PASTORS NOTE

Dear Friends,

Life is beginning to return to something resembling *normal* for the first time in more than a year. As more people are vaccinated it becomes safer for us to gather. As it becomes safer for us to gather, restrictions are being loosened. It is a good feeling to be able to be together in worship, to gather with friends, to share a meal, to celebrate milestones like birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, and graduation. And funerals.

As I reflect on what we have lost during the pandemic, this is one of the most significant: in a season when we have been experiencing the collective grief resulting from the pandemic, we have endured the specific loss of being unable to mourn our loved ones in community. For many, memorial services were delayed. For others, services were held with only immediate family in attendance. What was missing, in both cases, was the loving support of the caring community gathered around the grieving family. We need that sense of community. It is how we heal and move forward.

This is the gift we, the church, offer families: the hospitality of a place to gather; the comfort of shared memories and conversation; the loving service of providing coffee, dessert, and a shared meal. This is the loving care we can offer to those who are grieving, and for too long, we have been unable to love our neighbors in this way. And in its absence, we have recognized just how important it is.

Families are beginning to gather again to mourn their loved ones. As restrictions loosen, we are now able to gather with them for visitation and memorial services. Soon we will be able to offer them the healing hospitality of funeral receptions. In order to do that, we need your help. Would you consider offering your heart and hands to this service of hospitality? The more hands we have to serve, the less of a burden it will be to any one person or small group of people. Please consider volunteering to serve on a funeral team. This is an offering of love that anyone can provide!

If you are willing to help organize (making phone calls ahead of time to request baked goods or recruit servers), be present to serve (set up, serve or clean up) or provide baked goods for the reception, please contact Bonnie Kluver who is building a list of volunteers - send her a message on Facebook or email her at <u>blkluver@tds.net</u>. If you aren't sure where you would be able to serve, talk to Bonnie and she will help you find the best place to use your gifts.

This pandemic has robbed us of too many opportunities to be together and care for one another. As we return to *normal* let us reclaim and commit to this important way of showing hospitality and love to one another.

TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

April was an active month for First Presbyterian Church, with in person services, Celebrations of Life, and limited activities beginning again. We continue to reach out with Facebook streaming of worship and services, but are happy to see people returning to worship together, as they feel comfortable. Covid protocols remain in place and care is given for the safety of all. Some meetings continue on Zoom, others have been in person—even at least a couple meeting out 0n the lawn and in the parking lot! We are a creative people, seeking ways to serve safely and with joy in one another's company.

The Per Capita for 2021 is \$43 per confirmed member. Our total obligation toward the operation of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly is \$10,148. We paid the balance of our per capita to the Presbytery in April, and our budget numbers took a bit of a hit—but you have done a great job in paying your share. Every bit helps keep our numbers manageable. If you have questions beyond what we cover here, the pastors, the treasurer and the financial secretary welcome your questions. Each month in this space we are giving you an overview of some of the things our Presbytery and the Synod do for the member churches. The Presbytery is a resource for understanding and functioning as a presbyterian church, seeking to guide churches needing leadership, providing a resource for some of the fiscal and management questions that occur and providing educational and workshop opportunities. The Presbytery prints a weekly newsletter, The Valley Bridge that makes note of many of the

opportunities. Each summer the Synod sponsors a retreat with opportunities for a wide variety of workshops and fellowship time. Those who have attended look forward to this popular retreat time.

Extra giving to date is \$428. Extra giving helps to reduce the end of year deficit so that we can minimize our end of year appeal for help in balancing the budget. Some of our smaller sources of income are not happening, like coffee money from the fellowship time.
