Foxes On My Mind... And In My Life?

I recently experienced a unique series of events, with each incident involving a fox. When a pattern like this occurs, 100% of the time the Lord uses the repeated theme to speak something profound through His Word.

This time was no exception.

Here is how things happened:

+ Recently, while having lunch with other moms and **children**, a fox meandered **near** our group. It was **mangy**, scrawny, and **uncomfortably close** to us. Even worse, the animal was itching like crazy. We **cautioned** the **kids** not to play near the area where he had paused to itch, **suspecting** it had **fleas**. Within minutes it was gone, and lunchtime returned to normal.

- + A few days later, I overheard an audio book my **son** was playing. Half-way through the episode, a character in the story referred to "**the burrow of the fox.**"
- + Soon thereafter, during a public speaking class, a **student** presented some **jokes**, including one about...a fox.
- + Days later, **Zachariah** wanted some **special** Mom-Son **time**, asking to watch a show we'd recorded. Unbeknownst to us, the episode was about Noah's Ark--and it featured two foxes.

This kept going...

- + When I reconnected with a **child** I hadn't seen for a while, he excitedly shared how his family had **taken time away**, traveling out of state...and had spotted a fox **near their cabin**.
- + I got **lost** driving **Zach** to basketball practice and pulled up the GPS to **get back on track.** The GPS led me to an **unfamiliar road**: Fox Drive.
- + Finally, to complete the circle, I saw the **exact same** fox **again** in the first place I'd seen it while with friends and their **children**.

Do you think the Lord had my **attention**? *Yes indeed*.

As I have learned to do, I **went to His Word** and looked up all Scriptures with the word 'fox.' After a few weeks of prayerful study, one of the verses the Holy Spirit consistently echoed was Song of Solomon 2:15:

"Catch us the foxes, the little foxes that spoil the vines, for our vines have tender grapes."

The context of this verse is a passionate dialogue and **intimate** interaction between a bride and her groom. They are in the midst of "their garden", and the groom has just finished telling his bride that he longs to have her **come away** with him for a much longed-for **time together**.

Then comes the **warning** to "catch the foxes that spoil the vines." *What does that mean?*

Here are the Hebrew root-word meanings for the words in this verse:

Catch: to grasp, seize, take hold of, take possession

Fox: a burrower, jackal

Little: young, small, insignificant, unimportant

Spoil: to tighten a cord, bind, twist; to pervert, destroy; corrupt, spoil

Vines: garden, vineyard

Tender grapes: (from one root word, meaning) blossom, abloom

Do you see the word of **caution**? Do you **hear** the **warning**? Please pay **attention**.

What foxes are spoiling or threatening to corrupt your life in Christ? What tricky tactics of the devil, like habits, temptations, thoughts, or attitudes, are "tightening a cord" around your intimacy with Jesus?

Even the seemingly small, insignificant, unimportant 'foxes' can tighten a cord around, bind, twist, pervert, destroy, corrupt, and spoil the fruitful blossoms in your garden.

If you **suspect** any fox-- big or little-- **catch it! Seize it!**Take hold of it before it takes hold of you.

How do we do this?

Run to God's Word! Make special time to be aware of Jesus. Come away with Him for intimate time together.

Ask the Holy Spirit to expose any foxes **burrowing** into your life. We don't pet them-- we remove them.

Set a trap for those foxes, so they don't **spoil** your vines.

One More Observation

Intriguingly, every incident I experienced with foxes involved a **child**.

There is much to ponder on that, but to stay consistent within the scope of this writing, I believe the Lord would want us to **take caution** regarding the devil's prowling around **the children in our lives.**

The devil sends foxes into the midst of **children's gatherings**, and he is crafty. His goal is to lead them astray, and I do not think we're to take that lightly. A **burrower** digs deep around the roots, **breaking up foundations.** Please stay alert, and never be shamed for choosing **caution** in your parenting, grand-parenting or guardianship.

If God has given us responsibility over a **child or children**, then included in that responsibility is to defend and protect them from the foxes.
