Yes, I actually delighted in not knowing the surprise.


I was free!

CHALLENGE:

Look up to Him, raise your hands in absolute abandon and worship, then fall into the Presence of His Holy Spirit, trusting Him to uphold you.

At first it may seem like falling into nothingness, but

God's faithfulness is bigger.

"Have you not known? Have you not heard?

The everlasting God, the LORD,

The Creator of the ends of the earth,

Neither faints nor is weary.

His understanding is unsearchable.

He gives power to the weak,
