Committee recommended that we NOT urge additional giving. We know, as you do, that this has been a difficult year for many people. We appreciate all that you do, giving as you can, and felt the church could handle the deficit for 2021. (You can expect we will be back next year.) We also expect there will be some extra income from investments and perhaps some extra gifts as well. We are a people of faith, and thank you for all you do, not only for the budgeted needs but for the many mission needs.

The Annual Report for 2021 will have financial data. Please read it and contact the committee or Deb or Bea with any questions. And, we hope to see you at the annual meeting, as well.

We are continuing to receive donations toward the retirement of the internal loan incurred for replacement of the roof. This internal loan is being paid by a combination of the occupancy income we receive and your gifts designated for the roof. (Note, this is separate from the Building and Remodeling Fund that also welcomes your gifts). The Building and Remodeling Fund is for new projects and the items like roof and upcoming overlay of the parking lot are maintenance of existing facilities.

The Per Capita for 2022 is \$43 per confirmed member. Our total obligation of \$10,234 toward the operation of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly will be paid as we receive your per capita gifts for January, February and March. The remaining balance will be paid in April. We encourage confirmed members to pay per capita as they are able. Per capita for each governing body—General Assembly, Synod and Presbytery, funds the operation of each. Included for General Assembly is the cost of staff and overhead. The General Assembly is responsible of the worldwide mission of the Presbyterian Church USA, the Christian Education materials and publications, the guidance of the disaster relief among other things. We will try to highlight how per capita is used, each month in this report. However if you have questions the pastors, Deb and Bea will be happy to try to answer them, or will find

the answer. When you look at what is covered, we are getting an amazing return for what it costs per member.

Extra giving to date is \$3,473 through November 30, 2021. We know in reality many give "extra" without identifying it as such, and make gifts over pledged amounts. All goes into the income of the General Fund, and "counts" toward reducing the shortfall at end of the year.

We hope we will be seeing you back at worship and other activities, soon. ABOVE ALL, STAY SAFE AND HEALTHY.
