THE STORM By Mary Oliver

Now through the white orchard my little dog romps, breaking the new snow with wild feet.

Running here running there, excited, hardly able to stop, he leaps, he spins until the white snow is written upon

in large, exuberant letters, a long sentence, expressing the pleasures of the body in this world.

Oh, I could not have said it better myself.

It might seem rather strange that I'm sharing a poem about a little dog prancing through the snow in the height of summer, but I found it so appropriate as I relate to it so very much. We are blessed with a rescue dog, Rosie, who we learned from a doggie DNA test is almost half Alaskan Husky. If you ever want a real-life picture of what Mary describes when she writes of a little dog flouncing through the snow tracing, "large, exuberant letters," I invite you to come visit our house this January after a fresh snowfall to see the same drama played out as she records.

But the beauty of what Mary describes in her words about the expression of "the pleasures of body in this world" isn't a seasonal discovery. We can find it in winter, spring, summer, or fall. Jesus says in John 10:10 that "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." I'm frequently puzzled over that statement as an impossibility. Are we supposed to be walking around elated all the time? Are we meant to be materially blessed with rich foods, and fine things? Or are we meant to realize that the abundant life is all around us, even in the yips, and in a spray of snow flung from the nose of a pup as she frolics in the yard - if only we have the eyes to see it? That if we tune in to the marvel of a bumble bee on the blossom, or the gentle rhythm of lakeshore waves, we can find abundance all around us?

I think it is possible that it is the latter.

MISSION OF THE MONTH



July Mission Focus: Family Promise of Kandiyohi County

Imagine that you are a young parent who has been hit with several serious challenges in your life. Maybe you were laid off from your job just when a serious condition has run up some big medical bills. Maybe there is just no room in Grandma's one bedroom apartment, so you and your kids

end up sleeping in your car. No job, no home, no hope. Who can you turn to? That's why Family Promise is here.

Family Promise of Kandiyohi County is a secular, nonprofit, community based organization which is one of over 200 affiliates throughout the U.S. partnering with faith communities and other local organizations in the Willmar area, "our goal is to do whatever we can to assist homeless families gain emergency shelter, daily meals, and equip families with the skills they need to overcome homelessness. We believe that families need a 'hand up,' not just a 'hand out." (from the Family Promise website)

FPKC has recently undergone some significant changes. The Shelter, located on Pacific Ave in Willmar, operates with a 3 person staff and 6 housing rooms that can sleep up to 5 people per room depending on family make-up. Post Covid, Family Promise is now a "static model," meaning that families are housed for up to 90 days in one location. 13 local churches on a rotational basis provide evening meals 3 days a week and groceries for additional days.

Family Promise is currently serving 6 families (guests) with a total of 22 parents and children, so the facility is nearly filled to its capacity. Families may be one or two parents with children, or sometimes a single female can be served. Guests meet with the case manager weekly to go over goals set, budgets, job search skills and housing prospects. Want to know more? On July 14 during worship, Elaine Boyd, currently a Family Promise board member, will share some additional updates.

How can we help? Diapers! Family Promise guests currently include several kids 1-3 years old so one of the major needs is diapers. During July we will be collecting diapers and baby wipes of all sizes to donate to their supply.

In addition, cash donations can be given to First Presbyterian and designated Family Promise, or donations can be made directly to Family Promise, PO Box 774, Willmar MN 56201.

Family Promise of Kandiyohi County is very grateful for all the support the people of First Presbyterian have provided in the past and look forward to partnering with you in the future--- because "every kid deserves a home."

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

This is not an easy report to write—our deficit is growing rapidly. Summer is a time of reduced activity with other distractions, opportunities for recreation and vacation time and accordingly sometimes the church giving is overlooked. If you look at the sidebar, you see the expenses are much larger than the various incomes. Compared to last year, giving is down and expenses are up. We need everyone's help to, at the very least, stop the increase and would like to see some reduction of this deficit.

If you listen to media reports, you hear talk daily of inflation and price comparisons of many of the necessities of daily living. We know and understand that every household is feeling the stress of meeting costs. If you are able, we need you to do a bit extra in your church giving. And, if you are not able, know that we all understand. (And if you are wondering: NO ONE except the financial secretary and/or treasurer knows who gives what and who is meeting their pledge. All that is evident is the total numbers.). We remind you, a little extra from each household can amount to a big help.

As we came into this year, we were blessed with a number of years of surpluses and have a Rainy Day Fund, but we must not wipe that out in a single year. Most of us on the Budget and Stewardship Committee have been on the committee for a long time. Some of us have delivered pleas during worship at the end of year seeking to eliminate a deficit. It has been a joy for us in recent years to be relieved of that task. Can we do it again?

\$125 has been given as Extra Giving. We have been blessed in recent years with end of year numbers about even, and part of this has been help with Extra Giving. Reading this report, we are running much further behind this year. We will try to keep you informed as the year continues. This ongoing practice helps with the end of year shortfall. God appreciates a cheerful giver, and so do we, the Budget and Finance Committee, financial secretary and treasurer! Thank you, we could not do this without you, nor could First Presbyterian be the Church in the Heart of Willmar with Heart!

2024 Per Capita is \$45, please pay as you are able. We will pay per capita to the Presbytery as it is given, with the balance paid at the end of April. We appreciate your payment whenever you are able, but the sooner the better for the church cash flow.


