Colossians 3: 17

"Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father."

I don't know about you, but I have a lot to be thankful for. I can be grateful for my family, my work, my friends, my wonderful church family at FPC, and all the creature comforts of life. Indeed, I can sit here as I type and ponder some of those many blessings and I can conjure up a feeling of warmth and gratitude in my spirit as I do so. But what if we made thanksgiving a daily practice? And I don't mean by just harboring a warm fuzzy feeling in our hearts. I mean by actually making an expression of gratitude for somebody or something in a tangible way, each day. Perhaps by writing a note, dropping a line to someone, thanking a store clerk, writing a kind word on social media, or giving a kind word to a loved one. And when you do so, do so in a spirit of Christian charity.

I wonder how our spirits would flourish? I wonder how those around us would respond? Maybe it's an experiment worth trying out for the next few weeks, and seeing if it's worth continuing?

Let me close by giving you this word from Psalm 139: 14, that you are a fearfully and wonderfully made child of God. I am grateful for you and your presence in our church family. I pray that your time spent practicing gratitude in the coming weeks will be a blessing to you and to those you love.

MISSION OF THE MONTH

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is our November Mission of the Month. 2021 has seen numerous natural disasters in the U.S.A. and throughout the world. As the emergency and refugee program of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A.



OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) focuses on the long term recovery of disaster impacted communities. It provides training and disaster preparedness for presbyteries and synods and works collaboratively with church partners and members of the ACT Alliance (Action by Churches Together) internationally, and nationally with other faith based responders.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is currently responding to needs in:

- Areas impacted by Hurricane Ida: Initial response grants have been disbursed and PDA has deployed National Response Team members to work alongside Presbyterian leadership as they make assessments and determine their needs.
- North Carolina: Tropical Depression Fred resulted in floods and flash flooding in North Carolina. At least five fatalities have been confirmed. PDA will provide

grant(s) to meet emergency needs and into the long-term recovery phase.

- **Tennessee:** Heavy rain caused catastrophic flooding and flash flooding across Tennessee beginning August 21. At least 17 fatalities have been confirmed. PDA is responding to this disaster and is processing an initial assistance grant to meet emergency needs. PDA will continue support through the long-term recovery phase.
- Ethiopia: PDA is supporting projects to address emergency and life-sustaining needs such as shelter, WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene), community engagement, livelihoods, food security and more.
- Haiti: For decades, PDA has had partnerships in Haiti to enable it to come alongside communities
 affected by disaster in the immediate aftermath, as well as support communities planning multiyear, long-term recovery projects. Most recently, PDA is responding to the devastating 7.2 magnitude
 earthquake that struck Haiti the morning of August 14, 2021 that has resulted in the loss of more
 than 1,200 lives. PDA is providing emergency needs such as WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene),
 emergency power generators, shelter, food, first aid and more.

Donations may be made at the church, mailed or be made through the church's on-line giving portal. Please give generously to support Presbyterian Disaster Assistance in their efforts to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic event.

Mission Committee Missionary Sponsor

The Mission Committee voted to sponsor a missionary. Committee members researched numerous missionaries and chose to sponsor Mark and Miriam Adams in their involvement in the mission called Frontera de Cristo. Based in the sister cities of Douglas, Arizona, and Agua Prieta, Sonora, Frontera de Cristo works to build relationships and understanding across borders. People often see borders as nothing more than division, but at Frontera de Cristo, borders are seen as a place of encounter. Discerning God's will, Frontera de Cristo serves migrants and community members on both sides of the border.



By demonstrating gospel values in all that they do, Frontera de Cristo seeks to build relationships that demonstrate God's will, and build bridges rather than walls. So many people are migrating, seeking refuge and fleeing extreme poverty and violence. Our Frontera de Cristo's goal is not only to address their immediate needs, but also to address the root causes of mass migration, creating safe and prosperous opportunities that allow our sisters and brothers to stay in the land they call home, if they so choose.

Through the building of community-driven partnerships with ministries and secular organizations in DouglaPrieta, Frontera de Cristo offers shelter, resources, education, emotional support, medical care, and new solutions. The hope is that everyone they meet knows they are made in God's image, they are worthy of respect, and they are welcome here.

Frontera de Cristo also partners in ministry with Café Justo. Café Justo and its sister organization, Café Justo y Mas, operate on a fair trade plus business model. By removing the middleman who purchases coffee from Mexican farmers and sells it to large American corporations, our fair trade plus system creates an opportunity for farmers to be in control of the process from start to finish. From harvesting, to roasting, to packaging, all the way to your doorstep, the cooperative's partners are involved. This optimizes the farmers' profits in a way that creates a just and livable income, eliminates their need to head north seeking work, and allows them to stay on their land with their families. Frontera de Cristo has been proud to serve as a partner with Café Justo since its establishment in 2003 and with Café Justo y Mas since its opening in 2016, watching one man's dream become a reality that provides new life for many through both.

The mission committee was able to meet Mark Adams via zoom at our September mission committee meeting. In the coming weeks and months, we will be telling you more about Mark and Miriam Adams and the mission of Frontera de Cristo and its ministry partners. TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

We continue to adjust to the new normal, as in person worship and on-line services go forward. It is good to be together to worship and fellowship coffee is a welcome return to opportunities to visit and catch up with our church family. The long awaited celebration of our 150th anniversary is taking place in October and we are welcoming former pastors and members from a distance as we worship and have dinner together.

September saw an improvement in our financial picture, though we are still running behind. Check out the side-bar numbers. As you read this, the end of the year is getting very close and we will need help in turning the deficit around, aiming to break even. In September we focused on stewardship of our gifts and talents and asked members to complete pledge cards. If you have not yet turned in a pledge card, it is not too late. The financial secretary and treasurer are working on the 2022 budget and will be sending it to Session in November. Your indication of plans of giving help with the planning.

The Per Capita for 2021 is \$43 per confirmed member. Our total obligation of \$10,148 toward the operation of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly has been paid. We continue to encourage confirmed members who have not yet paid their per capita to do so when able.

Extra giving to date is \$761. Extra giving helps to reduce the end of year deficit so that we can minimize our end of year appeal for help in balancing the budget. We have been blessed in recent years with close to break even and minimal appeal for additional giving. Let's keep it going!

We hope we will be seeing you back at worship and other activities, soon. ABOVE ALL, STAY SAFE AND HEALTHY.







"I'm Earl Knutson, a member at First Pres Willmar. My passion is a healthy climate for my grandkids and great- grands, and by the way for your grands and great grands, and by the way for all grands and great-grands.

I'm a member of a group called Presbyterians for Carbon Dividends, which is a small branch of Presbyterians for Earth Care. We are about 80 strong from all over the US. Our core group, about 8, meets twice a month via zoom.

Our group is firm in the belief that we badly need a tax on carbon to slow global warming which causes harmful climate change.

We have a few projects to encourage and enable all Presbyterians to lobby Congress to include a carbon tax in forthcoming climate legislation. Some months ago I wrote to all 52 presbytery churches offering some of our products. The Valley Bridge has carried three of our offerings. I hope that many Presbyterians will join in. Some here already have."
