PASTORS NOTE

"Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." Romans 8: 26-27

Dear Church Family,

This was meant to be a big year. A year stacked with graduations, weddings, reunions, anniversaries, and celebrations. I know in our personal life alone, there have been two graduations, a wedding, a milestone high school reunion, a family reunion, a shortened college school term, and a family spring break vacation that have been affected by the raft of cancellations hitting all of us.

You probably have a similar list for your family, I am sure. Some of you are dealing with far heavier hurts, such as a funeral that is still pending, or the inability to hug a grieving friend, or the disappointment of being separated from someone dear. Each one of these situations is a disappointment and a set-back. And today's message to you is that it is OK to be sad, hurt, disappointed, and to grieve. It is OK to name your outrage at the circumstances that have brought us this far and to let it all out. As Christian counselor Dr. John Delony puts it in his online blog post, "How to Deal with Disappointment,"[1] "Don't try to gloss over or numb these feelings. Name them and feel them. Be angry. Have a hard cry. If you're saddened by the grief and loss of a loved one, write your lost family member letters, stay connected to your community, or get virtually plugged into a church or group. Connect and talk about your loss with your close friends... let them know you're sad. Hear their losses. Sit in your grief, but don't bathe in it ... and then make a plan for being courageous."

And the good news for us as a family of Christ is that we are not alone in our grief. Our plan for courageousness is supported. It is buttressed by the love of each other, and as Paul reminds us in Romans 8, the Spirit who intercedes for us in our weakness. Even when we have no words, the groanings of our hearts, are heard by God, received by God, and welcomed by God.

One of the first steps to getting through your disappointment and grief is to share the burden with another. I would like to encourage you to check in with each other. Check in with Pastor Leanne or me. And above all, check in with God. Bring it all to God. Pray it out. Write it out. Spend time in devotion and scripture reading. Seek the support of the Comforter who is the Holy Spirit who hears us in our weakness and intercedes for us to God.

Finally, as children of God who follow a Savior who conquered very powers of sin and death, know that we are all in the secure hands of God. That God has got this in the end. That God has the last word, and that word is a benediction of mercy and love.

Virtual Communion first Sunday of the month

Christ is made present to us in the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not confined to a particular building, place, or time. Because we believe that sharing Communion is an act of faith, and because we need the nourishment that comes from sharing Christ's feast, we will be celebrating Communion *virtually* for the month of May. What does that mean?

- Pastor Scott and Pastor Leanne will lead us through the traditional and familiar words and actions of communion. They will break bread, pour the cup, and speak the words of institution, inviting Christ to be present with us wherever we are.
- You will supply your own bread and cup. There are no strict rules about this. The bread represents the common food of common people. It can be any variety of bread, crackers, rice cakes, or tortillas whatever you have available to you. The cup, likewise, was the common beverage of the day. Traditionally, that would have been wine. In our worship service we use grape juice. You may use either of these, or whatever juice or beverage you have available. Remember, the bread and cup are symbols, the presence of Christ is made real in them by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Please let us know that you shared in this wider offering of God's gracious feast by commenting on the Facebook worship video feed or sending a message (text or email) to the pastors.

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

Friends, you are awesome! Though we have had virtual worship for all of April, and no opportunity for on site worship, including giving opportunities, we have stayed very near the same totals for our operating fund as last month. Note the numbers on the sidebar. Certainly, giving is down some, and some expenses are down. But, much of our budget is fixed costs and continues whether we are having our normal activities or not.

We paid the per capital balance to Presbytery April 30. We remind you that though the obligation is paid, if you have not yet paid your per capita, please pay any or all of it whenever you can. Per capital is \$42 per confirmed member for 2020. Our total obligation is \$9,783 this year.

Extra giving to date is \$433. Operating expenses go on, whether the doors are open or not, with some not as high and others higher. And we know the same is true for each of you. Some people will have to set aside their commitment and pledge until things return to normal. Please consider an extra gift if your can.

ONLINE GIVING IS HERE! It has been in place for a couple of weeks, with access through the weekly email and on the website. The weekly email gives a detailed explanation and a video. It is totally user

friendly and we are delighted to tell you that we have already seen members using it, besides staff, who put it to the test. Try it, you will like it! It should be noted that your giving will be documented by the Presbyterian Foundation, NOT on your church contribution statement. We do receive regular reports and will receive a deposit at the end of each month, with a directive of which funds should be credited. You may make your gift with check, debit or credit card. And, you may make your gift to any of the usual church funds they are listed on the site for your selection.

Online giving will be one more choice in addition to regular giving by check and cash. You will still be able to make gifts in other ways. We provide for automatic bank transfers monthly. People who reach the age of required distributions from IRA accounts may direct that distribution to the church (or other non-profit) and may realize some tax benefit as well. Gifts of appreciated stock or other assets may be given. At any time if any alternative giving interests you, talk to Deb or Bea with any questions.

Again, you may continue your current means of giving, or you may change to the online giving, or any combination. We will continue to use the monthly direct banking, but if you are using that and would prefer to use online giving, let Deb know.

150th Anniversary

2020 marks the 150th anniversary year for First Presbyterian Church, Willmar, MN. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Anniversary Celebration will be postponed to 2021. Our year of celebration will kickoff with the Advent Festival on December 6, 2020. Watch this space for coming events, important updates, and anecdotes from our history.

A LOOK BACK IN HISTORY

If you've worshipped in our sanctuary and marveled at our beautiful pipe organ with its vast array of pipes, you may be interested in its history:

Excerpt taken from THE VOICE, July 10, 1975

"An Organ Committee appointed by the Session has been studying for some months the problems with our present Baldwin organ, installed in 1952. On a number of occasions during the past several years, organ malfunctions have created a problem during worship services, funerals and weddings. An outside technician appraised the organ's condition and suggested that at least \$4,000 would need to be invested in rebuilding the organ to its 1952 condition without touching the brittle wiring. But the organ at best would still be of 1952 vintage without the many new technical advances of electronics and sound engineering of present day electronic organs. He could promise only 10 years of additional service. In light of this, the Organ Committee recommended to the Session last winter that the purchase of a new organ be explored. The results of that exploration are now complete, and the Session and Trustees at a joint meeting this week have recommended to the Congregation the purchase of a new Hendrickson 8 rank pipe organ at the cost of \$25,000. (Already \$11,500 of this is presently in the organ fund)."

Notes from the Organ Committee

After visiting with several electronic organ companies, the committee members were more and more confused by the variety of options. They finally decided to hire an organ consultant, Mr. Robert Kendall, who assessed the acoustics of the sanctuary and the needs of the church's musical program and convinced the committee to look into the selection of a pipe organ that could be built to those specifications. After traveling to St. Paul to listen to several different pipe organs, "....the fog lifted! It became clear that we were hearing a far superior sound and that a pipe organ would be the best and wisest choice to meet the needs of our church...Mr. Kendall also made us aware that pipe organs appreciate in value through the years as opposed to an electronic organ that rapidly depreciates."

A New Organ

A Congregational Meeting was held on July 20, 1975, and the recommendation to purchase the pipe organ was approved. A Dedicatory Organ recital was held on May 21, 1978, with Esther Lygre as the recitalist. Mrs. Lygre was a former Willmar resident and had served as organist at the Presbyterian and Calvary Lutheran churches in 1974.

The organ builder, Charles Hendrickson, was a native of Willmar and a graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College and the University of Arkansas. During 1964 and 1970 he studied European organ building and completed a survey of historic and contemporary instruments. The Hendrickson Organ Company was founded in 1964 in St. Peter, MN.

The organ contains 8 ranks of pipes and is all self-contained in the oak casework mounted on the front wall of the church. 531 speaking pipes are made from alloys of tin and lead, similar to pewter, wood and zinc. 395 pipes are installed within a swell box located behind the shiny exposed pipes of the principal chorus. A set of 21 chimes is installed behind the grill along the east wall of the church. The entire organ is supported by massive steel supports which cantilever the pipes and chests out from the wall. A small blower and rectifier are installed in the organ to supply the air and DC current for operating the organ.

The Prayer of Dedication

O God, Our Heavenly Father, who has given us the gift of music, to express our deepest expressions of faith, grant that this organ may bring a blessing to all who worship here. May the notes of cheer, comfort, communion, and courage inspire us for our daily tasks. Bless all organists who shall play it, and all worshippers who shall be inspired by its varied voices, to the praise and glory of Your name. Amen.
