## **PASTORS NOTE**

July 21, 2020

Church Family,

You may have noticed a whole slew of businesses who have mandated the wearing of masks while inside their stores in recent weeks with Wal-Mart being the most prominent of the recent announcements. I wanted to let you know that I wear a mask whenever I'm in a public place of business like a supermarket, all while working to maintain social distance. I believe that my Christian faith is a basis for making this decision. Here's why:

**We are Called to Love Sacrificially**: Jesus said in John 15: 13, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." If that is the sort of love we're called to, I can certainly inconvenience myself for 20 minutes while inside a store for the sake of my neighbor. It is a small sacrifice to make. Speaking of which...

It is the Neighborly Thing to Do: Jesus taught us to, "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22: 39). Anyone who has been at a four-way stop intersection in a small Minnesota town knows that we Minnesotans get this concept. We know what it takes to be neighborly. For the sake of the health and well-being of my neighbors and my community, I'm willing to work together with them to keep us all safe. Which leads me to my next point...

We are Called to Look out for the Least of These: I don't know who is vulnerable to this virus. I don't know who has diabetes, or is battling cancer, or who has a heart condition, or high blood pressure. Just by looking at them, you may never know. And yet I know that I walk past many of these people every day in the supermarket or hardware store while sharing public space with them. Jesus taught, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Matthew 25: 40). If my wearing a mask can help to protect a vulnerable community member from unwitting transmission, sign me up.

**We Value Those Who Serve:** Jesus taught this unequivocally, "The greatest among you will be your servant. All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted" (Matthew 23: 11). So, when I think about employees who are called to work 8-12 hour shifts in our local businesses, who may have a health condition which makes them vulnerable, who have to then go home to places where they may have infants, or other family with health conditions, I then recognize that they are doing a great service to their community. I will do what I can to keep them healthy and well so that they do not bring an illness home to their loved ones. If my wearing a mask will help keep them safe, I will do it.

**Presbyterians Are not Suspicious of Sound Medicine and Science:** Presbyterians have helped launch rockets and walked on the moon. Presbyterians have helped create vaccines, performed lifesaving surgeries, and helped explore the mysteries of the universe. A host of Presbyterians are scientists, doctors, and engineers. Our faith is not threatened by the unfolding of facts about the natural world. We believe that when, "God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them" (Genesis 1: 27), God endowed us with intellect and creative imagination to approach the unfolding of

science and medicine as the very unfolding of the mysteries of God's creation. The consensus of doctors across the world is that social distancing, hand washing, and mask wearing are the few simple things that we can do to help stop this pandemic. If you have questions about wearing masks, I ask you, have you talked to your primary care physician about the issue? What does he/she say about the topic? And speaking of physicians, I wonder where the Great Physician is in the midst of this?

What Would Jesus Do (WWJD)? If I were to do a thought experiment about how Jesus would conduct himself with the mask issue, while looking at the topics outlined above, I truly believe that Jesus would don a mask. Not necessarily because he feared getting sick, but because he would want to set a proper example for us to follow. Because...

**It is the Loving Thing to Do:** John wrote, "<sup>18</sup>There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear" (1 John 4: 18). Do not confuse the Christian motivation for wearing a mask as being done in fear – for all the reasons outlined above - it is clearly being done in love.

At the end of the day, these are just one Christian's ruminations on why I believe it is the Christian thing to wear a mask in public places. I hope these points are useful to you in thinking about this issue for yourself and your family. Above all, I pray for your health and well being. May God guard you in heart, mind, spirit, and body and keep you safe.

## COVID-19 Update:

# We are Resuming Face to Face Worship: **August 16, 2020**

First Presbyterian Church will be resuming face to face worship on August 16, 2020. Your safety is our priority! So, if you do not feel like you are ready to return, please do not feel obligated to do so. We will continue to broadcast worship on Facebook Live and send out manuscripts for those who would like to receive them by mail. Please know that we will be taking extra precautions with cleaning and social distancing, and attendance is limited to 50% capacity. You will be required to wear a mask in the church building; if you do not have a mask, one will be provided to you. We appreciate your willingness to take these extra steps to make it possible for us to safely be together again.

#### Congregants can help maintain the safety of First Presbyterian Church by:

- Staying home if you or a household member have symptoms of COVID-19. Symptoms can include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, headache, muscle pain, sore throat, or loss of taste or smell. Other less common symptoms include gastrointestinal symptoms like nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea.
- Staying home if they are in a high-risk category for COVID-19.
- Completing the Guest Health Screening Form upon arrival at First Presbyterian Church.
- Regularly washing and/or sanitizing hands.
- Wearing face masks in public spaces and with non-household groups.
- · Refraining from singing.
- Maintaining a distance of at least 6 feet from people not in the same household at all times.
- Reducing group size to state or CDC guidelines (currently 50% of total occupancy).

#### **Virtual Communion**

first Sunday of the month

Christ is made present to us in the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not confined to a particular building, place, or time. Because we believe that sharing Communion is an act of faith, and because we need the nourishment that comes from sharing Christ's feast, we will be celebrating Communion *virtually* for the month of May. What does that mean?

- Pastor Scott and Pastor Leanne will lead us through the traditional and familiar words and actions of communion. They will break bread, pour the cup, and speak the words of institution, inviting Christ to be present with us wherever we are.
- You will supply your own bread and cup. There are no strict rules about this. The bread represents the common food of common people. It can be any variety of bread, crackers, rice cakes, or tortillas whatever you have available to you. The cup, likewise, was the common beverage of the day. Traditionally, that would have been wine. In our worship service we use grape juice. You may use either of these, or whatever juice or beverage you have available. Remember, the bread and cup are symbols, the presence of Christ is made real in them by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Please let us know that you shared in this wider offering of God's gracious feast by commenting on the Facebook worship video feed or sending a message (text or email) to the pastors.

#### **United Campus Ministry at Ridgewater College**

To the wonderful people at First Presbyterian Church,

Thank you for your years of faithful support. This is my eighth year at the Center as chaplain for United Campus Ministry and I want to share a few highlights, as well as some updates.

Welcome Day is my opportunity to get on campus and meet as many students as possible during the first week on campus. We handed out 125 gift bags containing bibles, toilet paper, trash bags, schedules, and contact information. It is always our major springboard into the year.

We also were on campus for a fall festival, which happened to be during the week of Halloween. Rather than dress up in costume, we decided to have a light themed table and allowed all students to fill out thank you notes to professors, friends, and family. We gave out a lot of them that day, which was exciting.

Our major service continued to be our meal ministry. Some weeks we would see 225-250 students twice a week, other weeks it would be 125-150 students twice a week. It all depended on field trips and events on campus. Regardless, it remained our best way to serve the students and create community. It also shows students that the local faith community is invested in them. First Presbyterian has been great at helping us serve in this capacity.

Those bigger numbers had us talking about building an expansion, going so far as contacting a few companies for estimates and really begin dreaming.....and then COVID-19 started happening. We are not sure where that puts us for that, but let's talk about what that means for how we serve.

Ridgewater will be at a smaller physical attendance for the following semester, and the Lutheran Campus Chaplain and I will be meeting and discussing how to best serve a smaller population, while still trying to connect with students who are taking classes online. Ridgewater has been a great partner to work with in this area, and have allowed us to serve and help them in ways that are really making an impact for future students here.

Our biggest need remains prayer and continued support. Having churches support what we're doing out here helps put wind in our sails to keep doing it during times like this when everything seems uncertain and our plans keep changing. Our other big need is a board member. We are still needing people to help oversee the ministry, hold me accountable, and dream for our future. If you are interested, let me know!

Thank you again for the support, I wish I could include more stories. There were students we helped with pregnancy, parenthood, benevolence, abusive situations, mental health support, and so many more areas....and it all starts with the connections we make through the meals that are supported by churches like yours.

# TREASURER/BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

Even though this is anything but a normal summer, we are seeing a normal pattern in our General Fund and budget, with an increase in the deficit. However, it is not a serious shortfall, and we continue to see donations coming in the mail, on line and we want to know we appreciate your efforts. Even though we are operating in a new way, the expenses do not change much. We are happy that we are keeping up with bill payments as they come due.

Per capita payments continue to come in. If you have made your payment, thank you! If you have not yet paid your per capita, please pay any or all of it whenever you can. Per capita is \$42 per confirmed member for 2020. Our total obligation is \$9,783 this year.

Extra giving to date is \$733. Extra giving helps to reduce the end of year deficit so that we can minimize our end of year appeal for help in balancing the budget. Some of our smaller sources of income are not happening when we are not worshiping together—there is no loose offering. There is no fellowship coffee. The extra giving continues to help toward reducing any end of year appeal.

ONLINE GIVING IS WORKING! We see giving to many different funds with new people trying it. Deb has had to learn some new techniques in including the figures in the church records. The transfer from the Foundation to our bank account is an automatic process at the end of the month.

We have paid the Presbytery loan for the renovations of Westminster Hall for Family Promise Day Center, and we have repaid the internal loan for our heating renovation. We are debt free!

ABOVE ALL, STAY SAFE AND HEALTHY. We look forward to the day we can join together in worship and fellowship.
