

A Holy Paradigm Shift

And He (God) said,

"My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest."

Then he (Moses) said to Him,

"If Your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here."

Exodus 33:14-16 (NKJV)



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Have you ever had a holy **paradigm shift**?
Check out what God did while I **traveled** this summer:

On the second day of our summer travels, I found myself longing so terribly for some thing, that it seemed impossible to change my attitude. The pain of desiring that thing was very deep. So deep that I didn't want to feel it.

I asked the Lord to search my heart.
Was I sinning through discontentment or covetousness?
If so, it was separating me from peace.

After a time of prayer and confession, I was still in a place of **unrest**.

There seemed to be a deeper **stirring** within my spirit by the Holy Spirit.

Not only did He **want** repentance from sin,

but He also desired to shift an old paradigm.

On Saturday evening, I fell asleep desperately begging God to deliver me from my emotional mess. It was starting to **ruin my travels**. You see, the object of my **Yearning** was a good and godly thing. The idea of attaining it provoked great **joy** and **rest** within me, producing a **refreshing** "place of the soul" that I wanted to **keep forever**. I recall saying to God, word for word,

"I wouldn't ever want to leave."

(Are you curious to know what I was **longing** for? Hang in there, and keep reading...)

On Saturday night, I pleaded to God for **relief**.
On Sunday morning at church, He came to my rescue... in typical,
awesome,
Holy-Spirit-style.

This is what He did:

During worship, we sang a song I hadn't heard before. In it was the phrase, word for word, "I want to stay here forever." The song was about wanting to stay in the Presence of the Lord forever.

No longer was I speaking that phrase about a physical **thing** for which I was **aching**. I was now singing, **"I want to stay here forever"** to the Lord, about a spiritual place—

His Presence.

What a paradigm shift.

Another night later, I attended a **worship** and **healing** service at a different church. It was one of those amazing nights with Jesus: He spoke so many things personally, straight to my spirit, that I wrote 7 pages of notes in my journal. And that wasn't all. The Holy Spirit put a seal and a stamp on the **paradigm shift** from the day prior:

Early in the service as I stood worshiping,
The Holy Spirit told me to take off my sandals.

I don't make that my habit at church, but I knew it was the Lord,
so I slipped off my shoes.

Moments later, a person on the worship team paused and said,
"Maybe it's time to take off your shoes.
God wants to do a paradigm shift.

Sometimes He won't move us until we take off our shoes."

The Lord was confirming His good work!

A bit later, the worship leader said the Lord had given him a new song that afternoon. He then played it for the first time. Guess what phrase was in that song? "I don't ever want to leave." The lyrics were about not wanting to leave... *God's Presence*.

In that moment, barefoot and undone, I was radically freed!
Suddenly that thing I'd been Vearning for didn't matter.

My **eagerness** for **that thing** faded so much in light of *the Presence of the Lord*, that it completely disappeared. In its place, God ushered in a greater, stronger **Zeal** to **iust be with Jesus.**

Here is the moral of this true story:

Whether you're where you want to be or not, worship Jesus.
Whether you like your job or not, worship Jesus.
Whether or not you enjoy the person you're with, worship Jesus.
Whether things turned out the way you wanted or not, worship Jesus.

Worship Him as you prepare a meal, worship Him as you clean up. Worship Him in the shower, and worship Him in the car. Worship Him when you're talking with someone you love, and worship Him when you're with someone who irritates you. Seriously. The environment doesn't matter!

Worship Jesus, and you'll actively stay in His Presence, aware of Him in every moment.

Choose to IOVE Him, need Him, and IONG for Him so much that you truly "don't ever want to leave."

CHALLENGE:

Do you want to know what **that thing** was, that I had **desired**? I'm not going to tell you.

Why? Because that thing doesn't matter.

Instead, I'll leave *you* with a question:

What is "that thing" in your life?
What are you needing so badly,
that its absence in your life is "ruining your travels"?

Confess discontentment and covetousness, then let that thing go. It doesn't matter.

In Exodus 3, God instructs Moses to **remove his sandals**. He then proceeds to reveal Himself to Moses as **I AM**.

"Take your sandals off your feet,

for the place where you stand is holy ground." Exodus 3:5b

God is all you need Him to be. *He is I AM*. He is your everything.

Kick off your shoes,

and let the Lord produce within you a **paradigm shift:**Long for His Presence alone.

He took my soul to *that* place, and *that's* where I'm **staying**. **Forever**.

I don't ever want to leave.
